HIGH ALERT: SCAM WARNING!!!

TO ALL SUPPLIERS AND SERVICE PROVIDERS OF THE GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS

It has come to the attention of the *GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS* that there are certain unscrupulous companies and individuals who are defrauding unsuspecting businesses disguised as representatives of the *Government Printing Works (GPW)*.

The scam involves the fraudsters using the letterhead of *GPW* to send out fake tender bids to companies and requests to supply equipment and goods.

Although the contact person's name on the letter may be of an existing official, the contact details on the letter are not the same as the *Government Printing Works*. When searching on the Internet for the address of the company that has sent the fake tender document, the address does not exist.

The banking details are in a private name and not company name. Government will never ask you to deposit any funds for any business transaction. *GPW* has alerted the relevant law enforcement authorities to investigate this scam to protect legitimate businesses as well as the name of the organisation.

Example of e-mails these fraudsters are using:

PROCUREMENT@GPW-GOV.ORG

Should you suspect that you are a victim of a scam, you must urgently contact the police and inform the *GPW*.

GPW has an official email with the domain as @gpw.gov.za

Government e-mails DO NOT have org in their e-mail addresses. All of these fraudsters also use the same or very similar telephone numbers. Although such number with an area code 012 looks like a landline, it is not fixed to any property.

GPW will never send you an e-mail asking you to supply equipment and goods without a purchase/order number. *GPW* does not procure goods for another level of Government. The organisation will not be liable for actions that result in companies or individuals being resultant victims of such a scam.

Government Printing Works gives businesses the opportunity to supply goods and services through RFQ / Tendering process. In order to be eligible to bid to provide goods and services, suppliers must be registered on the National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD). To be registered, they must meet all current legislative requirements (e.g. have a valid tax clearance certificate and be in good standing with the South African Revenue Services - SARS).

The tender process is managed through the Supply Chain Management (SCM) system of the department. SCM is highly regulated to minimise the risk of fraud, and to meet objectives which include value for money, open and effective competition, equitability, accountability, fair dealing, transparency and an ethical approach. Relevant legislation, regulations, policies, guidelines and instructions can be found on the tender's website.

Fake Tenders

National Treasury's CSD has launched the Government Order Scam campaign to combat fraudulent requests for quotes (RFQs). Such fraudulent requests have resulted in innocent companies losing money. We work hard at preventing and fighting fraud, but criminal activity is always a risk.

How tender scams work

There are many types of tender scams. Here are some of the more frequent scenarios:

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to a company to invite it to urgently supply goods. Shortly after the company has submitted its quote, it receives notification that it has won the tender. The company delivers the goods to someone who poses as an official or at a fake site. The Department has no idea of this transaction made in its name. The company is then never paid and suffers a loss.

OR

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to Company A to invite it to urgently supply goods. Typically, the tender specification is so unique that only Company B (a fictitious company created by the fraudster) can supply the goods in question.

Shortly after Company A has submitted its quote it receives notification that it has won the tender. Company A orders the goods and pays a deposit to the fictitious Company B. Once Company B receives the money, it disappears. Company A's money is stolen in the process.

Protect yourself from being scammed

- If you are registered on the supplier databases and you receive a request to tender or quote that seems to be from a government department, contact the department to confirm that the request is legitimate. Do not use the contact details on the tender document as these might be fraudulent.
- Compare tender details with those that appear in the Tender Bulletin, available online at www.gpwonline.co.za
- Make sure you familiarise yourself with how government procures goods and services. Visit the tender website for more information on how to tender.
- If you are uncomfortable about the request received, consider visiting the government department and/or the place of delivery and/or the service provider from whom you will be sourcing the goods.
- In the unlikely event that you are asked for a deposit to make a bid, contact the SCM unit of the department in question to ask whether this is in fact correct.

4. Download the latest *Adobe* form, for the relevant notice to be placed, from the **Government Printing Works** website www.gpwonline.co.za.
5. The *Adobe* form needs to be completed electronically using *Adobe Acrobat / Acrobat Reader*. Only electronically completed *Adobe* forms will be accepted. No printed, handwritten and/or scanned *Adobe* forms will be accepted.
6. The completed electronic *Adobe* form has to be submitted via email to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za. The form needs to be submitted in its original electronic *Adobe* format to enable the system to extract the completed information from the form for placement in the publication.
7. Every notice submitted **must** be accompanied by an official **GPW** quotation. This must be obtained from the *eGazette* Contact Centre.

CANCELLATIONS

On 6 January 2020, the President of the Republic of South Africa proclaimed the commencement of section 8(4) of the Competition Amendment Act, no 18 of 2018 (the “Competition Act”). Pursuant to this proclamation, the Minister of Trade and Industry, in terms of section 78 of the Competition Act, published regulations on buyer power (“Buyer Power Regulations”) on 13 February 2020. In terms of section 8 of the Buyer Power Regulations, read with section 79 of the Competition Act, the Competition Commission (“Commission”) may prepare guidelines to indicate its policy approach on any matter falling within its jurisdiction in terms of the Competition Act.

The guidelines present the general principles that the Commission will follow in assessing whether the alleged conduct contravenes section 8(4) of the Competition Act. The guidelines provide guidance through outlining how the Commission intends to interpret the buyer power provisions for enforcement purposes, and further how it will seek to screen and assess complaints laid in terms of this provision.

2. This Radio Frequency Assignment Plan must be read with the Broadcast Digital Migration Policy published in Government Gazette Number 35014 (Notice 97 of 2012), Promotion-of-Diversity-and-Competition-on-Digital-Terrestrial-Television-Regulations published in Government Gazette number 37929 (Notice 682 of 2014), Terrestrial Broadcasting Frequency Plan 2013, published in Government Gazette number 36321 (Notice 298 of 2013), the Update to the Terrestrial Broadcasting Frequency Plan, published in Government Gazette Number 38005 (Notice 801 of 2014), National Radio Frequency Plan 2018 published in Government Gazette number 41650 (Notice 266 of 2018), National radio frequency plan 2018 published in Government Gazette Number 42337 (Notice 266 of 2018) and International Mobile Telecommunications (IMT) Roadmap 2019 published in Government Gazette Number 42829 (Notice 600 of 2019)

3. The goal of this Radio Frequency Assignment Plan is to implement regulation 9 of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Assignment Plan published in Government Gazette 38640 (Notices 271, 272, 273 and 274 of 2015).

Radio Frequency Spectrum Assignment Plan

Rules for Services operating in the Frequency Band
from 470 to 694 MHz

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1. Definitions

In this Radio Frequency Spectrum Assignment Plan, terms used shall have the same meaning as in the Electronic Communications Act 2005 (no. 36 of 2005); unless the context indicates otherwise;

2. Purpose

3.1 The purpose of this RFSAP is:

- 3.1.1 to provide a plan for the phased approach in implementing the analogue television switch-off onto Digital Terrestrial Television through a Single Frequency Network (SFN);
- 3.1.2 to implement the Transitional arrangements provisions set out in regulation 9 of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Assignment Plan published in Government Gazette 38640 (Notices 271, 272, 273 and 274 of 2015);
- 3.1.3 to provide information on the requirements attached to the use of a frequency band in line with the allocation and other information in the latest version of the National Radio Frequency Plan 2018 (“NRFP”);
- 3.1.4 to provide information on technical characteristics of radio systems, frequency channelling, coordination and details on required migration of existing users of the band and the expected method of assignment;
- 3.1.5 to provide the requirements necessary for the utilisation of the frequency band between 470 to 694 MHz for DTT in order to release frequencies in the band 694 to 860 MHz for IMT immediately after analogue television switch-off in the affected areas;
- 3.1.6 to ensure alignment of Annexure J of the Terrestrial Broadcasting Plan 2013, with the notified frequencies of the ITU-R Master International Frequency Register (MIFR). The aim being to emphasise the ITU’s recognition that stated that MT systems which are mobile systems that provide access to a wide range of telecommunication services including advanced mobile services, supported by mobile and fixed networks, which are increasingly packet-based;
- 3.1.7 to speed-up the process to release the frequency bands from 694 to 862 MHz for IMT; and
- 3.1.8 to enable the immediate availability of the band 470 to 694 MHz for Digital Terrestrial Television at the time of analogue Television switch-off.

3.2 The key features of this RFSAP for DTT are:

- 3.2.1 a high degree of commonality of functionality worldwide while retaining the flexibility to support a wide range of services and applications in a cost-efficient manner;
- 3.2.2 compatibility of services within IMT and with fixed broadcast networks;
- 3.2.3 capability of interworking with other radio access systems;
- 3.2.4 high quality DTT services;
- 3.2.5 user equipment suitable for worldwide use;
- 3.2.6 user-friendly applications, services and equipment; and
- 3.2.7 allow for the most efficient use of the spectrum using the DVB-T2 technology together with SFN networks.

3. General

- 4.1 South Africa adopted the DVB-T2 broadcast transmission standard for implementation. This said standard is a DVB European-based Consortium standard adopted by the ITU and its radio Regulations.
- 4.2 All installations to be used for purposes of transmission with the said standard must comply with safety rules as specified in applicable standards. A further requirement will be that any equipment that will be used for purposes of transmission with the said standard shall be required to obtain certification under South African laws and Regulations.
- 4.3 The assignment of the frequency band 470 to 694 MHz and the channel arrangement as outlined in Annexure J of the Terrestrial Broadcasting Frequency Plan, 2013 as updated in 2014, provides that the Terrestrial Broadcast Frequency Plan, 2013 does not allow for a direct migration from analogue to digital television but rather for a two-stage process which will first allow analogue television to be transmitted in parallel with DTT and thereafter there will be a restacking process of frequencies to release the digital dividend (694 to 862 MHz);
- 4.4 The said plan has however been overtaken by events since the deadline for analogue switch-off passed on 17 June 2015, and
- 4.5 furthermore, the analogue and digital assignments above 694 MHz are no longer protected and have been suppressed from the ITU-R MIFR.
- 4.6 In order to eliminate interference to existing analogue transmissions during the dual illumination period there must be frequency changes required to DTT frequencies within the band 470 to 694 MHz before analogue switch-off.
- 4.7 Analogue switch-off also applies to Analogue Terrestrial Broadcast Self-Help stations (“Self-Help stations”) which, in most cases, will have to migrate to Direct to Home (DTH) as there will not be DTT available in these areas including the provisions for Self-Help stations. Analogue switch-off for Self-Help stations shall be implemented in accordance with the provisions in section 2.4 on Self-Help stations in the Terrestrial Broadcasting Frequency Plan, 2013.
- 4.8 The requirement for the migration of Studio Transmitter Links within the 800 MHz band need to migrate immediately out of the band as per Terrestrial Broadcast Frequency Plan, 2013, the Radio Frequency Migration Plan 2019 and the NFRP 2018.

4.9 The Authority has studied SFN's which are registered with the ITU in the Radiocommunications Bureau (BR) International Frequency Information Circular (BRIFIC) database and noticed that numerous of them similar to the size of SFN's in the South African BRIFIC entries.

4. ITU Recommendations, Resolutions and Reports

The ITU-R Recommendations constitute a set of international technical standards developed by the Radiocommunication Sector (formerly CCIR) of the ITU. They are the result of studies undertaken by Radiocommunication Study Groups on:

5.1 the use of a vast range of wireless services, including popular new mobile communication technologies:

5.2 the management of the radio-frequency spectrum and satellite orbits;

5.3 the efficient use of the radio-frequency spectrum by all radiocommunication services;

5.4 terrestrial and satellite radiocommunication broadcasting;

5.5 radio wave propagation;

5.6 systems and networks for the fixed-satellite service, for the fixed service and the mobile service;

5.7 space operation, Earth exploration-satellite, meteorological-satellite and radio astronomy services.

5.8 The ITU published Recommendations, Resolutions and Reports with respect to the utilisation of band 470 – 690 for purposes of advising Administrations the planning criteria, including protection ratios, for various methods of providing second generation digital terrestrial television broadcasting (DTTB) systems in the VHF/UHF bands as follows:

5.8.1 Recommendation ITU-R P.1546-6 (08/2019): Method for point-to-area predictions for terrestrial services in the frequency range 30 MHz to 4 000 MHz

5.8.2 Recommendation ITU-R M.2012-4 (11/2019): Detailed specifications of the terrestrial radio interfaces of International Mobile Telecommunications-Advanced (IMT Advanced);

5.8.3 Report ITU-R2241-0 (2011) Compatibility studies in relation to Resolution 224 in the bands 698-806 MHz and 790-862 MHz;

5.8.4 Report ITU-R BT.2386-2 (04/2019) Digital terrestrial broadcasting: Design and implementation of single frequency networks (SFN)

- 5.8.5 Report ITU-R M.2074-0 (2006): Report on Radio Aspects for the terrestrial component of IMT-2000 and systems beyond IMT-2000;
- 5.8.6 Recommendation ITU-R M.1645-0 (06/2003) Framework and overall objectives of the future development of IMT-2000 and systems beyond IMT-2000;
- 5.8.7 The ITU Radio Regulations (RR) Edition 2016, Provision Number 5.1.2 of the Geneva 2006 (GE06) Agreement, and the WRC rev 2019 Resolution 224-4 (Rev. WRC 15), Resolution 260 (WRC-15) and the results of activities undertaken by the within ITU Region 1 (African Region);
- 5.8.8 Recommendation ITU-R M.2090-0 (10/2015) on specific unwanted emission limit of International Mobile Telecommunication (IMT) mobile stations operating in the frequency band 694-790 MHz to facilitate the protection of existing services in the ITU Region 1 in the frequency band 470-694 MHz;
- 5.8.9 Recommendation ITU R M.1036-6 (10/2019) dealing with the lower duplexer of the Frequency arrangement A5 in Recommendation ITU R M.1036-6 (i.e. uplink in 703-733 MHz) and a maximum output power of 23 dBm, to provide for a nine (9) MHz guard band between Broadcasting and IMT; and
- 5.8.10 ITU Report ITU-R BT.2339-0, (11/2014) with respect to co-channel sharing and compatibility studies between digital terrestrial television broadcasting and IMT in the frequency band 694-790 MHz in the GE06 planning area were studied and ITU-R Reports was developed in this respect.

5. Transmit Configuration for DVB-T2

6.1 The DTT Frequency Plan in Annexure J of the Terrestrial Broadcasting Plan 2013, is designed with the Transmit Configuration for DVB-T2 (Fixed Reception). The Terrestrial DTT Frequency Plan which was developed for South Africa is based on the following transmit configuration:

6.2 The transmit configuration is the most optimum transition configuration preferred. However, if the guard interval is smaller than the specified GI, this will lead to self-interference in the network. The Authority therefore emphasise that the transmission parameters should comply to the specified transmission configuration above even though 3 Mbit/s may be compromised.

6.3 The following transmit configuration or similar is possible, however, caution should apply as self-interference may result on the network thus making the SFN(s) unimplementable. See below transmit configuration:

6. Radio Frequency Spectrum Assignment Plan to clear the IMT 700 and IMT 800 spectrum of the Broadcasting Services after analogue television switch-off.

7.1 The Terrestrial Television Broadcasting Frequencies as registered and Coordinated with ITU and South Africa's six (6) neighbouring countries in accordance with the GE-06 Agreement.

7.2 Further, South Africa's current DTT frequency plan has been registered in 2014 with the ITU Master International Register having met the conformance requirements in accordance with the Geneva 06 and having been coordinated with South Africa's six (6) neighbouring countries.

7.3 The Terrestrial Television Plan contains 1257 frequencies for DTT implementation in the band 470 MHz to 694 MHz.

7.4 This plan is colloquially known as the seven (7) MUX plan since it provides for the deployment of seven multiplexes per transmission point in an 8 MHz channels per province as per the diagram below.

7.5 The details of the DTT Plan are contained in Annexure A and Annexure B to this RFSAP.

7.6 The Figures and maps below summarise the design of the 7 MUX plan and the multiplex group combinations in the respective provinces.

7.7 It should be noted that the frequency assignments were slightly distorted to reduce interference to broadcasting service licensees in other neighbouring countries.

7.8 The Terrestrial Television Broadcasting Plan also allowed for eSwatini (Kingdom of) and Lesotho (Kingdom of) to be included in the Digital Frequency Network (DFN) structure. In contrast, the conventional Multi Frequency Network (MFN) frequency plan approach would have provided only a maximum of four (4) national multiplexes for South Africa.

7.9 The maps below indicate the respective SFN's per province on a national basis and the channels that are to be used per province. Theoretically it is also possible to create a national country wide SFN which would have created 28 national SFN's each offering an 8 MHz channel. The plan as it currently stands can be further expanded to include localised MFN services per site as and where required.

7.10 The details of the DTT Plan are contained in Annexure A and Annexure B to this RFSAP.







- 7.11 The current plan for Analogue Switch Off (ASO) is to launch DTT on an MFN thus compelling a second migration phase before being able to release IMT700 and IMT800 spectrum. This approach also implies an extended dual illumination phase (where analogue and digital television operational in the band 470 MHz to 860 MHz) before releasing the IMT spectrum after the second migration phase and ASO.
- 7.12 .
- 7.13 The scenario where the Guard Interval is smaller than the specified Guard Interval will lead to self-interference in the network. This RFSAP therefore emphasise that the transmission parameters must comply with the above specified transmission configuration. This is to ensure the envisaged optimised implementation of the DTT Plan in Annexure A and Annexure B is realised within the envisage immediate implementation.

7. Re-Alignment of DTT Multiplexes

- 9.1 To create a plan with the least possible interference the large SFN's were broken up into smaller SFN's in some provinces as illustrated in Annexure A and Annexure B of this RFSAP.
- 9.2 In order to enable analogue services to be switch-off, Digital transmitters are to immediately operate in the frequencies as illustrated in **Annexure A (Column 5) and Annexure B (Column 5)** in accordance with coordinated frequencies in Annexure J of the Terrestrial Broadcasting Plan 2013, as amended.
- 9.3 In order to ensure re-alignment of the SFN, to Annexure J of the Terrestrial Broadcasting Plan 2013, as at a later stage, the frequencies are to be in accordance with **Annexure A (Column 14) and Annexure B (Column 14)** of this RFSAP.
- 9.4 The Freq (MHz) and CH are the frequency and associated channel number at which the service shall be implemented in transitional phase to ensure that the IMT700 and IMT800 frequencies can immediately be released after analogue switch-off. The Transitional Phase is the time period taken to Switch Analogue Frequencies directly to the Digital Single Frequency Network (SFN).
- 9.5 In the transitional phase there are no DTT assignments above 694 MHz. The final phase includes the frequencies and its associated final channel numbers which the station will operate in the provincial SFN network. The envisaged analogue switch-off phases per province to ensure the Digital Transmitters switch-on in order to enable the release IMT700 and IMT 800 frequencies are as illustrated in the table below:

- 9.7 The Authority aim that the IMT700 and IMT800 shall be clear from the broadcaster by end of the first semester of 2021.
- 9.8 The main advantages of changing all Multi- Frequency Network (MFN) DTT assignments below CH49 Single Frequency Network (SFN) before starting the analogue switch-off are as following:

¹ The phases are to be adjusted in accordance with the Policy imperatives and the representations from Industry based on a workable plan.

- 9.8.1 the first migration of all analogue stations interfered with by DTT stations can be initiated – These transmitter stations affected are included in Appendix C;
- 9.8.2 South Africa can then initiate the migration of all Digital Dividend 1 (“DD1”) analogue transmitters to Digital in order to clear the DD1 dividend (790 to 860 MHz) and;
- 9.8.3 Simultaneously initiate the migration all Digital Dividend 2 (“DD2”) analogue transmitters to Digital in order to clear the DD2 dividend (694 to 790 MHz); and
- 9.8.4 broadcasting service licensees can then migrate all analogue TV services in the band (470 to 694 MHz) at a pace that will not impact negatively on the broadcasters.

10. Requirements for usage of Radio Frequency Spectrum

- 10.1 This section covers the minimum key characteristics considered necessary to make the best use of the available frequencies.
- 10.2 The use of the 470 to 694 MHz Frequency band is limited for DTT services and only systems using digital technologies that promote spectral efficiency will be issued with an assignment. Capacity enhancing digital techniques are being rapidly developed and such techniques that promote efficient use of spectrum, without reducing quality of service are encouraged. In some cases, a radio system conforming to the requirements of this RFSAP may require modifications if harmful interference is caused to other radio stations or systems.
- 10.3 The allocation of spectrum and shared services within these bands are found in the NRFP and an extract of NRFP 2018 is shown in **Appendix A**.
- 10.4 While the maximum radiated power to be allowed is contained in Annexure A and Annexure B of this RFSAP.
- 10.5 In some cases, a radio system conforming to the requirements of this RFSAP may require modifications if harmful interference occurs.
- 10.6 The interference analysis results for digital on analogue transmission during the transitional phase are shown in **Annexure C to F**.
- 10.7 Criteria and guidelines for interference mitigation are dealt by Joint Spectrum Advisory Group, established in terms of the Digital Migration Regulations, 2012.

11. Implementation

- 11.1 No new assignment in the frequency range 470 to 694 MHz shall be approved unless they comply with this RFSAP.
- 11.2 The propagation model for use is contained in ITU-R Recommendation P.1546.

12. Co-ordination Requirements

All the frequencies used in this RFSAP have been coordinated and the assignment which have been included in the ITU-R BRIFIC database. All the frequencies used in this RFSAP are either coordinated or fall outside the coordination contour of the assignment which is registered in the BRIFIC ITU database. All coordination has been performed in line with the Geneva 2006 Agreement (GE06).

13. Assignment

The assignments in this frequency band are made in accordance with the procedure for Standard Applications in line with regulation 5 of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Regulations 2015, as amended.

14. Amendment

- 14.1 Existing Radio Frequency Spectrum Licences will be amended in accordance with the transitional arrangements in section 9 of this RFSAP, in accordance with regulation 9 of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Regulations 2015, as amended, read with regulation 12 (3) of the Digital Migration Regulations published in the Government Gazette Number 36000 (Notice 1070 of 2012).

15. Radio Frequency Migration

15.1 Specific Procedure

15.1.1 Radio Frequency Spectrum Licensees in this band shall migrate in accordance with phases in Annexure A and Annexure B in line with transitional arrangements as illustrated in Section 7 of this RFSAP.

15.1.2 Affected licensees are to apply for an amendment of their spectrum licences where applicable.

16. Commencement

- 16.1 This Radio Frequency Assignment Plan will come into effect upon publication in the Government Gazette.

Appendix B Interference Resolution Process

When requesting coordination, the relevant characteristics of the base station in accordance with the GE06 plan should be forwarded to the Administration affected. All of the following characteristics should be Included:

- a) carrier frequency [MHz];
- b) name of transmitter station;
- c) country of location of transmitter station;
- d) geographical coordinates [latitude, longitude];
- e) effective antenna height [m];
- f) antenna polarisation;
- g) antenna azimuth [deg];
- h) antenna gain [dBd];
- i) effective radiated power [dBW];
- j) expected coverage zone or radius [km];
- k) date of entry into service [month, year];
- l) code group number used; and
- m) antenna tilt [deg].

The Administration affected shall evaluate the request for coordination and shall within 30 days notify the result of the evaluation to the Administration requesting coordination. If in the course of the coordination procedure the Administration affected requires additional information, it may request such information.

If in the course of the coordination procedure, an Administration may request additional information.

If no reply is received by the Administration requesting coordination within 30 days, it may send a reminder to the Administration affected. An Administration not having responded within 30 days following communication of the reminder shall be deemed to have given its consent and the code co-ordination may be put into use with the characteristics given in the request for coordination.

The periods mentioned above may be extended by common consent.

Important remarks

Figures above reflects the maximum number of people located in the areas where interference is possible. Population figures do not include households that already migrated to DTT or DTH (indication is that 60% of television viewers already migrated to DTH or DTT). Most viewers affected will experience slight interference on analogue TV program. As such, Special efforts should be made to migrate affected viewers and others to DTT & DTH as soon as possible to avoid interference. Emphasis should be placed on migration of analogue television viewers who experience interference and where the frequency is transmitted above the 694 MHz to release the spectrum for IMT.

Appendix E: Radio Astronomy

The Astronomy Geographic Advantage Act, 2007 (Act No. 21 of 2007) (AGAA) provides for the Minister responsible for Science and Technology to declare any area or part of an area in the Province of the Northern Cape (except Sol Plaatje Municipal area) as an astronomy advantage area (AAA). The AAA's must be protected, amongst others, from harmful radio frequency interference, which may be caused by radio communication services. The SKA has been built in the Northern Cape Province. The SKA location, frequencies bands to be protected, protection levels, coordination procedures, and other parameters are prescribed through the Astronomy Geographic Advantage Act (21/2007) (AGA Act): Notice of the radio frequency spectrum exempted for use within the Karoo Central Astronomy Advantage Areas published in Government Gazette Number 42531 (Notice 926 of 2019). The band 100 MHz to 25.5 GHz are earmarked for the SKA.

Radiocommunications with transmitters located within the AAA's, which operate within the radio frequency range/s identified for radio astronomy purposes are to be subjected to the provisions of the AGAA. All transmitters located, or to be located, within the AAA's will be subject to authorisation according to the prescribed processes by the Astronomy Geographic Advantage Act (21/2007) (AGA Act): Notice of the radio frequency spectrum exempted for use within the Karoo Central Astronomy Advantage Areas published in Government Gazette Number 42531 (Notice 926 of 2019) Where authorisation has been granted in accordance with the prescribed procedures, a prospective licensee is still required to submit a spectrum application form for consideration by the Authority.

Where a licensee is required to move its electronic communications facility or migrate to an alternative radio frequency band, The Authority will consult and agree with the licensee regarding the reasonable period within which the licensee must cease to operate its electronic communications facility and migrate to an alternative band.

2. This Radio Frequency Spectrum Assignment Plan supersedes any previous spectrum assignment arrangements for the same spectrum location.

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1 Definitions

2 Purpose

- 2.1 The purpose of this RFSAP is to state the requirements for the utilisation of the frequency band 2500 to 2690 MHz for IMT2600 in South Africa.
- 2.2 The Radio Frequency Spectrum Assignment Plan provides information on the requirements attached to the use of a frequency band in line

with the allocation and other information in the National Radio Frequency Plan.

- 2.3 This information includes technical characteristics of radio systems, frequency channelling, coordination and details on required migration of existing users of the band and the expected method of assignment.
- 2.4 The Authority has opted for a TDD channel arrangement C3 from the Recommendation ITU-R M.1034-6 to increase the usable bandwidth of IMT2600 to 190 MHz.
- 2.5 Moreover, the increased bandwidth will allow the prospective incumbents to realise the capabilities of IMT2020 systems which require the bandwidth ranges of 80 to 100 MHz.
- 2.6 The ITU states that IMT systems are mobile systems that provide access to a wide range of telecommunication services including advanced mobile services, supported by mobile and fixed networks, which are increasingly packet-based. The ITU is the internationally recognised entity that has sole responsibility to define and to recommend the standards and frequency arrangements for IMT systems.

3 General

3.1 The naming for IMT was developed by the ITU in ITU-R Resolution 56-1. IMT is the root name that encompasses all IMT 2000 (including enhancement) and IMT Advanced (including enhancement)¹ and IMT 2020 collectively.

3.2 Key features of IMT are:

- a high degree of commonality of functionality worldwide while retaining the flexibility to support a wide range of services and applications in a cost- efficient manner;
- compatibility of services within IMT and with fixed networks;
- capability of interworking with other radio access systems;
- high quality mobile services;
- user equipment suitable for worldwide use;
- user-friendly applications, services and equipment;
- worldwide roaming capability; and
- enhanced peak data rates to support advanced services and applications.

3.3 Key capabilities of IMT2020:

- (a) **Peak data rate:** Maximum achievable data rate under ideal conditions per user/device (in Gbit/s);

¹ IMT 2000 and IMT Advance are generations of IMT progressively leading to IMT2020. The relevance is to ensure that the document complies with the ITU Radio Regulations in force in accordance to ITU-R Resolution 56-1.

- (b) **User experienced data rate:** Achievable data rate that is available ubiquitously² across the coverage area to a mobile user/device (in Mbit/s or Gbit/s);
- (c) **Latency:** The contribution by the radio network to the time from when the source sends a packet to when the destination receives the packet (in ms);
- (d) **Mobility:** Maximum speed at which a defined QoS and seamless transfer between radio nodes which may belong to different layers and/or radio access technologies (multi-layer/-RAT) can be achieved (in km/h);
- (e) **Connection density:** Total number of connected and/or accessible devices per unit area (per km²).
- (f) **Energy efficiency:** Energy efficiency has two aspects-
- (i) on the network side, energy efficiency refers to the quantity of information bits transmitted to/ received from users, per unit of energy consumption of the radio access network (RAN) (in bit/Joule);
 - (ii) on the device side, energy efficiency refers to quantity of information bits per unit of energy consumption of the communication module (in bit/Joule).
- (g) **Spectrum efficiency:** Average data throughput per unit of spectrum resource and per cell³ (bit/s/Hz); and

² The term "ubiquitous" is related to the considered target coverage area and is not intended to relate to an entire region or country.

³ The radio coverage area over which a mobile terminal can maintain a connection with one or more units of radio equipment located within that area. For an individual base station, this is the radio coverage area of the base station or of a subsystem (e.g. sector antenna).

(h) **Area traffic capacity:** Total traffic throughput served per geographic area (in Mbit/s/m²).

- 3.4 Technical characteristics of equipment used in IMT2600 systems must conform to all applicable South African standards, international standards, the ITU and its radio regulations as agreed and adopted by South Africa.
- 3.5 All installations must comply with safety rules as specified in applicable standards.
- 3.6 The equipment used must be certified under South African law and regulations.
- 3.7 The allocation of this frequency band and the information in this RFSAP are subject to review.
- 3.8 Frequency band assigned for IMT2600 include frequency range from 2500-2690 MHz.
- 3.9 The use of this band will be for IMT-TDD to align with the Final Radio Frequency Migration Plan 2019 published in Government Gazette 42337 (Notice 166 of 2019).
- (7) The technologies which can provide IMT2600 services include, but are not limited to:
- LTE,
 - LTE Advanced,
 - HSPA+, and
 - WiMAX.
- 3.10 Typical technical and operational characteristics of IMT systems as identified as by the ITU including reports and recommendations from the CEPT ECC are described in the following documents:
- 3.10.1. Recommendation ITU-R M.2012-1 (02/2014): Detailed specifications of the terrestrial radio interfaces of International Mobile Telecommunications-Advanced (IMT Advanced).

- 3.10.2. Report ITU-R M.2146 Coexistence between IMT-2000 CDMA-DS and IMT-2000 OFDMA TDD WMAN in the 2 500-2 690 MHz band operating in adjacent bands in the same area.
- 3.10.3. Report ITU-R 2113-1: Sharing studies in the 2 500-2 690 MHz band between IMT-2000 and fixed broadband wireless access systems including nomadic applications in the same geographical area.
- 3.10.4. Report ITU-R M.2045-0: Mitigating techniques to address coexistence between IMT-2000-time division duplex and frequency division duplex radio interface technologies within the frequency range 2 500-2 690 MHz operating in adjacent bands and in the same geographical area.
- 3.10.5. Report ITU-R M.2074: Report on Radio Aspects for the terrestrial component of IMT-2000 and systems beyond IMT-2000.
- 3.10.6. Report ITU-R M.2041: Sharing and adjacent band compatibility in the 2.5 GHz band between the terrestrial and satellite components of IMT-2000.
- 3.10.7. Recommendation ITU-R M.1645 Framework and overall objectives of the future development of IMT-2000 and systems beyond IMT-2000.
- 3.10.8. Recommendation ITU-R M.1036-6: Frequency arrangements for implementation of the terrestrial component of International Mobile Telecommunications (IMT) in the bands identified for IMT in the Radio Regulations (RR).
- 3.10.9. Recommendation ECC/REC (11) 05: The Electronic Communications Committee Decision within the European Conference of Postal and Telecommunications Administrations on the harmonised utilisation of spectrum for IMT-2000/UMTS systems operating within the band 2500 - 2690 MHz;
- 3.10.10. Report ECC/DEC (05)05: The Electronic Communications Committee Decision within the European Conference of Postal and Telecommunications Administrations on the harmonised utilisation



4 Channelling Plan

- 4.1 The frequency band 2500-2690MHz provides a total bandwidth of 190 MHz for the IMT service.
- 4.2 Channel arrangements are indicated in ITU Recommendations: Rec. ITU-R M.1036-6.
- 4.3 The ITU has recommended a list of channel arrangements shown below:

Option C1 is the current channel arrangement as depicted in the figure below:



Option C3 shall apply in respect to South Africa. This IMT-TDD aligns with the Final Radio Frequency Migration Plan 2019 published in Government Gazette 42829 (Notice 600 of 2019) and to increase the usable bandwidth of IMT2600.

South Africa is to implement the channel arrangement as illustrated below;



5 Requirements for usage of radio frequency spectrum

- 5.1 This section covers the minimum key characteristics considered necessary in order to make the best use of the available frequencies.
- 5.2 The use of the band is limited to IMT services.
- 5.3 Only systems using digital technologies that promote spectral efficiency will be issued with an assignment. Capacity enhancing digital techniques are being rapidly developed and such techniques that promote efficient use of spectrum, without reducing quality of service are encouraged.
- 5.4 The allocation of spectrum and shared services within these bands are found in the NRFP and an extract of NRFP is shown in Appendix A
- 5.5 5.1 Maximum radiated power
 - 5.5.1 Base Station transmissions should not exceed 61dBm/5MHz EIRP.

- 5.5.2 Mobile Station transmissions should not exceed 35 dBm/5 MHz (e.i.r.p.) and 31 dBm/5 MHz (TRP⁴)
- 5.5.3 On a case to case basis, higher EIRP may be permitted if acceptable technical justification is provided.
- 5.5.4 Where appropriate subscriber terminal station should comply with the technical specification outlined under "3GPP TS 36.521-1" or latest version.
- 5.6 In some cases, a radio system conforming to the requirements of this RFSAP may require modifications if major interference is caused to other radio stations or systems.
- 5.7 Criteria and guidelines for interference mitigation are described in **Appendix D.**

6 Implementation

- 6.1 No new assignments for IMT2600 in the band 2500 – 2690 MHz shall be approved unless they comply with this RFSAP.

7 Co-ordination Requirements

- 7.1 Use of these frequency bands require coordination with the neighbouring countries within the coordination zones of 0 kilometres in case of LTE-

⁴ TRP is defined as the integral of the power radiated by an antenna array system in different directions over the entire radiation sphere. TRP is equal to the total conducted power input into the antenna array system less any losses in the antenna array system.

to-LTE and 6 kilometres in case of Synchronised TDD operations with respect to other technologies in other neighbouring country.

- 7.2 The Trigger values at a height of 3 m above ground between TDD systems shall be 65 dB μ V/m/5 MHz@0 km and 49 dB μ V/m/5 MHz@6 km
- 7.3 The coordination distance is continuously being reviewed and may be updated from time to time.
- 7.4 The following field strength thresholds have to be assured based on ECC/REC 11(05) for 2500-2690 MHz frequency band. Operator-to-operator coordination may be necessary to avoid interference.
- 7.4.1 In general stations and systems may be used without coordination with a neighbouring country if the mean field strength produced by the cell (all transmitters within the sector) does not exceed the value of 30 dB μ V/m/5 MHz at an antenna height of 3m above ground at the borderline between countries, and does not exceed a value of 49 dB μ V/m/5 MHz@6 km at an antenna height of 3m above ground at a distance of 6 km inside the neighbouring country.
- 7.4.2 In the case that LTE is deployed both sides of the border the field strength levels can be increased to 59 dB μ V/m/5MHz and 41 dB μ V/m/5MHz at 6 km.
- 7.4.3 Synchronisation should be achieved including that of the field strength levels if TDD is in operation across both sides of a border.
- 7.5 For field strength, calculations should be made according to **Appendix B**. In cases of other frequency block sizes $10 \cdot \log$ (frequency block size/5MHz) should be added to the field strength values e.g.:

7.6 If neighbouring administrations wish to agree on frequency coordination based on preferential frequencies, while ensuring a fair treatment of different operators within a country the Authority will add the following within mutual agreements:

7.6.1 Stations of IMT systems may be operated without coordination if the mean field strength produced by the cell (all transmitters within the sector) does not exceed the value of 65 dBmV/m/5 MHz at 10% time, 50% of locations at 3 metres above ground level at the borderline

7.6.2 Technical analysis must be conducted by the Licensees before an assignment is made to individual base stations according to **Appendix B** taken from ECC/REC (11) 05 and must be notified to the Authority on a quarterly basis.

- 7.6.3 Specific information regarding coordination may be found in Appendix C, taken from Cross-Border Frequency Coordination: Harmonised Calculation Method for Africa (HCM4A) Agreement.
- 7.6.4 In the event of any interference, the Authority will require affected parties to carry out coordination. If the interference continues to be unresolved after 24 hours, the affected parties may refer the matter to the Authority for a resolution. The Authority will decide the necessary modifications and schedule of modifications to resolve the dispute. The Authority will be guided by the interference resolution process as shown **Appendix C**.
- 7.6.5 Assignment holders shall take full advantage of interference mitigation techniques such as antenna discrimination, tilt, polarization, frequency discrimination, shielding/blocking (introduce diffraction | loss), site selection, and/or power control to facilitate the coordination of systems.

8 Assignment

8.1 Extended Approach

- 8.1.1 The assignment of frequencies will take place in accordance with the Extended Application Procedures prescribed in terms of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Regulations of 2015, as amended.
- 8.1.2 The radio frequency spectrum licence of the incumbent has been amended for its re-assignment in the 2575-2595 MHz frequency band.
- 8.1.3 An Invitation to Apply will be published for assignments in the 2500 to 2690 MHz frequency band in terms of regulation 6 and 7 of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Regulations, 2015.

9 Revocation

- 9.1 Existing radio frequency spectrum licences for the use of the band are to be amended or revoked as per the frequency migration timetable published in the Radio Frequency Migration Plan.

10 Radio Frequency Migration

- 10.1 There is currently a single incumbent in the band between 2575 MHz to 2595 MHz.
- 10.2 Given the fact that TDD mode does not require a guard band, and in order to avoid interference between TDD networks operating in adjacent frequency carriers, radio transmissions of adjacent TDD networks should be synchronised and with the uplink and downlink frames aligned in time.
- 10.3 The incumbent may retain the assignment in the frequency band and must perform synchronisation with other licensees operating in TDD mode in order to avoid interference between TDD networks operating in adjacent frequency carriers, and accordance with the Network

synchronization for the frequency band 2500 to 2690 MHz as defined in Appendix E.

11 Radio Frequency Licence Amendment

The incumbent's Radio Frequency Spectrum Licence shall be amended in this Radio Frequency Spectrum Assignment Plan in order to implement TDD Synchronisation between and amongst when future licensees are licensed.

12 Commencement

12.1 This Radio Frequency Assignment Plan will come into effect upon publication in the Government Gazette.

Appendix B Propagation model

PROPAGATION MODEL

The following methods are proposed for assessment of anticipated interference inside neighbouring country based on established trigger values. Due to the complexity of radiowave propagation nature, different methods are proposed to be considered by administrations and are included here for guidance purposes only.

It should be noted that the following methods provide theoretical predictions based on available terrain knowledge. It is practically impossible to recreate these methods with measurement procedures in the field. Therefore, only some approximation of measurements could be used to check compliance with those methods based on practical measurement procedures. The details of such approximation are not included in this recommendation and should be negotiated between countries based on their radio monitoring practices.

1. PATH SPECIFIC MODEL

Where appropriate detailed terrain data is available, the propagation model for interference field strength prediction is the latest version of Recommendation ITU-R P.452, For the relevant transmitting terminal, predictions of path loss would be made at x km steps along radials of y km at z degree intervals. The values for those receiver locations within the neighbouring country would be used to construct a histogram of path loss – and if more than 10% of predicted values exceed the threshold the station should be required to be coordinated.

Values for x, y, z and path specific field strength levels are to be agreed between the administrations concerned.

2. SITE GENERAL MODEL

If it is not desirable to utilise detailed terrain height data for the propagation modelling in the border area, the basic model to be used to trigger coordination between administrations and to decide, if co-ordination is necessary, is Recommendation ITU-R P.1546, "Method for point to area predictions for terrestrial services in the frequency range 30 to 3000 MHz". This model is to be employed for 50% locations, 10% time and using a receiver height of 3m.

For specific reception areas where terrain roughness adjustments for improved accuracy of field strength prediction are needed, administrations may use correction factors according to terrain irregularity and/or an averaged value of the TCA parameter in order to describe the roughness of the area on and around the coordination line.

Administrations and/or operators concerned may agree to deviate from the model by mutual consent⁵.

3e.g. as used by members of the HCM-Agreement

3. AREA CALCULATIONS

In the case where greater accuracy is required, administrations and operators may use the area calculation below.

For calculations, all the pixels of a given geographical area to be agreed between the administrations concerned in a neighbouring country are taken into consideration.

For the relevant base station, predictions of path loss should be made for all the pixels of a given geographical area from a base station and at a receiver antenna height of 3m above ground.

For evaluation,

⁵ Such as in use by members of the HCM4A - Agreement

only 10 percent of the number of geographical areas between the borderline (including also the borderline) and the 6 km line itself inside the neighbouring country may be interfered by higher field strength than the trigger field strength value given for the borderline at a height of 3 m above ground;

only 10 percent of the number of geographical areas between the 6 km (including also 6km line) and 12 km line inside the neighbouring country may be interfered by higher field strength than the trigger field strength value given for the 6 km line at a height of 3 m above ground. It is recommended that during area calculations not only detailed terrain data but also clutter data be considered. Use of correction factors for clutter is crucial where the border area is 'open' or 'quasi-open' from the point of view of clutter or where the interfering base station is just a few kilometres from a borderline.

If the distance between a base station and a terrain point of a borderline is closer than or equal to 1 km, free space propagation model needs to be applied. Furthermore, if there is no terrain obstacle within the 1st Fresnel zone, also the free space propagation model should be applied.

If clutter data is not available, it is proposed to extend the usage of free space propagation model to a few kilometres, depending on the clutter situation in border areas.

For area type interference calculations, propagation models with path specific terrain correction factors are recommended (e.g. Recommendation ITU-R P.1546 with the terrain clearance angle correction factor TCA, HCM4A method with the terrain clearance angle correction factor or Recommendation ITU-R P.1812).

As to correction factors for clutters 'open area' and 'quasi-open area', 20 dB and 15 dB should be used respectively. Recommendation ITU-R P.1406 should be used if a finer selection of clutter is required.

It must be noted that terrain irregularity factor Δh is not recommended to be used in area calculations. Administrations and/or Licensees concerned may agree to deviate from the models by mutual consent.

Appendix C Cross boarder coordination

The following is extracted from ECC/REC (11)05 as an operational example and may be adapted for the SADC-countries.

FIELD STRENGTH LEVELS FOR THE CROSS-BORDER OPERATION BETWEEN FDD MFCN SYSTEMS IN THE FREQUENCY BAND 2500-2690 MHZ

1. Stations of FDD systems with centre frequencies not aligned on both sides of the borderline or with centre frequencies aligned using preferential PCI codes given in Annex 5 may be used without coordination with a neighbouring country if the mean field strength produced by the cell (all transmitters within the sector) does not exceed the value of 65 dB μ V/m/5MHz at a height of 3 m above ground at the borderline between countries and does not exceed a value of 49 dB μ V/m/5MHz at a height of 3 m above ground at a distance of 6 km inside the neighbouring country.
2. Stations of MFCN FDD systems with centre frequencies aligned on both sides of the borderline using non-preferential PCI codes may be used without coordination with a neighbouring country if the mean field strength produced by the cell (all transmitters within the sector) does not exceed the value of 49 dB μ V/m/5 MHz at a height of 3 m above ground at the borderline between countries.
3. It is usually not considered necessary to define preferential frequencies.
4. If administrations wish to agree on frequency coordination based on preferential frequencies, while ensuring a fair treatment of different licensees then they can do so based on mutual agreements. In this case field strength levels in *paragraph 1* above may be applicable.

FIELD STRENGTH LEVELS FOR THE CROSS-BORDER OPERATION BETWEEN TDD MFCN AND BETWEEN TDD AND FDD MFCN SYSTEMS IN THE FREQUENCY BAND 2500-2690 MHZ

1. In general, stations of MFCN systems may be operated without coordination if the mean field strength produced by the cell (all transmitters within the

sector) does not exceed the value of 30 dB μ V/m/5 MHz at 3 metres above ground level at the borderline.

2. If administrations wish to agree on frequency coordination based on preferential frequencies, or MFCN TDD systems are in operation across both sides of a border and are synchronised across the border, or MFCN TDD systems are deployed as downlink only on both sides of the border, then field strength levels of 65 dBmV/m/5 MHz@0 km and 49 dBmV/m/5 MHz@6 km are to be applied.

3. If the values in 2 above are not acceptable, field strength levels should be agreed on a bi- or multilateral basis.

4. TDD operation within the bands 2500-2570 MHz and 2620-2690 MHz has not been studied with FDD operation.

5. TDD operation within these bands will only occur if countries do not adopt the channelling arrangement in ECC/DEC/ (05)05. In this case the field strength levels should be agreed on a bi- or multilateral basis.

Appendix D Interference Resolution Process

When requesting coordination, the relevant characteristics of the base station and the code or PCI group number should be forwarded to the Affected Administration. All of the following characteristics should be included:

- a) carrier frequency [MHz]
- b) name of transmitter station
- c) country of location of transmitter station
- d) geographical coordinates [latitude, longitude]
- e) effective antenna height [m]
- f) antenna polarisation
- g) antenna azimuth [deg]
- h) antenna gain [dBi]
- i) effective radiated power [dBW]
- j) expected coverage zone or radius [km]
- k) date of entry into service [month, year].
- l) code group number used
- m) antenna tilt [deg]

The Affected Administration shall evaluate the request for coordination and shall within 30 days send the result of the evaluation to the Requesting Administration. If in the course of the coordination procedure the Affected Administration requires additional information, it may request such information.

During the course of the coordination procedure an Administration may request additional information from the other Administration. If no reply is received by the Requesting Administration within 30 days, it may send a reminder to the Affected Administration. Failure to respond within 30 days, following communication of the reminder, shall be deemed as consent and the code co-

ordination may be put into use with the characteristics given in the request for coordination.

The periods mentioned above may be extended by mutual consent in writing.

Appendix E - Network synchronization for the frequency band 2500 to 2690 MHz.

The Radio Frequency Spectrum Assignment Plan for the frequency band 2500 to 2690 MHz. The frequency band 2500-2690MHz provides a total bandwidth of 190 MHz for the IMT service. South Africa has decided to implement International Mobile Telecommunications (IMT) Time Division Duplex (TDD) in the Final Radio Frequency Migration Plan 2019 published in Government Gazette 42829 (Notice 600 of 2019) and to increase the usable bandwidth of IMT2600.

The frequency band 2500 to 2690 is to be assigned to more than one licensee. In order to ensure that more than one licensee is able to operate their networks in TDD mode, in the same geographic area, in a coordinated manner, it is important that these networks are synchronised in order to avoid interference.

In order to avoid interference where there is co-existence of TDD Networks and to avoid all Base Stations to Base Station as well as User Equipment to User Equipment interferences it is important to synchronise the base stations so that transmit and receive roughly at the same time. This to say that operation is synchronised in such a way that there is no simultaneous uplink and downlink occurring between any pairs of cells which may interfere with each other in the same band.

In order to avoid interference between TDD networks operating in adjacent frequency carriers, the radio transmissions of adjacent TDD networks shall be synchronised with the uplink and downlink frames aligned in time. Such synchronisation of networks is very important due to the fact that this is the best way to avoid interference between networks and ensure efficient use of spectrum resources by avoiding inter-operator guard bands and additional base stations filtering.

Network synchronisation has been successfully implemented in IMT Advance TDD networks ensuring efficient use of the spectrum resource by avoiding the need for guard bands between licensee's assignments. Similarly, inter-licensee's synchronisation and time alignment of uplink and downlink

transmissions (slot and frame synchronisation) are also necessary for efficient deployment of IMT2020 New Radio networks in unpaired band assignments. This RFSAP therefore, is aimed at facilitating synchronised operation among IMT Advance and IMT2020 networks operating in adjacent frequency blocks to make the best use of the valuable spectrum resource.

The Authority recommends to licensees that two (2) transmission frame structures for IMT-Advance and IMT2020 macro-cell networks operating in unpaired New Radio Frequency Bands, taking into account technology advances and system design requirements:




Figure 2: 2.5ms dual periodicity frame structure

1. **Scenario 1: IMT2020 only, no legacy IMT Advance TDD networks:** 2.5ms periodicity frame structure (DDDSU) for high system capacity and efficiency (Figure 1), and 2.5ms dual periodicity frame structure (DDDSU+DDSUU) for prioritisation of UL transmission (Figure 2).





Figure 3: 5ms periodicity frame structure

2. **Scenario 2: IMT2020 co-existence with IMT Advance TDD network:** 5ms periodicity frame structure compatible with LTE TDD network (DDDDDDDSUU) (Figure 3). However, this is accompanied with twice the latency of Scenario 1.

Figure 1: 2.5ms periodicity frame structure

In South Africa, there are legacy IMT Advance TDD networks in the frequency band IMT2600 as illustrated in the Scenario 2. The Authority therefore recommends that licences, in designing their network consider a 5ms periodicity frame structure for IMT2020 network (DDDDDDDSUU,8:2), and 5ms periodicity frame structure for IMT Advance network (DSUDD,3:1).

Licensees are encouraged to agree on the preferred synchronisation method. The Authority will step in, order to mediate in the case where there is no consensus amongst licensee.

COUNCILS MAY NOT SEEK ACCREDITATION FOR THE FOLLOWING DISPUTE RESOLUTION FUNCTIONS REGARDING DISPUTES OVER THE FOLLOWING (see FOOTNOTE 11 of SECTION 51):

Organisational rights (sections 16, 21 and 22);

Collective Agreements where the agreement does not provide for a dispute resolution procedure or the procedure is inoperative or any party frustrates the resolution of disputes (section 24(2) to (5));

Agency shops and closed shops (section 24(6) and (7) and section 26(11);

Determinations made by the Minister in respect of proposals made by a Statutory Council (section 45);

The interpretation and application of Collective Agreements of a Council whose registration has been cancelled (section 61(5) to (8));

Demarcation of sectors and areas of Councils (section 62);

The Interpretation or application of Part C (Bargaining Councils), Part D (Bargaining Councils in the Public Service), Part E (Statutory Councils) and Part F (General Provisions concerning Councils) (Section 63);

Picketing (section 69(8) to 10);

Proposals which are the subject of joint-decision making in a workplace forum (section 86);

Disclosure of information to workplace forums (section 89);

Interpretation or Application of the provisions of Chapter 5 of the LRA which deals with workplace forums (section 94);

Enforcement of the Collective Agreements by Bargaining Councils (section 33A) and;

Enforcement of arbitration awards in terms of section 143. Only the Director of the CCMA, unless the power has been delegated to a CCMA Senior Commissioner may certify awards as if it were an order of the Labour Court;

Facilitating mass retrenchment disputes section 189(A).

2. POWERS OF ACCREDITATION:

Only those persons who are accredited by the CCMA, or are part-time Commissioners appointed by the Governing Body of the Commission in the terms of section 117 (2) of the Labour Relations Act, may perform the accreditation functions of the council for the Council.

The following provisions of the LRA, as amended apply to Councils accredited for conciliation and arbitration:

- (a) For the purpose of this paragraph any reference in Part C of Chapter VII of the LRA to:
"Commission" must be read as a reference to the Council;
"Commissioner" must be read as a reference to a conciliator or arbitrator appointed by the Council.
"Director" must be read as a reference to the Secretary of the Council.
- (b) The provisions of the sections contained in Part C of Chapter VII (section 127(6)) of the LRA shall apply to the Council in the performance of its accredited functions subject to the Council's Constitution and/or Collective Agreements. For the purpose of this sub-paragraph the following applies:
 - (i) The provisions of section 133 to 136;
 - (ii) The provisions of section 138 to 142, S142A, S143, S144 and S145;
 - (iii) The provisions of section 146 unless the Collective Agreement of the Council provides that the Arbitration Act, Act 42 of 1965 applies to any arbitration conducted under its accredited function and which Collective Agreement is binding on the parties to the disputes; and
 - (iv) The provisions of section 148.

3. EXTENSION OF ACCREDITATION:

Despite the expiry of the period of accreditation as stated in the Certificate of Accreditation, the Council may continue to perform its accredited functions in respect of any dispute referred to it during the period of accreditation, but not yet resolved by the time the period expires, until the dispute is resolved either through conciliation or arbitration.

4. TRANSGRESSION OF TERMS OF ACCREDITATION:

If the accredited Council fails to comply with the terms of accreditation, the Governing Body of the CCMA may revoke accreditation. In terms of section 130 of the LRA, as amended the Governing Body of the CCMA may withdraw accreditation after having given reasonable notice of withdrawal.

5. AMENDMENT OF ACCREDITATION:

An Accredited Council may apply to the Governing Body of the CCMA in terms of section 129 of the LRA to amend its accreditation.



**DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE OF THE IRBA
CALL FOR NOMINATIONS**

The Independent Regulatory Board for Auditors (IRBA) is a statutory body established in terms of Section 3 of the Auditing Profession Act, 2005, Act 26 of 2005, as amended (APA). As part of its general mandate to protect the public and promote the integrity of the auditing profession, the IRBA investigates allegations of improper conduct against registered auditors and registered candidate auditors and conducts disciplinary hearings. Accordingly, in terms of Sections 20(2)(f) of the APA, the IRBA has established a Disciplinary Committee, which is a permanent committee of the IRBA, tasked with determining charges of improper conduct against registered auditors, and imposing appropriate sanctions.

Section 24(2) of the APA requires that the Disciplinary Committee must be chaired by a retired judge or senior advocate and must consist of a majority of persons who are not registered auditors, but must include registered auditors and other suitably qualified persons.

Disciplinary Committee members currently serve a term of three years, renewable twice at the discretion of the IRBA. This is subject to the proposed amendments to the Act being promulgated, in which event the Board retains a discretion to reduce the member's term of office.

The following vacancies exist on the Disciplinary Committee:

- One Retired Judge or Senior Advocate; and
- One Registered Auditor: *the RA may NOT be affiliated to a firm or a network firm as defined in the IRBA Code*

As most cases dealt with by the committee involve work related to auditing, accounting and ethics, and are conducted through general legal principles, a sound and thorough understanding of these disciplines is essential.

In appointing suitable persons, the IRBA will take into account the current demographic composition of the committees and will seek to achieve a more representative committee in accordance with the demographics of the country.
