



To appropriate amounts of money for the requirements of the Gauteng Province for the financial year ending 31 March 2004.

BE IT ENACTED by the Gauteng Provincial Legislature, as follows:—

Appropriation of amounts of money for the requirements of the Gauteng Province

1. Subject to the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999), the amounts of money shown in the Schedule are appropriated out of the Provincial Revenue Fund for the requirements of the Province, as a charge to the Provincial Revenue Account, for the financial year ending 31 March 2004.

Short Title

2. This Act is called the Provincial Appropriation Act, 2003.
