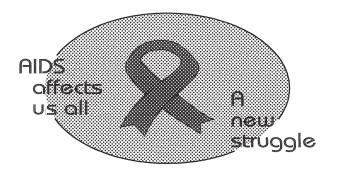

Purpose	<ul> <li>The Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) is one element within a broader government strategy to reduce poverty through the alleviation and reduction of unemployment. The Expanded Public Works Programme involves creating work opportunities for unemployed persons, and so allowing them to participate economically and contribute to the development of their communities and the country as a whole.</li> <li>Phase III of EPWP aims to:</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Significantly expand the creation of temporary work opportunities that provide income to the poor and unemployed.</li> <li>Increase the duration of work opportunities for maximum impact.</li> <li>Introduce incentives to motivate increased job creation efforts by Public Bodies, as anticipated in clause 8 below, for the provision of a financial reward.</li> <li>The National Department of Public Works is mandated to lead and coordinate the EPWP.</li> </ul>
	The success of EPWP depends on concerted effort, cooperation and implementation across all sectors, spheres of government as well as non-state entities.
	<ul> <li>The Expanded Public Works Programme ("EPWP") is a national labour intensive programme initiated by government that is aimed at providing poverty and income relief through temporary work for the unemployed to carry out socially useful activities. It draws significant numbers of unemployed people into productive work, so that they gain skills and increase their capacity to earn income.</li> </ul>
