



CANCELLATIONS

I, **Sylvia Lucas**, in terms of Section 44 of the Northern Cape Traditional Leadership, Governance and Houses of Traditional Leaders Act (Act 2 of 2007) and after consultation with the electoral college for the John Taolo Gaetsewe District hereby determine the number of members of the John Taolo Gaetsewe Local House of Traditional Leaders and the procedure to be followed for the election of members as set out in the Schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

 In this Schedule, any word or expression defined in the Northern Cape Traditional Leadership, Governance and Houses of Traditional Leaders Act, 2007 (Act 2 of 2007) (the Act), shall bear such meaning unless the context indicates otherwise.

Number of Members

- 2. The John Taolo Gaetsewe Local House of Traditional Leaders consists of nine (9) members comprising of-
 - (a) two (2) senior traditional leaders; and
 - (b) subject to clause 3, seven (7) headmen or headwomen.

Ex officio member

3. The recognised headwoman in the John Taolo Gaetsewe District Municipality is an *ex officio* member of the Local House as contemplated in clause 2(*b*) and therefore the provisions of this Notice relating to nominations and elections do not apply to the said recognised headwoman.

Nomination of Candidates

- 4. (1) The Chairperson of the Electoral College must preside over the nomination process.
 - (2) Members of the Electoral College must nominate-
 - (a) from amongst themselves, at least two senior traditional leaders to be considered for election as members contemplated in clause 2(a); and
 - (b) at least six headmen or headwomen to be considered for election as members contemplated in clause 2(b).

- (3) A candidate who has been nominated must be seconded by at least one other member of the Electoral College
- (4) A nominee must accept the nomination.
- (5) All nominations and the secondments must be recorded by the Chairperson.

Election Procedure

- 5. (1) Two officials from the provincial department responsible for cooperative governance, human settlements and traditional affairs must assist the Chairperson with the election process.
 - (2) The Chairperson must before voting takes place-
 - (i) ensure that ballot papers containing the names of all nominated candidates are compiled and available at the election;
 - (ii) ensure that the ballot papers are distributed to all the members of the Electoral College;
 - (iii) ensure that a ballet box for depositing completed ballot papers is available; and
 - (iv) explain the secret ballot voting procedure.
 - (3) Each member of the Electoral College may vote for two nominated senior traditional leaders and three nominated headmen or headwomen and should take into account the gender requirement contemplated in section 44(5) of the Act.
 - (4) Members of the Electoral College must deposit their completed ballot papers in the ballot box provided for that purpose.
 - (5) Votes must be counted by the officials referred to in subsection (1), under the supervision of the Chairperson of the Electoral College.
 - (6) The two senior traditional leaders and six headmen or headwomen who received the highest number of votes shall become members of the Local House.

(7) The outcome of the elections must be announced by the Chairperson immediately after counting has been completed and must be submitted by the Chairperson to the Premier in writing.

Equal number of votes

7. In the event that two or more candidates receive an equal number of votes the result will be determined by casting a lot: Provided that if one of these candidates is a female, such female candidate will be regarded as having been elected.

Filling of vacancies

8. Whenever a vacancy arises in the membership of the Local House, the candidate who received the second highest number of votes will be regarded as having been elected to fill such vacancy.

Oath or affirmation

- 9. The Chairperson and departmental officials must before they begin to perform their functions take an oath or solemn affirmation in line with Part C of the Code of Conduct contained in the Schedule to the Act.
- 10. The Members of the Local House must, before they begin to perform their functions in the Local House, take an oath or solemn affirmation as contemplated in Part C of the Code of Conduct contained in the Schedule to the Act.

Date, Time and Venue of the Elections

 The elections contemplated in this Notice shall take place at Kuruman on 12
 October 2017, at the John Taolo Gaetsewe District Municipality Council Chamber, Kuruman.

Withdrawal of Notice
