Community Works Programme is implemented in 18 Municipalities and it created 18257 work opportunities for the year under review.

Back to Basics Pillar 2: Creating conditions for decent living

85% of households have access to a basic level of water, 90% of households have access to a basic level of electricity while access to basic level sanitation is at 50%.

Back to Basics Pillar 3: Good Governance

All the Municipalities submitted their Integrated development plan (IDP) during the year under Review. Fourteen (12) Municipalities tabled the Oversight Report on Annual Report for the 2016/17 Financial Year


Back to Basics Pillar 4: Sound Financial Management

All the local municipalities (18) were assisted with the implementation of the Local Government: Municipal Property rates Act, 2004 (As Amended) also Rates and Taxes Payment Campaign

Back to Basics Pillar 5: Building Capable Institutions and Administrations

Due new council term, most senior management contracts are elapsing by the end of the financial year 45% of Municipal Manager positions filled and 36% Chief Financial Officers Filled

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

This Annual Performance Report for 2016/17 financial year is in compliance with section 47 of the Local Government Municipal Systems Act. (Act No. 32 of 2000). The report measures the progress made by the Local Government Provincially in meeting its constitutional mandate to, namely:

- (a) To provide a democratic and accountable government for local communities;
- (b) Ensure that services are provided to the community in a sustainable manner;
- (c) Promote social and economic development;

Ward committees' functionality decreased as compared to the prior years, 100% during the year under review, 15/16 at 68% 14/15 at 70%, 13/14 at 74%.


Number of CWP work opportunities created in the province by Municipalities are 18257 as compared to 15/16
