NORMS AND STANDARDS FOR THE INCLUSION OF PRIVATE NATURE RESERVES IN THE REGISTER OF PROTECTED AREAS OF SOUTH AFRICA

I, Bomo Edith Edna Molewa, Minister of Environmental Affairs, hereby, under section 11 read with section 10(2) of the National Environmental Management Protected Areas Act, 2003 (Act No. 57 of 2003), set norms and standards for the inclusion of private nature reserves in the register of protected areas of South Africa in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

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CHAPTER 1

INTERPRETATION, PURPOSE AND APPLICATION

1. Definitions

Any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, 2003 (Act No. 57 of 2003), has the meaning so assigned and, unless the context otherwise indicates;

"Biodiversity Act" means the National Environmental Management: Biodiversity Act, 2004 (Act No.10 of 2004);

"Development" means a physical intervention, excavation or action, other than that caused by natural forces, which may result in a change in the, appearance or physical nature of a site in a nature reserve or influence its stability and future well-being, including—

- the construction, alteration, demolition, removal or change of use of a site or a structure on the site;
- the carrying out of any works on, over or under the site;
- the construction or putting up for display of signs or notice boards;
- d) any change to the natural or existing condition or topography of land; and
- e) any removal, physical disturbance, clearing or destruction of trees or vegetation or the removal of topsoil.

"extensive wildlife system" means a system that is large enough and suitable for the management of self-sustaining wildlife populations in a natural environment with minimal human intervention in the form of—

- (a) the provision of water:
- (b) the supplementation of food, except in times of drought;
- (c) the control of parasites; or
- (d) the provision of health care.

"private nature reserve" means a nature reserve -

- a) which is in communal ownership or privately owned by a single land owner or multiple land owners.
- b) that has been declared, or regarded as having been declared, in terms of section 12, 23 (3) and 23(5) of the Act as a nature reserve; and
- c) that is designated as a private nature reserve in terms of section 25 of the Act.

"share-block" means an area that is leased within a private nature reserve and not freehold property, since the property is either registered in the name of, or leased by the land-owner.

"the Act" means the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, 2003 (Act No. 57 of 2003); and

"the Register" means the Register of Protected Areas developed in terms of section 10 of the Act.

2. Purpose of the norms and standards

The purpose of these norms and standards is to-

- (1) verify the existence of private nature reserves in practices, not only in name;
- (2) provide for the recognition of the private nature reserves as bona fide protected areas in terms of the Act;
- (3) secure the continued integrity of private nature reserves as natural areas supporting South Africa's biological diversity and its landscapes through their management; and
- (4) ensure that only verified private nature reserves are included into the National Protected Areas Register and into the Protected Areas Database.

3. Application of these norms and standards

These norms and standards apply to-

- (1) land regarded as a nature reserve for the purposes of the Act in terms of section 12 or having been declared as such in terms of section 23(5); or
- (2) all private land declared as nature reserves in terms of section 23(3) of the Act.
- 4. Legislative framework
- (1) The Minister may, in terms of section 11 of the Act, prescribe norms and standards for any of the objectives of the Act, including the management and development of protected areas as well as indicators to measure compliance with those norms and standards.
- (2) The Minister is required, in terms of section 10 of the Act, to maintain a Register containing a list of all protected areas, indicating the kind of protected area in each case, and any other information determined by the Minister.
- (3) The MEC must, in terms of section 27 of the Act, promptly forward to the Minister, a copy of each notice published under section 23, 24 or 25 of the Act.
- (4) The Register is subject to the requirements of the South African Statistical Quality Assessment Framework.

- (5) The Department is registered as the custodian of the South African Protected Areas Database by the Committee for Spatial Information, mandated in terms of the Spatial Data Infrastructure Act, 2003 (Act No.54 of 2003).
- (6) The Register is a legally recognized database on protected areas for South Africa in terms of section 10 of the Act.
- (7) The inclusion of private nature reserves into this database is integral to the maintenance of the Register.
- (8) The inclusion of private nature reserves in the Register, is with particular reference to the objective of the Act as set out in section 2(d)
 - "to provide for a diverse and representative network of protected areas on state land, private land, communal land and marine waters":
- (9) A private nature reserve that fails to comply with these norms and standards may be removed from the Register of Protected Areas by the Minister, after the declaration has been withdrawn in terms of section 24(2) of the Act.
- 5. Guiding principles
- (1) The purposes of areas declared as protected areas are set out in section 17 of the Act.

 This provides the guiding principles for these norms and standards, namely—
 - to protect ecologically viable areas representative of South Africa's biological diversity and its natural landscapes and seascapes in a system of protected areas;
 - to preserve the ecological integrity of those areas;
 - c) to conserve biodiversity in those areas;
 - d) to protect areas representative of all ecosystems, habitats and species naturally occurring in South Africa:
 - to protect South Africa's threatened or rare species;
 - to protect an area which is vulnerable or ecologically sensitive;
 - g) to assist in ensuring the sustained supply of environmental goods and services;
 - h) to provide for the sustainable use of natural and biological resources;
 - to create or augment destinations for nature-based tourism;
 - f) to manage the interrelationship between natural environmental biodiversity, human settlement and economic development;
 - generally, to contribute to human, social, cultural, spiritual and economic development; or

- to rehabilitate and restore degraded ecosystems and promote the recovery of endangered and vulnerable species
- (2) The rights of landowners of private nature reserves include—
 - the right to their property which is protected under section 25 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996;
 - the right to the lawful use of existing private property;
- (3) The obligation of landowners of private nature reserves include—
 - the obligation not to undertake actions which will compromise the integrity of the private nature reserve, and such actions must be in accordance to a management plan;
 - the obligation to ensure that reasonable measures are taken to prevent environmental degradation from occurring, continuing or recurring on their property;
 - the obligation to ensure that any developmental activity be subject to the relevant policies, legislation and in accordance with the management plan;
 - the responsibility for the maintenance of developmental activities on their property in the long term; and
 - d) the obligation to cooperate with the relevant organ of state in an open and transparent manner.
- (4) All affected parties have an obligation to cooperate with each other in good faith and mutual understanding and seek consensus to ensure the private nature reserve is declared and is managed in accordance to a management plan.
- (5) The management authorities must have an action plan with specified timeframes to implement corrective measures, when the private nature reserve is not in compliance with these norms and standards.
- (6) Where there is significant degradation or changes to the attributes of a site that are irremediable the Minister or MEC may withdraw the status of the private nature reserve in terms of section 24(1) or (2) of the Act.

CHAPTER 2

THE PROCESS TO VERIFY THE EXISTENCE OF A PRIVATE NATURE RESERVE

- 6. The verification process
- (1) A nature reserves declared in terms of section 23 of the Act, may be designated as a private nature reserve.
- (2) A nature reserve will be designated as a private nature reserve when-

- a) proof of declaration in terms of the Act is provided, and
- there is compliance with the provisions of the Act.

Proof of declaration

A copy of a notice of declaration of a nature reserve in respect of private land published in the *Gazette* by the MEC must be submitted by the MEC to the Minister as contemplated in section 27 of the Act. This will include—

- a) gazette number, and the date of publication;
- empowering provision of the Act, in terms of which the notice of declaration is published;
- c) name of the area;
- d) description of the area;
- e) survey diagramme; and
- f) endorsed title deed.
- 8. Compliance with the requirements of the Act
- (1) The MEC must inform the Minister in writing of the agreements which are in place with the landowners, in terms of section 23(3) of the Act.
- (2) A management authority for the management of private nature reserve must be assigned as contemplated in section 38(3) of the Act.
- (3) The management authority must have submitted a management plan to the Minister or MEC for approval, in terms of section 39 of the Act.

CHAPTER 3

NORMS FOR THE DESIGNATION OF PRIVATE NATURE RESERVES

- 9. Designation of Private Nature Reserves
- (1) The Minister or MEC may designate a nature reserves in private ownership as private nature reserves in terms of section 25 of the Act, for the purpose of inclusion into the National Protected Areas Register and into the Protected Areas Database.
- (2) The MEC must inform the Minister of the designation done in terms of paragraph (1).
- (3) The private nature reserve must comply with the requirements of section 23(2) of the Act.
- (4) The MEC must have declared the nature reserve and the process to verify its existence must be undertaken as set out in Chapter 2 of these norms and standards.

- (5) A private nature reserve must be privately owned, it may be owned by a single owner, a juristic person or jointly by a group of owners, such as a company or a community;
- (6) A private nature reserve may consist of a single property or several properties managed according to a single management plan;
- (7) When a private nature reserve is an entity constituted from different properties of-
 - associated landowners, a Constitution or other legal means of verification indicating the collaborative intention will be a requirement; or
 - community owned land, a Trust, Community Property Association or any other legally recognised constituted entity is to be established.
- (8) The designation must be considered if the area-
 - a) promotes and preserves specific ecological processes, natural systems, natural beauty, or indigenous wildlife species;
 - b) protects biological diversity in general;
 - c) creates or augment destination for nature-based tourism;
 - d) contributes to human, social, cultural, spiritual, and economic development where feasible:
 - e) is developed and managed in the interest of conservation, education and sustained resource utilization; or
 - f) is an extensive wildlife system.
- (9) There is no prescribed minimum size for a private nature reserve, but the size of the area should be in accordance with the purpose and objectives of the private nature reserve.
- (10) The private nature reserve may be a contiguous area and not fragmented into separate isolated areas.

CHAPTER 4

THE MANAGEMENT OF A PRIVATE NATURE RESERVE

- 10. Ecological integrity maintained
- (1) A private nature reserve must be managed for the purpose for which it was declared as required in terms of section 40(1)(a) of the Act.
- (2) A remote sensing review should be done using the latest Land Cover Database or platforms such as Google earth to ensure that
 - a) no destruction or transformation of habitat has taken place;
 - b) no new crops have been planted replacing natural habitat; or

- c) housing and tourism based development complies with the management plan and zonation plan of the private nature reserve.
- (3) The provincial organ of state responsible for nature conservation will conduct site visits to-
 - a) verify the remote sensing assessment;
 - verify the implementation of the management plan as submitted, particularly the programme to remove alien and Invasive species in terms of section 41 of the Act and section 76 of the Biodiversity Act;
 - ensure that there is no introduction of species that were not naturally occurring or previously found within the reserve;
 - ensure that the reserve is not used for stud breeding especially in feedlots or controlled camps of indigenous species and of colour variants of indigenous species; and
 - ensure that there is minimal management interference, especially with regard to supplementary feeding that should be seen as the exception, and not a norm.

11. Subdivision of land

The management authority must ensure that-

- a) the subdivision of land is only permitted if it does not conflict with the purpose and objectives the private nature reserve, and as addressed in the management plan approved by the MEC.
- an area that is subdivided and is inconsistent with paragraph (a) is excised from the nature reserve.
- c) share-blocks are shown in the management plan and their development footprint is restricted.

12. Adequate control

- Access to a private nature reserve will be controlled by the assigned management authority.
- (2) The private nature reserve must be secured in law, its boundaries must be well demarcated and publically known, and must be in accordance with the purpose and objectives of the area and its management plan.
- (3) The type of fencing used on the perimeter of the area or within the area may be determined by the provincial conservation authority in terms of its legal requirements.
- (4) All consumptive and non-consumptive uses of biodiversity on a private nature reserves

should be in line with scientifically based conservation management objectives and practices, as outlined in the management plan of the area.

- (5) A management authority of a private nature reserve-
 - a) Is responsible for the management, control and maintenance of the area in terms of section 40(1) of the Act.
 - b) must work in cooperation with state and within the limits of the law.

CHAPTER 4

REPORTING

13. Management authorities

The management authority is responsible for the submission of plans required in terms of the Act and the Blodiversity Act, and reports required in terms of these norms and standards and this include but not limited to—

- a) a management plan, and the following which must be submitted as part of a management plan-
 - (i) biodiversity or species management plans;
 - (ii) alien and invasive species eradication plan; and
 - (ii) the Zonation Plan.
- a report to the MEC on progress towards meeting these norms and standards, which
 may include progress towards implementing the corrective measures indicated in
 paragraph 3(5), where necessary.

14. Provincial nature conservation authorities

The provincial nature conservation authorities must submit a list of verified private nature reserves to the Minister one month after the end of each financial year.

15. Inclusion of private nature reserves into the South African Protected Areas Register

The Minister will include a verified list of private nature reserves in the database of protected areas and the Register.

PRACTICE NOTE 9 OF 2017

SERVICE OF SUBPOENAS AND OTHER COURT DOCUMENTS ON CIPC

In some instances it is required for legal documents such as Notices of Motion, Subpoenas to provide documentation, etc. to be served on CIPC as an interested party, as the outcome of the court proceedings may entail action to be taken by CIPC.

Uniform Rules of Court, specifically Rule 4 and 4A describes the requirements of service of legal documents in detail and allows for the service of documents by way of electronic means. Annexure 3, Table CR3 of the Companies Act, 2008 details the methods and times for delivery of documents, and provides for service thereof by electronic means. To this end, CIPC has provided for a dedicated e-mail box to receive legal documentation — corporatelegalservices@cipc.co.za

All legal documents where CIPC is stated as an interested party, and must be provided with a copy of the documents for record purposes, may be sent to the dedicated e-mail address as valid service thereof.

With regards to subpoena's, where specific action is required by CIPC, service via <u>corporatelegalservices@cipc.co.za</u> is also accepted.

Subpoenas must comply with the following requirements:

- All documentation must be signed by the Registrar of the relevant court:
- Enough time must be provided for CIPC to respond in terms of Rule 4 of the Uniform Rules of Court, which advocates a "reasonable time" period;
- Only information that CIPC is in a position to provide and have knowledge of, should be requested;
- Costs for providing documentary evidence, and/or giving evidence in a hearing must be tendered.

PRACTICE NOTE 08 OF 2017 REQUIREMENTS FOR RE-INSTATEMENT IN TERMS OF REGULATIONS 4(2)(b)

Note that PRACTICE Notice 6 of 2008 is hereby withdrawn on 1 May 2017 and replace with Practice Note 08 of 2017.

This practice note is issued in terms of Regulation 4(2)(b) of the Companies Regulations, 2011, and is applicable to the re-instatement of companies and close corporations in terms of Companies Regulation 40(6) and (7)

In order to re-instate a company or close corporation from 1 May 2017, the re-instatement application on a form CoR40.5 must comply with the following requirements regardless of the cause or date of deregistration;

- (1) Certified identity copy of the applicant;
- (2) Certified identity copy of the owner of the customer code;
- (3) Multiple Deed search (deed search of each of the 10 regional deeds offices);
- (4) Letter from the Department of Public Works, ONLY if the multiple deed search reflects immovable property;
- (5) Sufficient **documentary** proof indicating that the company or close corporation was in business or that it had any outstanding assets or liabilities (e.g property, intellectual property rights), at the time of deregistration.
- (6) Mandate from the applicant confirming that the customer may submit on his/her behalf.

CIPC will only consider re-instating a company or close corporation if it can provide proof that it was conducting business at the time of deregistration, or has any other economic value.

Upon the successful processing of the re-instatement application, all outstanding annual returns must be filed in order to complete the process. If the close corporation or company fails to file all outstanding annual returns within 30 business days from date of the re-instatement, the company or close depreparation will be finally deregistered again without any further notification.

CALEDON MODDER SUBSYSTEM - LIMITING THE USE OF WATER IN TERMS OF ITEM 6 OF SCHEDULE 3 OF THE NATIONAL WATER ACT OF 1998 FOR URBAN AND IRRIGATION PURPOSES FROM THE DAMS WITHIN THE CALEDON-MODDER SUBSYSTEM

I, Sifiso Mkhize, in my capacity as Acting Director-General of the Department of Water and Sanitation, on reasonable grounds believe that a potential water shortage exists in the Caledon Modder Subsystem. This is due to insufficient rains and infrastructural constraint that is limiting transfer capacity from the Caledon to the Modder sub-system.

In terms of Item 6(1) of Schedule 3 to the Act, the Minister of Water and Sanitation may limit the use of water if on reasonable grounds the Minister believes that a water shortage exists within the area concerned. This power has been delegated to me in terms of section 63 (1) (b) of the Act.

Therefore in my capacity as the Acting Director-General of the Department of Water and Sanitation, I hereby under delegated authority in terms of item 6 (1) of Schedule 3 to the Act limit the taking of water from the Caledon-Modder subsystem by all users as follows:

- a) 20% restriction on water use for Domestic and Industrial supply to the Mangaung Metropolitan Supply area (including other small towns supplied from Caledon-Modder subsystem), and the towns of Ladybrand within the Mantsopa Municipality and Ficksburg within the Setsoto Municipality as well as Fouriesburg within the Dihlabeng Municipality.
- b) 35% restrictions on the use of water for Irrigation purposes in the Modder River subcatchment upstream of Maselspoort Dam.
- c) 35% restrictions on the use of water for Irrigation purposes in the Caledon and Little Caledon River sub-catchment upstream of Welbedacht Dam.
- d) 100% restriction on the use of water for Irrigation purposes in the Caledon and Little Caledon River sub-catchment upstream of Welbedacht Dam when water is released from the Lesotho Highlands Water Project.

The limitations apply from the date of this notice until further notice.

In exercising the powers, I have given preference to the maintenance of the Reserve, treated all water users on a basis that is fair and reasonable, considered the actual extent of the water shortage, the likely effects of the shortage on the water users, the strategic importance of any water use and any water rationing or water use limitations by a water services institution having jurisdiction in the area concerned under the Water Services Act 108 of 1997.

Placing limitation on the taking of water use as set out in this notice is an administrative action affecting the rights of the public as contemplated in section 4 of the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act 3 of 2000 (PAJA). After I have taken into consideration all relevant factors, including those referred in section 4 (4) (b), I have decided that it is reasonable and justifiable in the circumstances to depart from the requirements referred to in section 4 (1) (a) to (e), (2) and (3) and instituted this limitation without allowing the water users affected and other role players to comment on the matter before I institute the limitation.

This notice overrides any other previous authorization on water restrictions issued by the Department relating to this area.

GUIDELINE FOR THE SUBMISSION OF CREDIT INFORMATION IN TERMS OF REGULATION 19(13) OF THE NATIONAL CREDIT ACT, 34 OF 2005, AS AMENDED

PURPOSE OF THE GUIDELINE: This Guideline prescribes the manner and form in which a credit or data provider must submit credit information to a credit bureau:

1. Definitions pursuant to Regulation 19(13)

[Unless otherwise herein defined, definitions of terms are as set out in the Act.]

"Act" means the National Credit Act, 34 of 2005, and its Regulations, as amended;

"assessment" for purpose of this Guideline, means the assessment undertaken by SACRRA to determine the on-boarding timetable applicable to a credit or data provider in accordance with the data format development and volume of credit information to be submitted by such credit or data provider to the credit bureaux;

"credit bureaus" means those credit bureaux that have been authorised in writing by the National Credit Regulator to receive, host and return credit information to any party requesting it for a permitted purpose or a purpose contemplated in the Act;

"credit information" means "consumer credit information" as defined in Section 70(1) of the Act, and includes payment profile information:

"data format" means the data specification prescribed by the National Credit Regulator in terms of this Guideline, attached as Annexure A hereto, and which may be updated by the National Credit Regulator from time to time. The data format specifies the data fields that must be completed when credit information is reported to the credit bureaux;

"data provider" means any source of information as set out in Regulation 18(7)(b) - (c) and 18(7)(e) - (f) that may provide credit information to the credit bureaux;

"Data Transmission Hub" means the encrypted data transfer interface managed by SACRRA through which credit information is submitted to the credit bureaux:

"Guideline" means this Guideline issued in terms of Regulation 19(13) of the Act, and which is binding on all credit providers, data providers and credit bureaux;

"payment profile information" means the payment history and financial information relating to a debt or credit transaction, including relevant payment dates, both negative and positive information and/or signs depicting action taken in respect of such debt or credit transaction:

"on-boarding" means the process whereby credit information is recorded in the data format and processed in a manner that enables it to be transmitted via the Data Transmission Hub to the credit bureaux; and

"SACRRA" means the South African Credit and Risk Reporting Association.

Any reference to hours or days in this Guideline shall mean hours in a business day, or business days, respectively.

2. Reporting of credit information by credit providers

- 2.1. Credit information must be reported by credit providers to credit bureaux.
- 2.2. The National Credit Regulator shall publish on its website the names of the credit bureaux that have been approved to receive, host and return credit information in terms of this Guideline.
- 2.3 No credit or data provider shall be required or compelled to become a member of SACRRA by reason of the National Credit Regulator prescribing the usage of the Data Transmission Hub and data layout managed by SACRRA as the manner and form of reporting credit information to credit bureaux.
- 2.4 The National Credit Regulator will from time to time publish the fees payable to cover the costs of the manner and form of reporting credit information, which includes the assessment, on-boarding, operation, usage and reporting in terms of the Data Transmission Hub, as well as the maintenance and development of the data format.
- 2.5 The National Credit Regulator will amend the Conditions of Registration in respect of its registrants to include the requirements of these Guidelines and any subsequent Guideline issued in terms of Regulation 19 (13), and will issue such amended Conditions of Registration when prescribing the fees to be paid, together with the implementation time-lines, in the proposed subsequent Guideline.

3. The form and manner of reporting credit information

- 3.1 All credit providers must utilise the Data Transmission Hub for the submission of all credit information in accordance with Annexure A and information pertaining to the removal of adverse information to the credit bureaux.
- 3.2 All credit providers must utilise the data format for purposes of the submission and updating of credit information to the credit
- 3.3 All data providers that access the payment profile information of a consumer for a permitted or prescribed purpose as provided for in the Act must:

- 3.3.1 provide all relevant credit information in respect of consumers to credit bureaux in the same manner and form as credit providers in order to receive payment profile information from a credit bureau in respect of any consumer;
- 3.3.2 ensure that they comply with all the requirements set out in the Act for loading credit information onto the credit bureaux:
- 3.3.3 utilise the Data Transmission Hub for the submission of credit information to the credit bureaux and in doing so, must use the data format for purposes of such submission; and
- 3.3.4 pay any fees that are prescribed for the onboarding, usage and maintenance of the Data Transmission Hub.
- 3.4 Failure by a data provider to comply with Clause 3 of this Guideline will result in access to payment profile information being denied to such data provider, by the credit bureaux.
- 3.5 All credit providers and data providers currently providing credit information to the credit bureaux via the Data Transmission Hub, including all SACRRA members who provide credit information to credit bureaux, must continue, or immediately commence with the on-boarding process, to provide credit information to the credit bureaux in the manner and form prescribed in 3.1 and 3.2 above.
 - Provided that such credit providers, data providers and credit bureaux retain their membership of SACRRA, no fees other than annual SACRRA membership fees will be levied or payable for the use or maintenance of the Data Transmission Hub until 2019 at which time new fees for all will be prescribed.
- 3.6 All credit providers and data providers not included in 3.5 above, including all non-SACCRA members must:
 - 3.6.1 Undergo an assessment as a provider of credit information by SACRRA, between 1st July and 1st November 2017, at the commencement of which they must pay a once-off assessment fee of R500;
 - 3.6.2 In January 2018, pay a once-off fee to be published in December 2017 to cover the costs of on-boarding;
 - 3.6.3 Ensure that all fees are paid within 30 days of invoice in respect thereof.
- 3.7 Fees to be payable annually for the usage and maintenance of the Data Transmission Hub, data format and reporting to the NCR in terms thereof, will be stipulated by category of credit provider and/or data provider and will be payable in accordance with the on-boarding timetable over a period of three years as determined in a subsequent Guideline, with credit providers in categories 1-5 and all data providers to be on-boarded in 2018.
- 3.8 At the same time as the fees are published annually, a date for commencement of submission of credit information will be prescribed for such credit and data providers.
- 3.9 Credit provider categories are detailed in Table A of the Act, as amended by Government Gazette of 11 May 2016.
- 3.10 Data provider categories will be determined by SACRRA during the registration process.
- 3.11 SACRRA will monitor the quality of the credit information reported by all credit providers and data providers and report any data quality problems to the National Credit Regulator at agreed intervals for appropriate regulatory action to be taken to address those issues.

4. Timeframes for reporting credit information

A credit provider must report credit information to the credit bureaux in the following manner and timeframes:-

- 4.1 The details of all new credit agreements entered into with consumers within 48 (forty-eight) hours of the credit agreements being concluded;
- 4.2 The details of all closed, terminated, rescinded or settled credit agreements within 48 (forty-eight) hours of the credit agreements being closed, terminated or settled;
- 4.3 The monthly payment profile information of consumers within 5 (five) business days of the agreed billing cycle;
- 4.4 Subject to the provisions of Regulation 19 (4) and Regulation 19 (7), the adverse classifications of consumer behaviour and adverse classifications of enforcement actions on a monthly basis; and
- 4.5 The submission of all adverse information and judgment debts as set out in S71A (1) (a) to (d) of the Act within 7 (seven) days of such settlement by the consumer.
