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HIGH ALERT: SCAM WARNING!!!

TO ALL SUPPLIERS AND SERVICE PROVIDERS OF THE GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS

It has come to the attention of the GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS that there are certain unscrupulous companies and individuals who are defrauding unsuspecting businesses disguised as representatives of the Government Printing Works (GPW).

The scam involves the fraudsters using the letterhead of *GPW* to send out fake tender bids to companies and requests to supply equipment and goods.

Although the contact person's name on the letter may be of an existing official, the contact details on the letter are not the same as the *Government Printing Works*'. When searching on the Internet for the address of the company that has sent the fake tender document, the address does not exist.

The banking details are in a private name and not company name. Government will never ask you to deposit any funds for any business transaction. *GPW* has alerted the relevant law enforcement authorities to investigate this scam to protect legitimate businesses as well as the name of the organisation.

Example of e-mails these fraudsters are using:

PROCUREMENT@GPW-GOV.ORG

Should you suspect that you are a victim of a scam, you must urgently contact the police and inform the *GPW*.

GPW has an official email with the domain as @gpw.gov.za

Government e-mails DO NOT have org in their e-mail addresses. All of these fraudsters also use the same or very similar telephone numbers. Although such number with an area code 012 looks like a landline, it is not fixed to any property.

GPW will never send you an e-mail asking you to supply equipment and goods without a purchase/order number. GPW does not procure goods for another level of Government. The organisation will not be liable for actions that result in companies or individuals being resultant victims of such a scam.

Government Printing Works gives businesses the opportunity to supply goods and services through RFQ / Tendering process. In order to be eligible to bid to provide goods and services, suppliers must be registered on the National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD). To be registered, they must meet all current legislative requirements (e.g. have a valid tax clearance certificate and be in good standing with the South African Revenue Services - SARS).

The tender process is managed through the Supply Chain Management (SCM) system of the department. SCM is highly regulated to minimise the risk of fraud, and to meet objectives which include value for money, open and effective competition, equitability, accountability, fair dealing, transparency and an ethical approach. Relevant legislation, regulations, policies, guidelines and instructions can be found on the tender's website.

Fake Tenders

National Treasury's CSD has launched the Government Order Scam campaign to combat fraudulent requests for quotes (RFQs). Such fraudulent requests have resulted in innocent companies losing money. We work hard at preventing and fighting fraud, but criminal activity is always a risk.

How tender scams work

There are many types of tender scams. Here are some of the more frequent scenarios:

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to a company to invite it to urgently supply goods. Shortly after the company has submitted its quote, it receives notification that it has won the tender. The company delivers the goods to someone who poses as an official or at a fake site. The Department has no idea of this transaction made in its name. The company is then never paid and suffers a loss.

OB

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to Company A to invite it to urgently supply goods. Typically, the tender specification is so unique that only Company B (a fictitious company created by the fraudster) can supply the goods in question.

Shortly after Company A has submitted its quote it receives notification that it has won the tender. Company A orders the goods and pays a deposit to the fictitious Company B. Once Company B receives the money, it disappears. Company A's money is stolen in the process.

Protect yourself from being scammed

- If you are registered on the supplier databases and you receive a request to tender or quote that seems to be from a government department, contact the department to confirm that the request is legitimate. Do not use the contact details on the tender document as these might be fraudulent.
- Compare tender details with those that appear in the Tender Bulletin, available online at www.gpwonline.co.za
- Make sure you familiarise yourself with how government procures goods and services. Visit the tender website for more information on how to tender.
- If you are uncomfortable about the request received, consider visiting the government department and/or the place of delivery and/or the service provider from whom you will be sourcing the goods.
- In the unlikely event that you are asked for a deposit to make a bid, contact the SCM unit of the department in question to ask whether this is in fact correct.

EXTRAORDINARY GAZETTES

3. Extraordinary Gazettes can have only one publication date. If multiple publications of an Extraordinary Gazette are required, a separate Z95/Z95Prov Adobe Forms for each publication date must be submitted.

Notice Submission Process

- 4. Download the latest *Adobe* form, for the relevant notice to be placed, from the **Government Printing Works** website www.gpwonline.co.za.
- 5. The Adobe form needs to be completed electronically using Adobe Acrobat / Acrobat Reader. Only electronically completed Adobe forms will be accepted. No printed, handwritten and/or scanned Adobe forms will be accepted.
- 6. The completed electronic *Adobe* form has to be submitted via email to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za. The form needs to be submitted in its original electronic *Adobe* format to enable the system to extract the completed information from the form for placement in the publication.
- Every notice submitted must be accompanied by an official GPW quotation. This must be obtained from the eGazette Contact Centre.
- 8. Each notice submission should be sent as a single email. The email **must** contain **all documentation** relating to a particular notice submission.
 - 8.1. Each of the following documents must be attached to the email as a separate attachment:
 - 8.1.1. An electronically completed Adobe form, specific to the type of notice that is to be placed.
 - 8.1.1.1. For National *Government Gazette* or *Provincial Gazette* notices, the notices must be accompanied by an electronic Z95 or Z95Prov *Adobe* form
 - 8.1.1.2. The notice content (body copy) **MUST** be a separate attachment.
 - 8.1.2. A copy of the official **Government Printing Works** quotation you received for your notice. (Please see Quotation section below for further details)
 - 8.1.3. A valid and legible Proof of Payment / Purchase Order: **Government Printing Works** account customer must include a copy of their Purchase Order. **Non-Government Printing Works** account customer needs to submit the proof of payment for the notice
 - 8.1.4. Where separate notice content is applicable (Z95, Z95 Prov and TForm 3, it should **also** be attached as a separate attachment. (*Please see the Copy Section below, for the specifications*).
 - 8.1.5. Any additional notice information if applicable.

- 9. The electronic *Adobe* form will be taken as the primary source for the notice information to be published. Instructions that are on the email body or covering letter that contradicts the notice form content will not be considered. The information submitted on the electronic *Adobe* form will be published as-is.
- To avoid duplicated publication of the same notice and double billing, Please submit your notice ONLY ONCE.
- 11. Notices brought to **GPW** by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in *Adobe* electronic form format. All "walk-in" customers with notices that are not on electronic *Adobe* forms will be routed to the Contact Centre where they will be assisted to complete the forms in the required format.
- 12. Should a customer submit a bulk submission of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of any organisation e.g. newspaper publisher, the messenger will be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.

QUOTATIONS

- 13. Quotations are valid until the next tariff change.
 - 13.1. Take note: GPW's annual tariff increase takes place on 1 April therefore any quotations issued, accepted and submitted for publication up to 31 March will keep the old tariff. For notices to be published from 1 April, a quotation must be obtained from GPW with the new tariffs. Where a tariff increase is implemented during the year, GPW endeavours to provide customers with 30 days' notice of such changes.
- 14. Each quotation has a unique number.
- 15. Form Content notices must be emailed to the *eGazette* Contact Centre for a quotation.
 - 15.1. The *Adobe* form supplied is uploaded by the Contact Centre Agent and the system automatically calculates the cost of your notice based on the layout/format of the content supplied.
 - 15.2. It is critical that these *Adobe* Forms are completed correctly and adhere to the guidelines as stipulated by **GPW**.

16. APPLICABLE ONLY TO GPW ACCOUNT HOLDERS:

- 16.1. GPW Account Customers must provide a valid GPW account number to obtain a quotation.
- 16.2. Accounts for GPW account customers must be active with sufficient credit to transact with GPW to submit notices.
 - 16.2.1. If you are unsure about or need to resolve the status of your account, please contact the GPW Finance Department prior to submitting your notices. (If the account status is not resolved prior to submission of your notice, the notice will be failed during the process).

17. APPLICABLE ONLY TO CASH CUSTOMERS:

- 17.1. Cash customers doing **bulk payments** must use a **single email address** in order to use the **same proof of payment** for submitting multiple notices.
- 18. The responsibility lies with you, the customer, to ensure that the payment made for your notice(s) to be published is sufficient to cover the cost of the notice(s).
- 19. Each quotation will be associated with one proof of payment / purchase order / cash receipt.
 - 19.1. This means that the quotation number can only be used once to make a payment.

COPY (SEPARATE NOTICE CONTENT DOCUMENT)

- 20. Where the copy is part of a separate attachment document for Z95, Z95Prov and TForm03
 - 20.1. Copy of notices must be supplied in a separate document and may not constitute part of any covering letter, purchase order, proof of payment or other attached documents.

The content document should contain only one notice. (You may include the different translations of the same notice in the same document).

20.2. The notice should be set on an A4 page, with margins and fonts set as follows:

Page size = A4 Portrait with page margins: Top = 40mm, LH/RH = 16mm, Bottom = 40mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

Page size = A4 Landscape with page margins: Top = 16mm, LH/RH = 40mm, Bottom = 16mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

CANCELLATIONS

- 21. Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above in point 2. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette. Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.
- 22. Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES

23. With effect from 01 October 2015, **GPW** will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed according to the deadline and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

REJECTIONS

- 24. All notices not meeting the submission rules will be rejected to the customer to be corrected and resubmitted. Assistance will be available through the Contact Centre should help be required when completing the forms. (012-748 6200 or email info.egazette@gpw.gov.za). Reasons for rejections include the following:
 - 24.1. Incorrectly completed forms and notices submitted in the wrong format, will be rejected.
 - 24.2. Any notice submissions not on the correct Adobe electronic form, will be rejected.
 - 24.3. Any notice submissions not accompanied by the proof of payment / purchase order will be rejected and the notice will not be processed.
 - 24.4. Any submissions or re-submissions that miss the submission cut-off times will be rejected to the customer. The Notice needs to be re-submitted with a new publication date.

APPROVAL OF NOTICES

- 25. Any notices other than legal notices are subject to the approval of the Government Printer, who may refuse acceptance or further publication of any notice.
- 26. No amendments will be accepted in respect to separate notice content that was sent with a Z95 or Z95Prov notice submissions. The copy of notice in layout format (previously known as proof-out) is only provided where requested, for Advertiser to see the notice in final Gazette layout. Should they find that the information submitted was incorrect, they should request for a notice cancellation and resubmit the corrected notice, subject to standard submission deadlines. The cancellation is also subject to the stages in the publishing process, i.e. If cancellation is received when production (printing process) has commenced, then the notice cannot be cancelled.

- (a) establish the continuation of the statutory measure as set out in the Schedule hereto; and
- (b) determine the guideline price for soybeans as R7519.05 per metric ton.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

- In this Schedule any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall have that meaning, and unless the context otherwise indicates
 - "producer" means a person who produces soybeans or a person on whose behalf soybeans are produced;
 - "soybeans" means grain of the species Glycine max;
 - "the Act" means the Marketing of Agricultural Products Act, 1996 (Act No. 47 of 1996); and
 - "SACTA" means the South African Cultivar and Technology Agency NPC.

Purpose and aim of statutory measure and the relation thereof to the objectives of the Act

 The purpose and aim of this statutory measure are to compensate breeders of soybean varieties for their contribution towards obtaining and utilising improved international agriculture related intellectual property to the benefit of the soybean industry in the Republic of South Africa.

The agricultural sector is expected to ensure food security, strengthen the economy and create job opportunities. This can be reconciled with the provisions of Section 2(3) of the Act. In order to achieve these aims and to further the competitive position of the soybean industry in the Republic of South Africa, it is essential to cultivate high yielding crops from seed varieties that are most suited to particular regions in the country. For the optimisation of possible export earnings, it is imperative for South African commodities to conform to international quality standards, so that South African producers of soybeans can remain competitive in the international markets. The statutory measure shall be administered by the South African Cultivar and Technology Agency NPC (SACTA). The levies collected will be administered in a separate account with respect to soybeans and SACTA will be audited annually in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices.

A portion of the funds collected by means of the levy will be focussed on small-scale farmers and transformation in the soybean industry in the Republic of South Africa. SACTA shall allocate 20% of the levy proceeds to transformation initiatives in the grain industries, by means of service providers of its choice, and report back to the National Agricultural Marketing Council (NAMC) annually with regard thereto.

Product to which statutory measure applies

This statutory measure shall apply to soybeans.

Area in which statutory measure applies

 This statutory measure shall apply within the geographical area of the Republic of South Africa.

Imposition of levy

- A levy is hereby imposed on soybeans
 - (a) sold by or on behalf of the producer thereof;

- (b) processed or converted or caused to be processed or converted into a soybean product, by or on behalf of the producer thereof, if the soybean product is intended to be disposed of;
- (c) in respect of which a silo receipt has been issued, if the levy in respect of such soybeans has not already been paid in terms of paragraph (a) or (b); and
- (d) exported from the Republic of South Africa, and in respect of which a levy has not previously been paid in terms of paragraph (a), (b) or (c) above.

Amount of levy

6. The amounts of the levies (excluding Value Added Tax) will be as follows:

Persons by whom levies are payable

- 7. (1) The levy payable in terms of clause 5 shall -
 - in the case of a levy contemplated in clause 5(a), be payable by the buyer of the soybeans;
 - (b) in the case of a levy contemplated in clause 5(b), be payable by the processor or converter of the soybeans;
 - (c) in the case of a levy contemplated in clause 5(c), be payable by the person issuing such silo receipt; and
 - (d) in the case of the levy contemplated in clause 5(d), be payable by the exporter of the soybeans.
 - (2) The amount of the levy payable by the buyer, processor or converter in terms of sub-clauses (1)(a) and (1)(b) above may be recovered from the producer.
 - (3) The amount of the levy payable by the person issuing the silo receipt in terms of sub-clause 1(c) above may be recovered from the person to whom such silo receipt is issued.
 - (4) The persons contemplated in sub-clauses (1)(a), (1)(b) and (1)(c), who have paid the levy to SACTA and have conformed to the provisions of this statutory measure, may claim from SACTA an amount equal to 2,5% of the levies paid by them, in accordance with the conditions set by SACTA from time to time.

Payment of levy

8. (1) Payment of a levy imposed in terms of clause 5 shall be made by the persons contemplated in clause 7 not later than the last day of the month following the month in which the soybeans have been sold, delivered for sale, processed, converted, exported or a silo receipt issued in respect thereof.

- (2) Payment shall be made in favour of the SA Cultivar and Technology Agency NPC, and has to be accompanied by a duly completed levy return form, containing such information pertaining to soybeans as required by SACTA from time to time. If no levy is payable in a particular month, a nil return shall be submitted to SACTA.
- (3) Payment shall -
 - (a) when forwarded by post, be addressed to -

(b) when delivered by hand, be delivered to -

(c) when transferred electronically, be paid into the designated bank account of the SA Cultivar and Technology Agency NPC.

Conditions of approval

- 9. This statutory measure is subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) That 70% of levy income be spent on breeding and technology, at least 20% on transformation, in line with the NAMC's new guidelines, and less than 10% on administration;
 - (b) That levies be accounted for, in a manner and to the extent acceptable to the Auditor General, separately from any other funds or assets under the control of SACTA, and be audited by the Auditor General; and
 - (c) That after the lapsing of the levy, any surplus funds only be utilised after the approval of the Minister was obtained.

Commencement and period of validity

- 10. (1) This statutory measure shall come into operation on 1 March 2023 and shall lapse on 28 February 2025.
 - (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (1), the Minister may, after evaluation and review of the measure under section 9(1)(f) of the Act, by notice in the Government Gazette determine that the measure shall lapse on a date specified in that notice; Provided that such date shall not be later than the date determined under sub-clause (1).

In accordance with the provisions of the Labour Relations Act, 1995, made and entered into by and between the

(a) Association of South African Manufacturers of Luggage, Handbags and General Goods

(Hereinafter referred to as the employers@ or the "employer organization") of the one part, and the

(b) National Union of Leather and Allied Workers (N.U.L.A.W)

and

(c) Southern African Clothing and Textile Workers Union

(Hereinafter referred to as the employees or the trade unions) of the other part, being the parties to the National Bargaining Council of the Leather Industry of South Africa, to amend the Agreement for the General Goods and Handbag Sector, published under Government Notices No. R.1193 of 17 December 2010, R.524 of 24 June 2011, R.1018 of 7 December 2011, R.885 of 2 November 2012, R.771 of 18 October 2013, R.790 of 17 October 2014, R.1044 of 30 October 2015, R.765 of 24 June 2016, R.1280 of 21 October 2016, 758 of 29 September 2017, R.1230 of 16 November 2018, R.1413 of 01 November 2019, R.219 of 18 March 2021, R.453 of 28 May 2021 and R.1588 of 10 December 2021.



1. CLAUSE 1 - SCOPE OF APPLICATION OF AGREEMENT

- (1) The terms of this agreement shall be observed in the General Goods and Handbag Section of the Leather Industry:
 - (a) in the Republic of South Africa,
 - (b) by all employers who are members of the employer organisation, and by all employees who are members of the trade unions who are engaged or employed in the General Goods and Handbag sectors of the Leather Industry respectively.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (1), the terms of this agreement shall apply only to employees for whom wages are prescribed in Annexure C to the agreement, and to the employers of such employees.
- (3) The terms of this agreement shall not apply to non-parties in respect of Clauses 1(1)(b) and 2(1).

2. CLAUSE 2 - DATE AND PERIOD OF OPERATION

- (1) This agreement shall come into operation for the parties on 1 July 2022 and remain in force for the period ending 30 June 2026.
- (2) This agreement shall come into operation for non-parties on such date as the Minister of Employment and Labour extends the agreement to non-parties and shall remain in force for the period ending 30 June 2026.

4. CLAUSE 8 – PUBLIC HOLIDAYS, ANNUAL HOLIDAYS AND MATERNITY LEAVE

The granting of Paternity Leave, Adoption Leave and Commissioning Leave shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Basic Conditions of Employment Act (Act No 75 of 1997 as amended).

4.2 Subclause (11): Family Responsibility Leave

Substitute subclause (11)(2) with the following:

- 2) An employer must grant an employee, during each annual leave cycle, at the request of the employee, three days' paid leave, which the employee is entitled to take-
 - (a) when the employee's child is sick;
 - (b) when the employee's spouse or life partner is sick or
 - (c) in the event of the death of-
 - (i) the employee's spouse or life partner; or
 - (ii) the employee's parent, adoptive parent, grandparent, child, adopted child, grandchild or sibling.

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5. CLAUSE 10 - TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT

Subclause 7: Retirement

Delete subclause (7)(iii)

6. CLAUSE 13 – ORGANISATIONAL RIGHTS

Subclause (4): Shop Stewards Leave

Substitute subclause (4)(i) with the following:

(i) An elected shop steward shall be entitled to six days' paid leave and two day's unpaid leave in a calendar year to attend training courses or any other union business. The granting of paid leave in terms of this sub-clause, shall be limited to one shop steward if there are between 10 and 50 employees for whom trade union subscriptions are being deducted and thereafter one shop steward for every additional 50 employees for whom trade union subscriptions are being deducted.

"Nothing in this agreement shall operate to reduce any time wage at present being paid which is more favourable to an employee than that laid down in this agreement for such employee while he remains in the service of the same employer."

2. PROPORTION AND RATIO OF EMPLOYEES

(6) Handbags -

- (a) Not less than one foreman shall be employed in each establishment.
- (b) The number of learners employed in each *establishment* shall not exceed three such employees to every two qualified employees employed in such *establishment*.
- (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (1), the following departmental ratios shall be observed:
 - (i) Cutting Department Not more than three learner cutters shall be employed to every two qualified cutters employed in each establishment.
 - (ii) Machining Department Not more than three learner machinists shall be employed to every two qualified machinists employed in each establishment.
 - (iii) Handbag framing department Not more than three learners handbag framers shall be employed to every two qualified handbag framers employed in each establishment.


