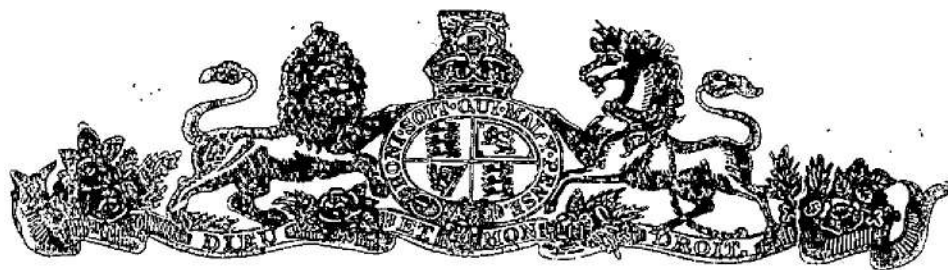

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner.

Whereas it is desirable further to amend Proclamation No. 25 of 1896, as amended by Proclamations No. 4 of 1898, No. 5 of 1898 and No. 19 of 1905, herein after collectively referred to as the Railway Law;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The company authorized by the Railway Law to operate the railway constructed under that law, or any other railway administration operating such railway by agreement with the company, may appoint persons for the purpose of maintaining order and preventing crimes and offences on the railway within the Bechuanaland Protectorate.

2. Any person appointed under section one, shall in the discharge of the duties for which he is appointed be capable of exercising all such powers and shall perform all such functions as may be exercised or performed by a member of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Police of similar rank, and shall be liable in respect of acts done or omitted to be done to the same extent as such member, and shall have the benefit of all the indemnities to which such member would in like circumstances be entitled.

3. The names of all persons appointed under section one shall be communicated to and approved by the Resident Commissioner before they enter upon their duties under this Proclamation.

4. This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Railway Law Amendment Proclamation 1924 and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
