PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Whereas it is desirable further to amend the Swaziland Native Tax Proclamation 1916 (No. 1 of 1916) (hereinafter referred to as the principal law);

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers, authorities and jurisdiction conferred upon and committed to me by His Majesty under the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1903 as amended by the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1906 and the Swaziland Order in Council 1909, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

- 1. Proclamation No. 2 of 1920 shall be and is hereby repealed.
- 2. Section four of the principal law shall be and is hereby amended by the deletion of the proviso thereto beginning with the words "provided that any native".
- 3. Section five of the principal law shall be and is hereby repealed and the following new section substituted therefor:
 - "5. (1) The following persons shall be exempted from any tax mentioned in this Proclamation:
 - Any native whose permanent residence is outside Swaziland but who, since his entrance therein, has been working continuously under a contract of service, or is residing in Swaziland to perform labour therein and produces evidence that he has discharged all liability to pay the current taxes imposed under the law of the Dominion Colony or Territory of his permanent residence;
 - (b) Any native holding a letter of exemption granted under the Coloured Persons' Exemption (or Relief) Proclamation 1901 of the Transvaal or any amendment thereof as in force in Swaziland or a Registration Certificate granted under the Natives' Relief Ordinance 1902 of the Transvaal or any amendment thereof as in force in Swaziland;
 - (c) Any native who satisfies the Assistant Commissioner that he is indigent and is prevented from working by reason of age, chronic disease, or other good cause:
 - Any native who produces to the Assistant Commissioner a certificate from the head of a recognized Christian denomination that he—
 - (i) is an Evangelist, Catechist or Teacher; and
 - (ii) is in the regular and continuous service of such denomination; and
 - (iii) has been so employed at a fixed rate of remuneration, not exceeding twenty-four pounds per annum, during the whole of the year for which the tax is payable; and
 - -(iv) has no other source of income.

- (2) The Assistant Commissioner may exempt from any tax mentioned in this Proclamation:—

 - ax mentioned in this Proclamation:—

 (a) Any native who produces to the Assistant Commissioner a certificate from the principal of any recognized school that he is attending and that he has regularly attended such school during the year for which the tax is payable, and has made satisfactory progress in his studies; and

 (b) Any native who satisfies the Assistant Commissioner that during the year for which the tax is payable he is undergoing at a recognized educational institution a course of instruction or training which is approved by the Resident Commissioner and is of such a nature as may be calculated to qualify such native to assist in the advancement or to contribute to the welfare of the inhabitants of Swaziland; provided that in each case the native is able to satisfy the Assistant Commissioner that he could not pay the tax without interfering with such course of instruction or training."

Whereas it is desirable to make further provision out of the public revenue and other funds of Swaziland to meet certain additional expenditure incurred during the financial year ended on the 31st day of March, 1933.

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers authorities and jurisdiction conferred upon and committed to me by His Majesty under the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1903 as amended by the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1906 and the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1909, I do hereby declare proclaim and make known as follows:

1. The public revenue and other funds of Swaziland are hereby charged with a further sum of £9,010. 15s. 9d. (nine thousand and ten pounds fifteen shillings and nine pence) to meet expenditure incurred during the financial year which ended on the 31st day of March, 1933, in excess of the amounts appropriated for the service of that year, according to the particulars set forth in the Schedule to this Proclamation.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Swaziland Additional Appropriation (1932-33) Proclamation 1934 and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the Gazette.

REGULATIONS FRAMED UNDER SECTION SEVEN-TEEN (1) AND (2) OF THE PROCLAMATION.

IDENTIFICATION-CLEARANCE CERTIFICATES.

40. On and after the 1st June, 1934, the issuer of licences shall, when issuing a licence in respect of a motor car, provide the licensee, in addition to other papers in these regulations referred to, with a certificate in the form prescribed herein. The certificate shall be printed on a card of suitable thickness thickness.

41. The certificate shall be attached to and carried on the motor car at all times when such vehicle is on a public road, and, subject as herein provided, in a holder in compliance with the specification herein described.

The holder must be of metal and of weatherproof construc-on. It must be circular and conforming to the following dimensions:

Tray.—The certificate should fit neatly into a sheet-metal tray of suitable thickness, having a turned-up edge of sufficient depth to hold the card and a stout cover glass.

Ring Cover.—A circular ring of sheet-metal shaped to fit down closely on the tray and adapted for fixing by screws, bolts, or otherwise to the vehicle in the prescribed position.

A rubber packing-ring should be arranged to fit between the ring-cover and the cover glass and tray so as to render the whole carrier weatherproof.

Dimensions.—The aperture within the ring-cover should clearly exhibit the whole of the certificate lying within the inner circle of the certificate, and should have a diameter of $2^{11}/_{16}$ inches.

42. The certificate shall be carried—

42. The certificate shall be carried—
(a) in the case of motor cycles, in a position conspicuous from the near side of such motor cycle;
(b) in the case of motor cars, on the near side of the vehicle, facing towards the near side of the road and not less than two feet six inches nor more than six feet six inches from the ground level between two parallel lines, the first drawn vertically through the rearmost part of the driving seat or cab (or, where no such fitting exists, the footplate), and the second drawn vertically six inches in front of the base of the front glass windscreen where fitted or, where no such windscreen is fitted, through a point four feet forward of the first line. of the first line.

Provided that in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front glass windscreen extending across the vehicle to the near side, the certificate may be carried facing forwards on the near (left) lower corner of the glass of such windscreen, or within 2 inches of the glass, either in front or behind it and so as to be visible through the glass in front. In the event of the certificate being carried actually upon a glass portion of the vehicle and otherwise complying with this regulation, the obligation that it shall be carried in a metal holder with a clear glass front shall not be enforced if it is so carried as to be weatherproof. be weatherproof.

The certificate shall be placed and carried so as to be clearly visible at all times by daylight to a person standing to the near side of the vehicle, whether such vehicle is moving or stationary.

43. In cases where the issuer of licences is satisfied that a certificate issued under the provisions of regulation No. 40 has been lost or destroyed, he may issue a duplicate certificate which shall be endorsed with the word "duplicate" and for which a fee of 1s, will be charged.

44. The owner of a motor car who sells or otherwise disposes thereof shall, when notifying an issuer of licences in terms of sub-section (5) of section two of the Proclamation of such sale or disposal, at the same time forward to such issuer of licences the clearance certificate issued in respect of such vehicle.

45. A clearance certificate shall not be used on any motor car other than that in respect of which such certificate was issued, and no person shall deface or alter in any manner any certificate.
