PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Whereas it is necessary to fix the rates of normal tax and super tax to be levied in Swaziland in respect of the twelve months ended on the thirtieth day of June, 1934, and to amend in certain respects the Swaziland Income Tax Proclamation No. 31 of 1921 which as subsequently amended is hereinafter referred to as the principal law;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers, authorities and jurisdiction conferred upon and committed to me by His Majesty under the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1903, as amended by the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1906 and the Swaziland Order-in-Council 1909, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

- 1. In terms of sub-section (3) of section four of the principal law there shall be levied in respect of every taxable income (as therein defined) received by or accrued to or in favour of any person during the twelve months ended on the thirtieth day of June, 1934, an income tax at the rates specified in section four of the Swaziland Income Tax Further Amendment Proclamation, 1922.
- Proclamation, 1922.

 2. In terms of sub-section (4) of section one of the Swaziland Income Tax (Super Tax) Proclamation 1930 there shall be levied in respect of every income subject to super tax received by or accrued to or in favour of any person other than a public company during the twelve months ended on the thirtieth day of June 1934 a super tax at the rates specified in section six of the Swaziland Income Tax (Super Tax) Proclamation 1930.
- 3. Paragraph (a) of sub-section (2) of section six of the principal law, as amended by the Swaziland Income Tax Further Amendment Proclamation 1922, the Swaziland Income Tax Proclamation 1926 and the Swaziland Income Tax Proclamation 1932 shall be and is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—
 - "(a) A sum of four hundred pounds."
- 4. This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as the Swaziland Income Tax Proclamation, 1934, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the Gazette; provided that the amendment to the principal law shall first take effect in respect of assessments made for the year of assessment ender on the 30th June, 1934.

PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Administration of Estates Proclamation 1933 (No. 33 of 1933), hereinafter referred to as the principal law:

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

- 1. The Fourth Schedule to the principal law shall be and is hereby repealed and the following Schedule of Tariff of Fees substituted therefor:—
 - (1) On all estates of deceased persons or estates under curatorship (except estates under the charge of a curator bonis pending the appointment of an executor) the gross value of which—
 - (a) exceeds £100, but does not exceed £400 ... £1 0 0
 - (b) exceeds £400, for every £100 or part thereof 0 5 0 subject to a maximum fee to be affixed to the liquidation account 10 0 0
 - (c) does not exceed £100 where administration takes place, a fee in the discretion of the Master, not exceeding 1 0 0 to be affixed to the inventory.

Where the deceased is one of two spouses married in community of property, the above fees shall be assessed upon one-half of the gross assets of such community.

- (2) The following fees shall be payable by means of revenue stamps in respect of the documents or services mentioned—
 - (a) for Letters of Administration, or Letters of Confirmation, as Executors Testamentary, assumed or dative, or Certificates of appointment as curator bonis, each ...
 - (b) for every edict including costs of publication in the Gazette
 - (c) for attending any meeting of next-of-kin, legatees or creditors, whether by the Master or Resident Magistrate

 - (e) for the Master's report, a fee in the discretion of the Master from
 - (f) for extracts or copies of documents made or certified in the office of the Master for the first hundred words for each subsequent one hundred words

(l) upon all unclaimed moneys paid into the hands of the Master, pursuant to section ninety-two of this Proclamation or for account of absent or unknown creditors of any estate or for account of absent or unknown creditors 5 per cent.

2. Schedule 2, II (a) of Act No. 20 of 1884 of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope as of force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate is hereby repealed.

3. - 2. Section seven of the said Proclamation shall be and is hereby amended by the deletion of paragraph (a) of sub-section (2) thereof and the substitution therefor of the following new paragraph:
 - "(a) The sum of four hundred pounds."
- 3. This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Income Tax Proclamation 1934 and shall have force as from the first day of July 1934; provided that the amendments to the said Proclamation contained in this Proclamation shall first take effect in respect of assessments made for the year of assessment ended the thirtieth day of June 1934.
