DEATH OF HIS MAJESTY KING GEORGE THE FIFTH.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT

begs to announce that he has received with the most profound regret the following telegram from the Private Secretary to the King dated London 21st January, 1936.

Begins. Profoundly regret to state that His Majesty King George the Fifth passed away just before midnight. Please inform Prime Minister. Ends.

His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, has despatched the following telegram to the Private Secretary to the King.

Begins. With reference to your telegram of to-day, I have received following Minute from my Ministers:

Begins. Ministers have the honour to inform His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government that it is with sincere and profound regret that they have this day received the sad intelligence of the demise of His Majesty King George the Fifth. The sad tidings have been received throughout the Union of South Africa with the deepest regret. On behalf of themselves and the People of the Union, Ministers desire to express their sincere and heartfelt sympathy with the members of the Royal Family, and especially Queen Mary, in their great sorrow. Ends.

I desire most profoundly to associate myself with the sentiments which they have expressed. End of telegram.

Owing to the death of His Majesty, King George V, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government has been pleased, under the provisions of Section 3 of Act No. 3 of 1910, to appoint Wednesday, the 22nd day of January, 1936, to be observed as a day of mourning throughout the Union.

Begin. Moet met diepe leedwese meedeel dat Sy Majesteit Koning George die Vyfde kort voor middernag oorlede is. Geliewe die Eerste Minister in kennis te stel. End.

Sy Eksellensie die Amptenaar belas met die uitoefening van die Uitvoerende Gesag het die volgende telegram aan die Privaat Sekretaris van die Koning gestuur.

Begin. Met betrekking tot u telegram van vandag het ek die volgende diensbrief van my Ministers ontvang:

Begin. Ministers het die eer om aan Sy Eksellensie die Amptenaar belas met die Uitoefening van die Uitvoerende Gesag mee te deel dat hulle met innige en diepgevoelde leedwese vandag die treurige tyding ontvang het van die afsterwe van Sy Majesteit Koning George die Vyfde. Die treurige berig is deur die hele Unie van Suid-Afrika ontvang met die innigste ontroering. Namens hulle self en die Volk van die Unie wens Ministers uiting te gee aan hul opregte en hartelike deelneming met die lede van die Koninklike Huis en veral met Koningin Mary, in die sware slag wat hulle getref het. End.

Ek wens van harte om myself te vereenselwig met die gevoelens deur hulle geuit. End van telegram.
