

Owing to the funeral of His late Majesty King George V, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government has been pleased, under the provisions of Section *three* of Act No. 3 of 1910, to appoint Tuesday, the 28th day of January, 1936, to be observed as a day of public mourning throughout the Union.

His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government begs to announce that he has received the following telegram from His Majesty the King :—Begins. My mother and I send our heartfelt thanks to the Government and people of the Union of South Africa for their sympathy with us and our family in our great grief. It is a comfort to us to know that we have their kind thoughts at this sad time. Ends.
