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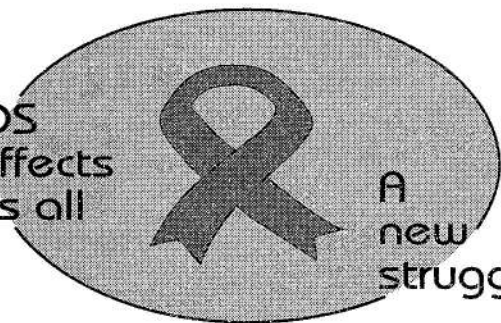

SGB INFORMATION

As a necessary step in the development and implementation of the National Qualifications Framework, The National Standards Bodies are briefed [regulation 19(1)(c) of 28 March 1998] to recognise or establish Standards Generating Bodies (SGBs).

SGBs shall:

- a. generate standards and qualifications in accordance with the Authority requirements in identified sub-fields and levels;
- b. update and review standards;
- c. recommend standards and qualifications to National Standards Bodies;
- d. recommend criteria for the registration of assessors and moderators or moderating bodies; and

- e. perform such other functions as may from time-to-time be delegated by its National Standards Body.

Any bodies wishing to nominate representatives, make application to serve on, or make any other submission with regard to the above SGB should note the following information.

SGBs should be composed of organisations, which shall be key education and training stakeholder interest groups and experts in the sub-field. The NSB, when making its final decisions will have due regard for, among other things, *'the need for representativeness and equity, redress and relevant expertise in terms of the work of the SGBs.'*

Organisations proposing to nominate persons to SGBs should be sensitive to the need for **equity** and **redress**, and shall nominate persons who-

- (a) will be able to consider issues of productivity, fairness, public interest and international comparability as related to education and training in the sub-field;
- (b) enjoy credibility in the sub-field in question, who enjoy respect; have the necessary expertise and experience in the sub-field and have the support or backing of the nominating body;
- (c) are able to advocate and mediate the needs and interests of all levels within the sub-field covered by the Standards Generating Body;
- (d) are able to exercise critical judgement at a high level; and
- (e) are committed to a communication process between the Standards Generating Body, the National Standards Body and the Constituency.

**PUBLIC NOTICE BY NSB 05, EDUCATION, TRAINING AND
DEVELOPMENT, OF THE INTENTION TO REGISTER AN SGB
FOR ASSESSOR STANDARDS**

NSB 05 has decided to establish and register an SGB for Assessor Standards. The core learning assessor standards which the SGB develops would comprise the generic competencies required for the practice of assessment across the twelve organising fields of the National Qualifications Framework (NQF), and could be incorporated, along with fundamental and elective learning components, within field-specific qualifications.

PROPOSED BRIEF OF THE SGB

1. Collate the various assessor standards that have been developed across the twelve organising fields to identify the generic competencies embedded within them [*Regulation 24(1)(e)*].
2. Investigate the appropriate NQF levels at which standards for assessors might be generated [*Regulation 24(1)(e)*].
3. Generate standards for assessors at the appropriate NQF levels, as in 2 above, with reference to the core competencies embedded within the assessor standards in 1, above, and based upon additional knowledge of best assessment practice which the SGB brings to the task [*Regulation 24(1)(a)*]. These standards will be generated in the areas of:
 - Assessment design
 - Assessment planning
 - Assessment implementation
 - Assessment review
 - Assessment recording
 - Assessment moderation
4. Liase with all other SGBs in the field in the generation of standards [*Regulation 24(1)(a) & (e)*].
5. Recommend the standards generated in 3 above to the Quality Assurance Division of SAQA for consideration towards the development of criteria for the registration of assessors [*Regulation 24(1)(e)*].
6. Recommend the standards generated in 3, above, to the NSB [*Regulation 24(1)(c)*].

7. Recommend criteria for the registration of assessors and moderators or moderating bodies [Regulation 24(1)(d)] whose development is informed by the standards generated in 3, above.
8. Accept and perform other assessor SGB-related functions as requested by the NSB [Regulation 24(1)(e)].

Consult on a regular basis with the inter-liaison committee, which consists of representatives from the proposed SGB for Traffic, Traffic-related and Local Government Law Enforcement and the proposed SGB for Crime Prevention, and with all other SGBs in the sub-field Safety in Society (*Regulation 24(1)(e)*).
