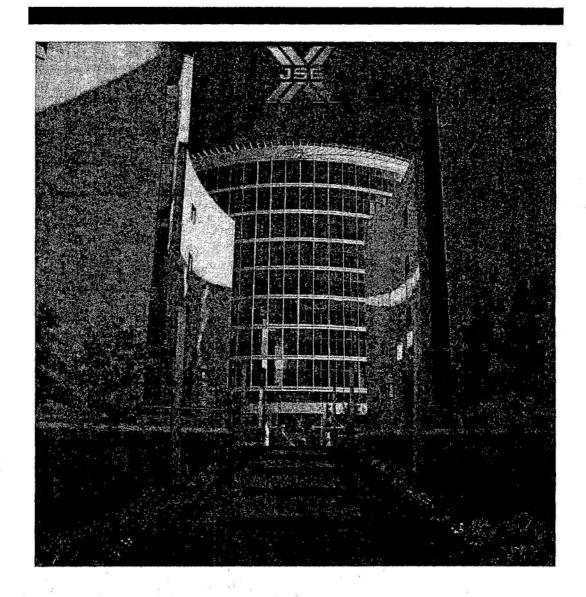

1, Preamble

This manual has been compiled in accordance with the Promotion of Access to Information Act, 2000 ("Act"). The preamble to the Act, which is self explanatory, is set out below:

"ACT

To give effect to the constitutional right of access to any information held by the State and any information that is held by another person and that is required for the exercise or protection of any rights, and to provide for matters connected therewith.

RECOGNISING THAT-

the system of government in South Africa before 27 April 1994, amongst others, resulted in a secretive and unresponsive culture in public and private bodies which often led to an abuse of power and human rights violations;

section 8 of the Constitution provides for the horizontal application of the rights in the Bill of Rights to juristic persons to the extent required by the nature of the rights and the nature of those juristic persons;

section 32(1)(a) of the Constitution provides that everyone has the right of access to any information held by the State;

section 32(1)(b) of the Constitution provides for the horizontal application of the right of access to information held by another person to everyone when that information is required for the exercise or protection of any rights; and

national legislation must be enacted to give effect to this right in section 32 of the Constitution.

AND BEARING IN MIND THAT -

the State must respect, protect, promote and fulfil, at least, all the rights in the Bill of Rights which is the cornerstone of democracy in South Africa;

the right of access to any information held by a public or private body may be limited to the extent that the limitations are reasonable and justifiable in an open and democratic society based on human dignity, equality and freedom as contemplated in section 36 of the Constitution; and

reasonable legislative measures may, in terms of section 32(2) of the Constitution, be provided to alleviate the administrative and financial burden on the State in giving effect to its obligation to promote and fulfil the rights of access to information.

AND IN ORDER TO -

foster a culture of transparency and accountability in public and private bodies by giving effect to the right of access to information; and

actively promote a society in which the people of South Africa have effective access to information to enable them to more fully exercise and protect all of their rights."

2 Particulars in terms of section 14

2.1 The functions and the structure of the JSE Securities Exchange South Africa ("JSE")

The JSE is a privately owned and privately funded voluntary association of members, governed by a Board of Directors. Its activities as an exchange are regulated by two Acts of Parliament, namely the Stock Exchanges Control Act, 1 of 1985 ("SECA"), which governs the equities markets, and the Financial Markets Control Act, 55 of 1989 ("FMCA"), which governs the derivatives markets. The JSE is licensed as a stock exchange (for equities) and as a financial market (for financial and agricultural derivatives) in terms of these Acts, but, in common with international practice, a philosophy of self-regulation by the markets is practiced and applies to the JSE. The JSE members and their clients (investors), must comply with trading and other rules set by the JSE from time to time. The JSE acts as regulator of its members and ensures that markets operate in a transparent and fair manner ensuring investor protection. Similarly, issuers of securities must comply with the JSE Listings Requirements which are aimed at ensuring sufficient disclosure in the public interest of all information relevant to investors.

The JSE's main function is to facilitate the raising of primary capital by re-channelling cash resources into productive economic activity thus building the economy while enhancing job opportunities and wealth creation. In addition, and from a derivatives perspective, the function is to provide an effective and efficient price determination facility and price risk management mechanism.

It is an essential cog in the functioning of an economy and provides an orderly market for dealing in securities, thereby creating new investment opportunities in the country.

The JSE performs the role of regulating applications for listing, the continuing obligations of listed companies and the interpretation of JSE Listings Requirements. In addition, the JSE regulates applications for the alteration of an existing listing and any corporate actions arising from this and scrutinising company documentation with a view of disclosure to the public. The Stock Exchange News Service (SENS) is also provided through which company news, including price sensitive information, is distributed to the market.

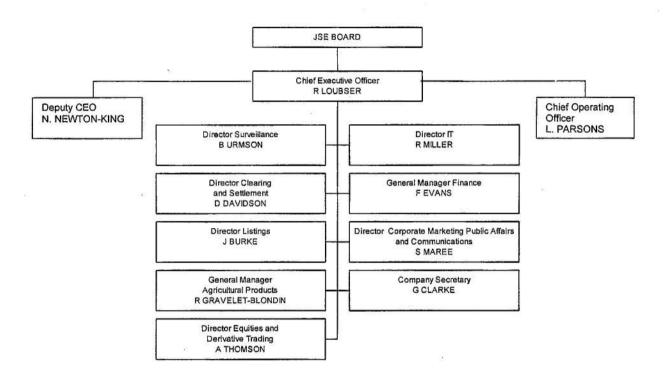

3.3 The request procedures

A requester must be given access to a record of a public body if the requester complies with the following:

- The requester complies with all the procedural requirements in the Act relating to the request for access to that record; and
- Access to that record is not refused on any ground of refusal set out in the Act.

Nature of the request:

- A requester must use the form attached and marked "Form A":
- The requester must also indicate if a copy of the record is required or if the requester wants to view the record at the offices of the JSE;
- If a person asks for access in a particular form then the requester is to be granted (if possible) access in the manner that has been requested. In the event that the requested access will interfere unreasonably with the running of the JSE, or damage the record, or infringe a copyright not owned by the JSE, then access may be refused. If for practical reasons access cannot be given in the required form but in an alternate manner, then an appropriate fee will be charged:
- If, in addition to a written reply to their request for the record, the requester requires to be told about the decision in any other way, e.g. telephone, this must be indicated by the requestor [s 18(2)(e)];
- If a requester is asking for the information on behalf of somebody else, the capacity in which the request is being made must be indicated [s 18(2)(f)];
- If a requester is unable to read or write, or has a disability, then they may make the request for the record orally. The Information Officer must then fill in the form on behalf of such a requester and provide the requester with a copy [s 18(3)].

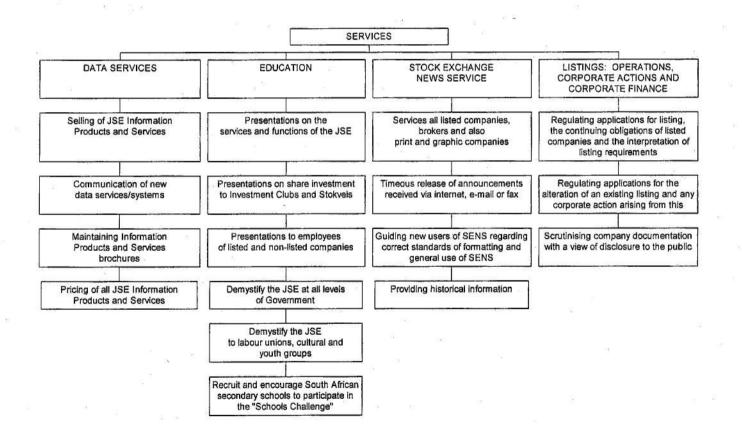
There are two types of fees required to be paid in terms of the Act, that is a request fee and an access fee (s22).

A requester who seeks access to a record containing personal information about that requester is not required to pay the request fee. Every other requester must pay the required request fee:

- The Information Officer must notify the requester (other than a personal requester) by notice, requiring the
 requester to pay the prescribed fee (if any) before further processing the request;
- After the Information Officer has made a decision on the request, the requester must be notified of such a
 decision in the way in which the requester requested;
- If the request is granted then a further access fee must be paid for the search, preparation, reproduction and for any time that has exceeded the prescribed hours to search and prepare the record for disclosure.

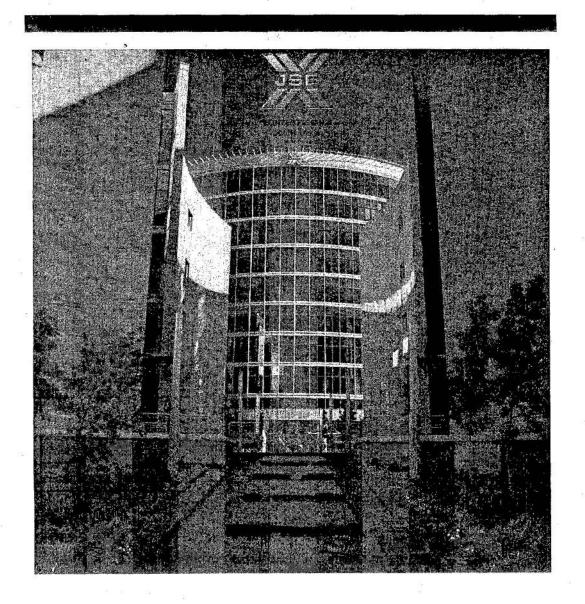

1 Aanhef

2 Besonderhede ingevolge artikel 14

2.1 Die funksies en die struktuur van die JSE Sekuriteitsbeurs Suid-Africa ("JSE")

Die JSE is 'n vrywillige assosiasie van lede onder private besit en private befondsing, en word deur 'n Direksie beheer. Sy aktiwiteite as 'n beurs word deur twee Wette van die Parlement gereguleer, naamlik die Wet op Beheer van Aandelebeurse, 1 van 1985 ("WBA"), wat die aandelemark beheer, en die Wet op Beheer van Finansiële Markte, 55 van 1989 ("WBFM"), wat die finansiële derivatemarkte beheer. Die JSE is ingevolge hierdie wette gelisensieër as 'n effektebeurs (vir aandele) en as 'n finansiële mark (vir finansiële en landbou-derivate), maar, ooreenkomstig internasionale praktyk, volg die JSE 'n filosofie van selfregulering deur die markte, en is dit daarop van toepassing. Die JSE lede en hul kliënte (beleggers) moet voldoen aan handels- en ander reëls wat van tyd tot tyd deur die JSE bepaal word. Die JSE se hooffunksie is om die verkryging van primêre kapitaal te fasiliteer by wyse van die herkanalisering van kontantbronne na produktiewe ekonomiese aktiwiteit, en om sodoende die ekonomie te versterk en werksgeleenthede en welvaartskepping te bevorder. Daarbenewens, en vanuit 'n derivateperspektief, is sy funksie om 'n effektiewe en doelmatige prysbepalingsfasiliteit en prysrisikobestuursmeganisme daar te stel.

Dit is 'n onontbeerlike skakel in die funksionering van 'n ekonomie, en voorsien 'n ordelike mark vir die verhandeling van aandele, en skep sodoende nuwe beleggingsgeleenthede in die land.

Die JSE reguleer aansoeke om notering, die voortgesette verpligtinge van genoteerde maatskappye en die interpretasie van die JSE Noteringsvereistes. Daarbenewens reguleer die JSE aansoeke vir die aanpassing van 'n bestaande notering en enige Korporatiewe Aksie wat daaruit kan voortspruit, en bestudeer maatskappy dokumentasie met die oog op openbaarmaking. 'n Sekuriteite Nuusdiens word ook verskaf om maatskappynuus, insluitende pryssensitiewe inligting, aan die mark bekend te maak.

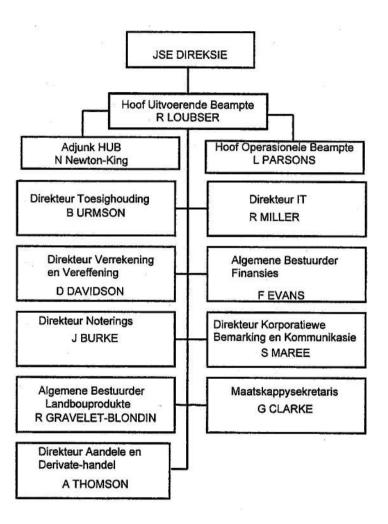

Our Manual in terms of Section 51 of the Promotion of Access to Information Act



Preamble

The Promotion of Access to Information Act No. 2 of 2000, ("the Act") came into operation on 23 November 2001. Section 51 of this Act requires that we as a private body compile a manual giving information to the public regarding the procedure to be followed in requesting information from us for the purpose of exercising or protecting rights.

The Promotion of Access to Information Act No. 2 of 2000 was enacted on 23 November 2001 to give effect to Section 32 of the Constitution.

Section 32 of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa No. 108 of 1996 provides:

- Everyone has the right to access to:
 - a) any information held by the State; and
 - any information that is held by another person and that is required for the exercise or protection of any rights.
- National legislation must be enacted to give effect to this right, and may provide for reasonable measures to alleviate the administrative and financial burden on the state.

Therefore the Promotion of Acess to Information Act is a direct result of this constitutional right to access to information. The "national legislation" referred to in the Constitution has been enacted as the Promotion of Access to Information Act.

Introduction to this private body

The Rand Mutual Assurance Company Limited was founded in 1894 by three mining companies on the Witwatersrand as a non-profit mutual insurance company to administer workers' compensation benefits to the mining industry employees injured in the course and scope of their employment. In fact, the Rand Mutual pioneered workers' insurance in South Africa.



In 1941 the Workmen's Compensation Act (WCA) was promulgated and the Rand Mutual was granted a licence by the State to continue underwriting workers compensation insurance for the mining industry.

In 1993, when the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1941, was replaced with the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act (COID), the Rand Mutual retained its licence to underwrite workmen's compensation. The Rand Mutual has expanded its add-on and complementary covers and now offers additional personal accident related insurance products.

ANNEXURE "B"

AN EXPLANATORY NOTE ON FEES TO BE CHARGED BY A PRIVATE BODY WHEN GRANTING A REQUEST FOR ACCESS TO INFORMATION IN TERMS OF THE PROMOTION OF ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT, 2000

The fees chargeable by private bodies are contained in Part III of Annexure "A" of the Regulations. A copy of Part III is attached for your convenience. The present charges are as follows:

1. Copies of a manual

Should an individual require a copy of the private body's manual, a fee of R1,10 is chargeable for every photocopy of an A4 page or part thereof.

Reproduction fees¹

Reproduction fees apply to obtaining copies or transcriptions of information which is automatically available from the private body. The fees are listed in paragraph 2 of Part III of Annexure "A" to the Regulations.

Access fees²

Access fees are chargeable for copies or transcriptions of information requested under this Act. The fees are listed in paragraph 4 of Part II of Annexure "A" to the Regulations.

4. Other fees

- 4.1 A request fee³ of R50,00 is payable by a requester who is seeking access to a record containing information which is not personal to the requester. See paragraph 6 of Part 1 of this Work.
- 4.2 A search fee⁴ may be charged at a rate of R30,00 per hour or part thereof for searching and preparing the record for disclosure provided such time was reasonably required for that purpose.
- 4.3 If the request is not limited to records containing information which is personal to the requester and if the head of the private body is of the opinion that the time taken to give effect to the request will exceed six hours the requester can be called upon to pay a deposit of not more than one third of an estimate of the access fee which will become payable⁵.



4.4 If a copy of a record is posted to a requester, the requester is obliged to pay the actual postage payable.

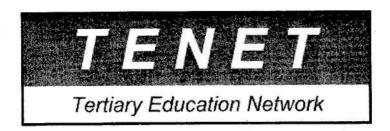

ATTORNEYS INSURANCE INDEMNITY FUND ("AIIF")

STRUCTURE & FUNCTIONS

History

1.

In 1979, the Attorneys Fidelity Fund ("the Fund"), which was established in terms of the Attorneys Act of 1979, as amended, was, through an amendment to the Legal Practitioners Fidelity Fund Act 19 of 1949, enabled to pay an insurance premium to protect legal practitioners against claims arising out of their negligence. The Fund has procured professional indemnity insurance cover for the benefit of all legal practitioners practising within the Republic of South Africa, since the aforementioned amendment came into effect. The premiums payable have been disbursed by the Fund out of its revenue.

Insurance arrangements

ii)...

The initial insurance cover was for an amount of R30 000.00 per practice. In the mid-1980's, the cost of providing the minimal cover of R30 000.00 per practice was becoming prohibitive. An alternative burning cost insurance agreement scheme was devised and adopted by the Fund in 1987.

In 1991 the Attorneys Act was amended so that in terms of Section 40A-The Board of Control of the Fund may "(a)(i) acquire or form and administer, a public company or;

so as to provide insurance cover subject to the provisions of the Insurance Act, 1943 (Act Number 27 of 1943) to practitioners in respect of claims which may proceed from the professional conduct of such practitioners".

Since 1987, the Professional Indemnity Insurance Scheme cover has increased from an amount of R30 000.00 to amounts ranging between R1 000 000.00 to R2 000 000.00 per annum per practice. Because of the rapid growth in cover and the experience gained by the Fund, it was decided that it would be in the best interests of legal practitioners that the structure and administration of their professional indemnity insurance be conducted in a special purpose vehicle dedicated solely to the insurance needs of the profession. The Attorneys Insurance Indemnity Fund ("the AIIF") was therefore formed as a Section 21 Company for the enhancement and benefit of the legal profession in South Africa. It was believed that it would also be to the benefit of the general public.

More recently, the Attorneys Act has again been amended (in terms of the Judicial Matters Amendment Act 2002) by the insertion of Section 40B which states that:

"The board of control may enter into a contract with a company or a scheme contemplated in Section 40A (a) or any company carrying on professional indemnity insurance business in the Republic for the provision of group professional indemnity insurance to practitioners to the extent and in the manner provided for in such contract."

In terms of the aforementioned amendment act, the following section was substituted for Section 43 of the Attorneys Act:

"Contributions to fund by practitioners

43(1)(a) subject to the provisions of this Section, every practitioner, practising on his or her account or in partnership, shall annually when he or she applies for a fidelity fund certificate, pay

(i) such amount as may be fixed by the board of control from time to time in respect of group professional indemnity insurance arranged by the board of control pursuant to the provisions of section 40B; ...

Claims and administration

Since 1987, the Fund has retained Glenrand MIB (previously Glenvaal) Professional Services (Pty) Limited to manage the Scheme.
