This means that any notice submissions not on an Adobe electronic form that are submitted to this mailbox will be **rejected**. National or Provincial gazette notices, where the Z95 or Z95Prov must be an Adobe form but the notice content (body) will be an attachment.
3. Notices brought into GPW by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in Adobe electronic form format. This means that any notice submissions not on an Adobe electronic form that are submitted by the customer on electronic media will be **rejected**. National or Provincial gazette notices, where the Z95 or Z95Prov must be an Adobe form but the notice content (body) will be an attachment.
4. All customers who walk in to GPW that wish to submit a notice that is not on an electronic Adobe form will be routed to the Contact Centre where the customer will be taken through the completion of the form by a GPW representative. Where a customer walks into GPW with a stack of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of a newspaper the messenger must be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.
5. All notice submissions that do not comply with point 2 will be charged full price for the notice submission.

The Independent Communications Authority of South Africa (“the Authority”) hereby, in terms of regulation 7 of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Amendment Regulations 2015 (“the RFSR”)<sup>1</sup>, invites applications for the issuance of the radio frequency spectrum licence making up the third Digital Terrestrial Television (DTT3), referred to as multiplexer 3 (“MUX 3”) in the Promotion of Diversity and Competition on Digital Terrestrial Television Regulations 2014 for the purposes of providing commercial subscription television broadcasting services.

All applications will be assessed based on the Electronic Communications Act, 2005 (Act No 36 of 2005) (“the Act”), the RFSR, Promotion of Diversity and Competition on Digital Terrestrial Television Regulations<sup>2</sup>, the Radio Frequency Spectrum Migration Regulations and Plan 2013<sup>3</sup>, the Terrestrial Broadcasting Plan 2013<sup>4</sup> read with the First Update to the Terrestrial Broadcasting Plan 2013<sup>5</sup> and any other applicable regulations promulgated by the Authority including the criteria set out in this Invitation to Apply (“ITA”).

**SCHEDULE A**

1. Applications must be in writing.
2. Applications submitted must be in the format as provided in Schedule G. Applicants must answer all questions in full as set out Schedule G.
3. If any question is considered not applicable, please mark N/A with further explanation .
4. The applicant must submit the original application, five (5) copies of the original application and a soft copy, in CD format, by the deadline.
5. All applications submitted to the Authority, pursuant to this ITA, will be made available for inspection.
6. Where an applicant require that the application or part thereof be treated as confidential, then an application in terms of section 4D of the ICASA Act, 2000 (Act No. 13 of 2000) must be lodged during the submission of the application.
7. Applicants are requested to separate any confidential material into a clearly marked confidential annexure.
8. Subject to paragraph 6, the Authority may determine that an application or portions thereof are confidential and will inform the applicant within seven (7) days of receiving a request for confidentiality.
9. If the request for confidentiality is refused, the applicant making the request may withdraw portions of the application to which confidentiality was requested . Each application must be permanently bound (using either heat binding or spiral binding).
10. An application must have a cover page reflecting the name of the applicant, the subject matter being applied for and the date of application.
11. The pages immediately following the cover must be the content pages which detail each section of the application and its page number.
12. The application must be properly bound and paginated.
13. In the event that the applicant has to submit its application in more than one part or volume, each part or volume must have a cover page. In this case, the cover page must specify the number of the part or volume (i.e. Part one, Part Two or Volume One, Volume

Two). Each volume or part must also have the full set of content pages and sequentially numbered as noted.

14. An applicant must apply for the assignment of MUX 3 broadcasting frequencies as specified in Annexure G and or the Latest Version of the Terrestrial Broadcasting Frequency Plan 2013.

16. Applications must be submitted by no later than 16H00 on 30 November 2015 (Central African Time).
17. The time indicated on the clock in the reception hall of Block B at ICASA head office, will be regarded as the correct time.
18. Applications submitted must be addressed to the Chairperson, Independent Communications Authority of South Africa, 164 Katherine Street, Sandton, Johannesburg.
19. Sealed applications must be **DEPOSITED IN THE BID BOX SITUATED AT:** Block B, Pinmill Farm, 164 Katherine Street, Sandton, Johannesburg.
20. The Authority will open the applications after the closing time and affix on each container the time of receipt and must provide each applicant with an acknowledgement.
21. **Applications received after the deadline will not be accepted and considered by the Authority.**
22. Failure to comply with any of these requirements and provisions of the Radio Frequency Spectrum Regulations 2015 will render the application null and void.
23. The Radio Frequency Spectrum licence for MUX 3 frequencies must be awarded using competitive processes. The following three (3) stages will be followed:
  - Phase 1 - Prequalification criteria
  - Phase 2 - Sealed Bids
  - Phase 3 - Granting of spectrum licence

24. The prequalification stage, found in paragraph 25, sets out the requirements that must be met in order for a person to participate in a competitive licensing process.
25. The minimum requirements for the prequalification stage are as follows:
- 25.1. An applicant must be a television broadcasting service licensee as defined in the Promotion of Diversity and Competition on Digital Terrestrial Television Regulations.
- 25.2. An applicant must have a minimum of 30% ownership held by historically disadvantaged person(s) and/or a level 4 (four) Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (BBBEE) status.
26. An applicant that fail to comply with any of the requirements of paragraph 25 will be disqualified.
27. An applicant that has complied with all the requirements of paragraph 25 will qualify to participate in the next phase, which is the Sealed Bids. The Authority will inform the applicants to submit sealed/closed bids. The successful applicant will be the highest bidder.
28. MUX 3 broadcasting frequencies will be assigned to the successful applicant.
29. The successful applicant will be assigned 45 % of MUX 3 capacity by the Authority for commercial subscription television broadcasting services.
30. The Authority reserves the right not to award frequencies should applicants not meet the requirements as set out in this ITA.
31. An applicant must commit not to engage in any activity, which would or could be construed as an illegal or corrupt practice, either directly or indirectly. Any such practice will be grounds for disqualification.
32. All applicants shall carry their own costs in responding to the ITA.

7. Is colluding or has attempted to collude, with another applicant with the intention to distort or manipulate information; or
8. Has, without consent, obtained or acquired confidential information relating to another applicant; or
9. Has failed to comply with the terms and conditions of the application as set out in the ITA.
