

The **Government Printing Works** (**GPW**) has established rules for submitting notices in line with its electronic notice processing system, which requires the use of electronic *Adobe* Forms. Please ensure that you adhere to these guidelines when completing and submitting your notice submission.

CLOSING TIMES FOR ACCEPTANCE OF NOTICES

- The Government Gazette and Government Tender Bulletin are weekly publications that are published on Fridays and the closing time for the acceptance of notices is strictly applied according to the scheduled time for each gazette.

EXTRAORDINARY GAZETTES

3. Extraordinary Gazettes can have only one publication date. If multiple publications of an Extraordinary Gazette are required, a separate Z95/Z95Prov Adobe Forms for each publication date must be submitted.

Notice Submission Process

- 4. Download the latest *Adobe* form, for the relevant notice to be placed, from the **Government Printing Works** website www.gpwonline.co.za.
- 5. The Adobe form needs to be completed electronically using Adobe Acrobat / Acrobat Reader. Only electronically completed Adobe forms will be accepted. No printed, handwritten and/or scanned Adobe forms will be accepted.
- 6. The completed electronic *Adobe* form has to be submitted via email to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za. The form needs to be submitted in its original electronic *Adobe* format to enable the system to extract the completed information from the form for placement in the publication.
- Every notice submitted must be accompanied by an official GPW quotation. This must be obtained from the eGazette Contact Centre.
- 8. Each notice submission should be sent as a single email. The email **must** contain **all documentation** relating to a particular notice submission.
 - 8.1. Each of the following documents must be attached to the email as a separate attachment:
 - 8.1.1. An electronically completed Adobe form, specific to the type of notice that is to be placed.
 - 8.1.1.1. For National *Government Gazette* or *Provincial Gazette* notices, the notices must be accompanied by an electronic Z95 or Z95Prov *Adobe* form
 - 8.1.1.2. The notice content (body copy) **MUST** be a separate attachment.
 - 8.1.2. A copy of the official **Government Printing Works** quotation you received for your notice. (Please see Quotation section below for further details)
 - 8.1.3. A valid and legible Proof of Payment / Purchase Order: **Government Printing Works** account customer must include a copy of their Purchase Order. **Non-Government Printing Works** account customer needs to submit the proof of payment for the notice
 - 8.1.4. Where separate notice content is applicable (Z95, Z95 Prov and TForm 3, it should **also** be attached as a separate attachment. (*Please see the Copy Section below, for the specifications*).
 - 8.1.5. Any additional notice information if applicable.

- 9. The electronic *Adobe* form will be taken as the primary source for the notice information to be published. Instructions that are on the email body or covering letter that contradicts the notice form content will not be considered. The information submitted on the electronic *Adobe* form will be published as-is.
- To avoid duplicated publication of the same notice and double billing, Please submit your notice ONLY ONCE.
- 11. Notices brought to **GPW** by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in *Adobe* electronic form format. All "walk-in" customers with notices that are not on electronic *Adobe* forms will be routed to the Contact Centre where they will be assisted to complete the forms in the required format.
- 12. Should a customer submit a bulk submission of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of any organisation e.g. newspaper publisher, the messenger will be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.

QUOTATIONS

- 13. Quotations are valid until the next tariff change.
 - 13.1. Take note: GPW's annual tariff increase takes place on 1 April therefore any quotations issued, accepted and submitted for publication up to 31 March will keep the old tariff. For notices to be published from 1 April, a quotation must be obtained from GPW with the new tariffs. Where a tariff increase is implemented during the year, GPW endeavours to provide customers with 30 days' notice of such changes.
- 14. Each quotation has a unique number.
- 15. Form Content notices must be emailed to the eGazette Contact Centre for a quotation.
 - 15.1. The *Adobe* form supplied is uploaded by the Contact Centre Agent and the system automatically calculates the cost of your notice based on the layout/format of the content supplied.
 - 15.2. It is critical that these *Adobe* Forms are completed correctly and adhere to the guidelines as stipulated by **GPW**.

16. APPLICABLE ONLY TO GPW ACCOUNT HOLDERS:

- 16.1. GPW Account Customers must provide a valid GPW account number to obtain a quotation.
- 16.2. Accounts for GPW account customers must be active with sufficient credit to transact with GPW to submit notices.
 - 16.2.1. If you are unsure about or need to resolve the status of your account, please contact the GPW Finance Department prior to submitting your notices. (If the account status is not resolved prior to submission of your notice, the notice will be failed during the process).

17. APPLICABLE ONLY TO CASH CUSTOMERS:

- 17.1. Cash customers doing **bulk payments** must use a **single email address** in order to use the **same proof of payment** for submitting multiple notices.
- 18. The responsibility lies with you, the customer, to ensure that the payment made for your notice(s) to be published is sufficient to cover the cost of the notice(s).
- 19. Each quotation will be associated with one proof of payment / purchase order / cash receipt.
 - 19.1. This means that the quotation number can only be used once to make a payment.

COPY (SEPARATE NOTICE CONTENT DOCUMENT)

- 20. Where the copy is part of a separate attachment document for Z95, Z95Prov and TForm03
 - 20.1. Copy of notices must be supplied in a separate document and may not constitute part of any covering letter, purchase order, proof of payment or other attached documents.

The content document should contain only one notice. (You may include the different translations of the same notice in the same document).

20.2. The notice should be set on an A4 page, with margins and fonts set as follows:

Page size = A4 Portrait with page margins: Top = 40mm, LH/RH = 16mm, Bottom = 40mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

Page size = A4 Landscape with page margins: Top = 16mm, LH/RH = 40mm, Bottom = 16mm; Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

CANCELLATIONS

- 21. Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above in point 2. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette. Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.
- 22. Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES

23. With effect from 01 October 2015, **GPW** will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed according to the deadline and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

REJECTIONS

- 24. All notices not meeting the submission rules will be rejected to the customer to be corrected and resubmitted. Assistance will be available through the Contact Centre should help be required when completing the forms. (012-748 6200 or email info.egazette@gpw.gov.za). Reasons for rejections include the following:
 - 24.1. Incorrectly completed forms and notices submitted in the wrong format, will be rejected.
 - 24.2. Any notice submissions not on the correct Adobe electronic form, will be rejected.
 - 24.3. Any notice submissions not accompanied by the proof of payment / purchase order will be rejected and the notice will not be processed.
 - 24.4. Any submissions or re-submissions that miss the submission cut-off times will be rejected to the customer. The Notice needs to be re-submitted with a new publication date.

APPROVAL OF NOTICES

- 25. Any notices other than legal notices are subject to the approval of the Government Printer, who may refuse acceptance or further publication of any notice.
- 26. No amendments will be accepted in respect to separate notice content that was sent with a Z95 or Z95Prov notice submissions. The copy of notice in layout format (previously known as proof-out) is only provided where requested, for Advertiser to see the notice in final Gazette layout. Should they find that the information submitted was incorrect, they should request for a notice cancellation and resubmit the corrected notice, subject to standard submission deadlines. The cancellation is also subject to the stages in the publishing process, i.e. If cancellation is received when production (printing process) has commenced, then the notice cannot be cancelled.

GOVERNMENT PRINTER INDEMNIFIED AGAINST LIABILITY

- 27. The Government Printer will assume no liability in respect of—
 - 27.1. any delay in the publication of a notice or publication of such notice on any date other than that stipulated by the advertiser;
 - 27.2. erroneous classification of a notice, or the placement of such notice in any section or under any heading other than the section or heading stipulated by the advertiser;
 - 27.3. any editing, revision, omission, typographical errors or errors resulting from faint or indistinct copy.

LIABILITY OF ADVERTISER

28. Advertisers will be held liable for any compensation and costs arising from any action which may be instituted against the Government Printer in consequence of the publication of any notice.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES

- 30. Requests for Quotations (RFQs) should be received by the Contact Centre at least **2 working days** before the submission deadline for that specific publication.

PAYMENT OF COST

- 31. The Request for Quotation for placement of the notice should be sent to the Gazette Contact Centre as indicated above, prior to submission of notice for advertising.
- 32. Payment should then be made, or Purchase Order prepared based on the received quotation, prior to the submission of the notice for advertising as these documents i.e. proof of payment or Purchase order will be required as part of the notice submission, as indicated earlier.
- 33. Every proof of payment must have a valid **GPW** quotation number as a reference on the proof of payment document.
- 34. SCHEDULE

Definitions

In these regulations any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the
 Act shall have such meaning and, unless the context indicates otherwise-

"the Regulations" means the Regulations Relating to the Transparent Pricing System for Medicines and Scheduled Substances published under Government Notice No. R1102 of November 2005 as amended.

Substitution of Regulation 12

- 2. The following regulation is hereby substituted for Regulation 12 of the Regulations:
 - "12. The appropriate dispensing fee as contemplated in section 22G (2) (b) of the Act to be charged by persons licensed in terms of section 22C (1) (a) of the Act must be calculated, exclusive of VAT, as follows:
 - (a) Where the single exit price of a medicine or scheduled substance is less than one hundred and twenty eight rand (R128.00), the dispensing fee must not exceed 30% of the single exit price in respect of that medicine or scheduled substance;
 - (b) Where the single exit price of a medicine or scheduled substance is equal to or greater than one hundred and eight rand (R128.00), the dispensing fee must not exceed thirty eight rand and forty cents (R38.40) in respect of that medicine or scheduled substance;
- The provisions of Regulation 12 must be reviewed annually by the Minister after taking into account-
 - (a) the need to ensure the availability and affordability of quality medicines and scheduled substances in the Republic;
 - (b) annual inflation rates published periodically by Statistics South Africa;
 - (c) information supplied by persons licensed to dispense in terms of section 22C (1)(a) in accordance with guidelines determined by the Director-General from time to time by Notice in the Gazette; and
 - (d) any other information the Minister may deem necessary to consider.

- 4. Persons Licensed to dispensing in terms of section 22C (1) (a) must-
 - (a) by means of a clearly displayed notice in the dispensing practice, inform members of the public of the maximum fee structure used by such dispensing practice to determine the dispensing fee; and
 - (b) provide an invoice in respect of each medicine that clearly indicates the-
 - (i) dispensing fee charged; and
 - (ii) the single exit price;

SCHEDULE

Definitions

 In these regulations any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall have such meaning and, unless the context indicates otherwise"dispense" means the supply of medicines based on a prescription to a patient or someone on behalf of the patient by a health professional authorized by law to supply medicines and includes-

- (a) the interpretation and evaluation of the prescription;
- (b) the selection, reconstitution, dilution, labelling, recording and the actual supply of the medicine;
- the provision of information and instructions to ensure safe and effective use of a medicine by a patient; or
- (d) the provision of information as contemplated in section 22F (1) (a) of the Act.

"dispensing fee" means a fee determined in terms of these regulations, exclusive of Value Added Tax, that may be charged to dispense a medicine; and

"the Regulations" means the Regulations Relating to the Transparent Pricing System for Medicines and Scheduled Substances published under government Notice No. R1102 of November 2005 as amended.

Amendment of Regulation 10

- 2. The following regulation is hereby substituted for regulation 10 of the regulations:
 - "10. (1) The appropriate dispensing fee, exclusive of VAT, as contemplated in section 22G of the Act to be charged by pharmacists, must:
 - (a) Where the single exit price of a medicine or scheduled substance is less than one hundred and thirteen rand seventy one cents (R113.71), the dispensing fee shall not exceed R15.19 plus 46% of the single exit price in respect of that medicine or scheduled substance;
 - (b) where the single exit price of a medicine or scheduled substance is greater than or equal to one hundred and thirteen rand and seventy one cents (R113.71) but

less than three hundred and three rand thirty one cents (R303.31), the dispensing fee shall not exceed R29.07 plus 33% of the single exit price in respect of that medicine or scheduled substance;

- (c) where the single exit price of a medicine or scheduled substance is greater than or equal to three hundred and three rand thirty one cents (R303.31) but less than one thousand and sixty one rand sixty two cents (R1061.62), the dispensing fee shall not exceed R82.77 plus 15% of the Single Exit Price in respect of that medicine or scheduled substance;
- (d) where the single exit price of a medicine or scheduled substance is greater than or equal to one thousand and sixty one rand sixty two cents (R1061.62), the dispensing fee shall not exceed R190.68 plus 5% of the Single Exit Price in respect of that medicine or scheduled substance.
- (2) The provisions of regulation 10 must be reviewed annually by the Minister after taking into account-
- (a) the need to ensure the availability and affordability of quality medicines and scheduled substances in the Republic;
- (b) annual inflation rates published periodically by Statistics South Africa;
- (c) information supplied by pharmacists in accordance with guidelines determined by the Minister from time to time by Notice in the Gazette; and
- (d) any other information the Minister may deem necessary to consider.
- (3) A pharmacist's dispensing a medicine must-
 - (a) by means of a clearly displayed notice in the pharmacy, inform members of the public of the maximum fee structure used by such pharmacist to determine the dispensing fee; and

- (b) provide an invoice in respect of the sale of each medicine that clearly indicates the-
 - (i) dispensing fee charged; and
 - (ii) the single exit price.

It is hereby published for general information that the Minister of International Relations and Cooperation has, in terms of section 5(2) of the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act, 2001 (Act No. 37 of 2001), recognised the International Fund for Agricultural Development for the purposes of granting the immunities and privileges as provided for in the Agreement between the Government of the Republic of South Africa and the International Fund for Agricultural Development on the Establishment of a Country Office, signed on 7 March 2019.



AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA

AND

THE INTERNATIONAL FUND FOR AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT

ON

THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A COUNTRY OFFICE

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS the International Fund for Agricultural Development ("IFAD" or the "Fund"), a Specialised Agency of the United Nations, wishes to establish a Country Office to serve as a Southern Africa Hub in the Republic of South Africa to support its operations and strengthen its partnerships;

WHEREAS the Government of the Republic of South Africa (the "Government") agrees to permit the establishment of such an Office;

WHEREAS the Republic of South Africa has acceded on 14th February, 1997 to the Agreement Establishing the International Fund for Agricultural Development (the "Agreement");

WHEREAS the Republic of South Africa has acceded on 30th August 2002 to the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the Specialized Agencies of 21 November 1947 (the "Convention") and to Annex XVI relating to the Fund, which terms shall apply to this Agreement subject to the reservations made by South Africa regarding Articles III and IX of the Convention;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Government and the Fund hereby agree as follows:—

ARTICLE I DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this Agreement:

- (a) "Agreement" means the Agreement between the Government of the Republic of South Africa and the International Fund for Agricultural Development a Specialised Agency of the United Nations on the Establishment of a Country Office;
- (b) "Country Representative" means the lawfully appointed representative of the Fund in the Republic of South Africa nominated by the President of the Fund and accredited as such by the Government;
- (c) "dependents" means the dependents of the IFAD officials and includes—
 - (i) their spouse;

- (ii) any unmarried child under the age of 18 years;
- (iii) any unmarried child between the ages of 18 and 23 years who is undertaking full-time studies at an educational institution; and
- (iv) any other unmarried child or other family member officially recognised as a dependent of a member of the family of the IFAD official;
- (d) "Government" means the Government of the Republic of South Africa;
- (e) "IFAD" means the International Fund for Agricultural Development, an International Financial Institution and a Specialised Agency of the United Nations, and "the Fund" shall have a corresponding meaning:
- (f) "IFAD officials" means the Country Representative and all other officials as specified by the Fund and communicated to the Government; and
- (g) "Office" means the IFAD's Southern Africa Office in the Republic of South Africa and "Country Office" shall have a corresponding meaning:
- (h) "representatives of Member Countries" includes all alternates, advisers and technical experts assisting such representatives and secretaries of delegation.

ARTICLE H JURIDICAL PERSONALITY OF THE FUND

- (1) The Government recognises, in accordance with the laws of the Republic of South Africa, the juridical personality of the Fund, and in particular its capacity—
 - (a) to contract;
 - (b) to acquire and dispose of movable and immovable property; and
 - (c) to institute legal proceedings.
- (2) The Government shall permit the Fund to purchase or rent premises to serve as its Office subject to the approval of the premises by the Government.
- (3) The Office shall be authorised to display the emblem of the Fund on its premises and vehicles.

ARTICLE III GENERAL PROVISIONS

- (1) The privileges and immunities provided for in this Agreement are not designed to secure personal advantage for their beneficiaries, but rather—
 - (a) designed exclusively to ensure that the Office may operate freely in all circumstances; and
 - (b) to safeguard the complete independence of the persons to whom they are granted to execute their functions freely.
- (2) The President of the Fund may waive any of these immunities when he considers that it would impede the course of justice and can be waived without prejudice to the interests of the Office.
- (3) The President of the Fund shall take all measures that are necessary to prevent any abuse of the privileges and the immunities granted under this Agreement, and the Fund shall issue such regulations, applicable
 - (a) to the IFAD officials; and
 - (b) others concerned, as may be deemed necessary and appropriate.
- (4) The provisions of this Agreement are applicable to all persons covered by the Agreement, regardless of whether the Government maintains diplomatic relations with the State of which such persons are nationals, or whether such State grants similar privileges and immunities to the diplomatic officials and nationals of the Republic of South Africa.
- (5) Whenever this Agreement imposes obligations on competent authorities, the Government shall be ultimately responsible for ensuring the fulfilment of such obligations.

ARTICLE IV

THE OFFICE, INVIOLABILITY OF THE OFFICE AND ARCHIVES

- (1) (a) The Government shall assist the Fund and facilitate the process for the Fund to secure suitable premises and facilities required for its functioning for a provisional period of five (5) years.
 - (b) During this period, the parties shall review the requirements of IFAD including the extension of this provision.
 - (c) Expenses related to the securing, maintenance, use, furnishing, equipping, of the facilities, and for all communication and public utility services are not included in the assistance and facilitation.
- (2) (a) The Fund, its property and assets, wherever located and by whomsoever held, shall enjoy immunity from every form of legal process except in so far as in any particular case it has expressly waived its immunity.
 - (b) It is however, understood that no waiver of immunity shall extend to any measure of execution.
- (3) (a) The premises of the Office shall be inviolable.
 - (b) The property and assets of the Office, wherever located and by whomsoever held, shall be immune from search, requisition, confiscation, expropriation and any other form of interference, whether by executive, administrative, judicial or legislative action.
- (4) The archives of the Office, and in general all documents belonging to it or held by it, shall be inviolable, wherever located.
- (5) (a) The authorities, officials and agents of the Republic of South Africa shall not enter the Office in an official capacity unless at the request or with the explicit authorisation of the Country Representative or his or her delegate.
 - (b) In the event of *force majeure*, fire or any other calamity requiring urgent measures of protection, the consent of the Country

- Representative or his or her representative shall be considered to have been given.
- (c) However, if requested by the Country Representative, any person who has entered the Office with his or her presumed consent shall leave the Office immediately.
- (6) The Government of the Republic of South Africa shall, to the extent possible, take all necessary measures to protect the Office against any intrusion or damage, to ensure that its tranquillity is not disturbed.
- (7) The premises of the Fund shall not be used in any manner incompatible with the mandate and purpose of the Fund or the purpose and scope of establishing the Regional Office to support its operations and strengthen its partnerships.

ARTICLE V

PUBLIC SERVICES, COMMUNICATIONS AND SOCIAL SECURITY

- (1) (a) The Government undertakes to assist the Office in obtaining and making available where applicable the necessary public services on equitable terms.
 - (b) In the case of interruption or threatened interruption of any such services, the Government shall take the necessary measures to ensure that the Office's activities are not impaired by such a situation.
- (2) The Office's communications shall enjoy protection under the conditions and limitations defined in sections 11 and 12 of the Convention.
- (3) Since IFAD officials are covered by the Fund's social security scheme or a similar scheme, the Office shall not be required to contribute to any social security scheme in the Republic of South Africa, and the Government shall not require any member of the Office covered by the Fund's scheme to join such a scheme.

ARTICLE VI

FINANCIAL FACILITIES AND TAX EXEMPTION

- (1) The Office, without being restricted by financial controls, regulations or moratoria of any kind other than such restrictions occasioned by South Africa's reservation to Article III, Section 7 of the Convention, may—
 - (a) hold funds or currency of any kind and operate accounts in any currency; and
 - (b) freely transfer its funds or currency from one country to another or within any country and convert any currency held by it into any other currency; provided that such funds or currency originate from non-resident sources.
- (2) The Office, its assets, income and other property shall be exempt from—
 - (a) all direct and indirect taxes;
 - (b) customs duties and prohibitions and restrictions on imports and exports in respect of articles imported or exported by the Office for its official use; and
 - (c) duties and prohibitions and restrictions on imports and exports in respect of its publications.
- (3) The Fund shall not claim exemption from taxes which are, in fact, no more than charges for public utility services.
- (4) Where articles were imported or assets were acquired under exemption, such articles or assets shall not be sold in the Republic of South Africa except under those conditions agreed to with the Government.

ARTICLE VII ENTRY, TRAVEL AND SOJOURN

(1) The Government shall recognise and accept the United Nations laissez-passer issued to officials of the Fund as valid travel documents.

- (2) Applications for visas, where required, from officials of IFAD travelling on official business and holding United Nations laissez-passer, shall be dealt with as speedily as possible.
- (3) Similar facilities to those specified in paragraph 2 shall be accorded to experts and other persons who are not holders of United Nations laissez-passer, but have a certificate that they are travelling on the business of the Fund.
- (4) The Government shall facilitate the entry into or departure from the Republic of South Africa, when travelling to or from the Office, of persons exercising official functions at the Office or invited by it.
- (5) The Government undertakes to authorise the Country Representative, other IFAD officials, and all other persons invited by the Office for official purposes and their dependants, to enter into the Republic of South Africa and sojourn in the country throughout the duration of their assignment or missions to the Office.
- (6) (a) The Country Representative shall communicate to the Government a list of the IFAD officials including their dependants and inform it of any changes in this list.
 - (b) Upon notification of their appointment, the Government shall issue all IFAD officials with a card bearing the photograph of its holder which attests that such person is a member of the Office.
 - (c) This card shall be recognised by the Government as an attestation of the person's identity and status as a member of the Office.

ARTICLE VIII

PRIVILEGES, IMMUNITIES, EXEMPTIONS AND FACILITIES

(1) By virtue of the Convention and Annex XVI thereto relating to the Fund, IFAD officials shall enjoy in the Republic of South Africa the privileges, immunities, exemptions and facilities as conferred through the Convention and Annex XVI thereto relating to the Fund.

- (2) In addition to the privileges, immunities, exemptions and facilities specified above, the President and any Vice-President of the Fund, shall be accorded in respect of themselves, the privileges and immunities, exemptions and facilities accorded to diplomatic envoys, in accordance with international law, except if they are South African nationals or residents, in which instance this paragraph will not be applicable.
- (3) Representatives of Member Countries at meetings convened by the Fund shall, while exercising their functions and during their journeys to and from the place of meeting, enjoy the same privileges, immunities, exemptions and facilities granted by virtue of the Convention and Annex XVI thereto relating to the Fund.
- (4) Experts (other than officials coming within the scope of article VI of the Convention) serving on committees of, or performing missions for, the Fund shall be accorded the privileges and immunities specified in Annex XVI of the Convention, so far as it is necessary for the effective exercise of their functions.
- Notwithstanding paragraph 1 of this Article, officials, representatives of Member Countries and experts who are South African nationals or residents shall only be entitled to immunity from legal process in respect of words spoken or written and in all acts performed by them in their official capacity, and subject to the reservations to the Convention made by South Africa, none of the other provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed to modify or amend the Convention and its Annex XVI, or the Agreement Establishing IFAD, or impair or limit the rights, immunities, privileges, exemptions or facilities provided for and specified in the Convention, its Annex XVI and in the Agreement Establishing IFAD.
- (6) The Fund shall inform the Government timeously of the names, ranks and designations of officials, representatives of Member Countries and experts.

ARTICLE IX

INTERPRETATION AND SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

- (1) This Agreement shall be interpreted in the light of its principal objective, which is to enable the Office to carry out its activities fully and efficiently.
- (2) Where an allegation is substantiated, the party in breach shall undertake in writing to remedy the breach and notify the other party in writing the measures taken or proposed to be taken to remedy the breach and prevent further breaches.
- (3) Any major dispute between the Government and the Fund concerning the interpretation or application of this Agreement, or of any supplementary arrangement, which is not settled by negotiation shall, unless the parties agree otherwise, be referred for final decision to a tribunal of three (3) arbitrators, one to be named by the Government, one to be named by the President of the Fund, and the third, who shall chair the tribunal, to be chosen by mutual agreement by the other two arbitrators.
- (4) Should the first two arbitrators fail to agree on the choice of the third within six (6) months following their appointment, the third arbitrator shall be named by the President of the International Court of Justice, unless he or she is a national of the Republic of South Africa, in which case the third arbitrator shall be named by the Vice-President of the International Court of Justice.
- (5) Each Party to this Agreement shall bear the cost of its representative(s) (arbitrator(s)) and both Parties shall equally pay the cost of the third arbitrator.
- (6) The decisions of the tribunal of arbitrators shall be fully binding.

ARTICLE X

COMMENCEMENT, AMENDMENT AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

- (1) The provisions of this Agreement shall come into force on the day of receipt of the last notification by a Party of the completion of its relevant internal procedures.
- (2) This Agreement will remain in force while the Office remains established in the Republic of South Africa.
- (3) This Agreement may be amended by mutual written agreement, and may be terminated by either party upon giving six (6) months' notice of its intention to terminate the Agreement.
- (4) The obligations assumed by the Government and the Fund under this Agreement shall survive its termination to the extent necessary to permit the orderly withdrawal of the property, funds and assets of the Fund and the officials and other persons performing services on behalf of the Fund.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the undersigned, duly authorised representatives of the Government and the Fund respectively have, on behalf of both parties, signed this Agreement in English in two original copies.

The Allied Health Professions Council of South Africa (AHPCSA), having consulted with the professional boards for Ayurveda, Chinese Medicine and Acupuncture and Unani-Tibb (PBACMU), Chiropractic and Osteopathy (PBCO), Homeopathy, Naturopathy and Phytotherapy (PBHNP) and Therapeutic Aromatherapy, Therapeutic Massage Therapy and Therapeutic Reflexology (PBARM), sets the following requirements for Continuing Professional Development (CPD) for the CPD cycle 1 July 2019 to 30 June 2021 in terms of section 4(1)(g) of the Allied Health Professions Act (63/1982) ("the Act"), as amended. As from 1 July 2019, all registered practitioners and therapists, whose names appear on the registers kept in terms of section 14 of the Act, are required to comply with the conditions of CPD as set out in this Board

Practitioners or therapists who are registered in <u>more</u> than one allied health profession will be required to obtain <u>thirty (30) Continuing Education Units (CEUs) per profession</u>, <u>fifty percent (50%)</u> of which shall be profession-specific for each profession <u>and</u> include four (4) CEUs for the AHPCSA-approved Bioethics and Jurisprudence course (paragraph 5.5 of the Guidelines) <u>and</u> be in possession of either a BLS, Level I, II or III first-aid certificate per CPD cycle (paragraph 5.6 of the Guidelines).

"compliance check" is the monitoring of individual practitioners which shall take place at least once a cycle by means of a randomly selected sample of practitioners from the Registers: Acupuncture, Ayurveda, Chinese Medicine, Chiropractic, Homeopathy, Naturopathy, Osteopathy, Phytotherapy, Therapeutic Aromatherapy, Therapeutic Massage Therapy, Therapeutic Reflexology and Unani-Tibb;

"continuing education units" (CEUs) are the values attached to a learning activity for CPD.

"continuing professional development" means the continuing education and training referred to in section 4(1)(g) of the Act and prescribed in terms of Board Notice 188 of 2012 and these Guidelines, and any such subsequent Board Notice published in the Government Gazette and the acronym "CPD" has a corresponding meaning. This includes conditions relating to continuing education and training; the nature and extent of continuing education and training and the criteria for recognition;

"deferment" means formal permission sought by the practitioner and granted by any CPD Committee to suspend/postpone CPD requirements for a period of time and to consider conditions for re-entry into practice;

"individual CPD activity record" means the AHPCSA Individual CPD Activity Record that shall be held by the individual practitioner as a record of every learning activity attended or

completed. It shall be accompanied by Attendance Certificates for each event or series of events and the record shall be regularly updated and current;

"jurisprudence" means the study and knowledge of the AHP Act, Act 63 of 1982, Regulations 2001 pertaining to the Act, Rules and the application of the principles of law to health and medicine:

"learning activity/ies" means activities approved by the AHPCSA for CPD, comprising three levels, namely those encompassing non-measurable outcomes [Level 1], those with measurable outcomes [Level 2] and those associated with formally structured learning programmes [Level 3], all of which are eligible for approval for CPD and from which CEUs are obtained:

"Inquiring Body" means the council, the professional board, a committee of the council or a committee appointed by a professional board, which is conducting an inquiry contemplated in either section 23(1) or 23(1A) or section 29 of the Act and/or the Continuing Professional Development ("CPD") Guidelines for the professions of Ayurveda, Chinese Medicine and Acupuncture, Chiropractic, Homeopathy, Naturopathy, Osteopathy, Phytotherapy, Therapeutic Aromatherapy, Therapeutic Massage Therapy, Therapeutic Reflexology and Unani-Tibb;

"non-compliance" means the failure of an individual to obtain the required CEUs per cycle;

"practitioner" means any person registered with the AHPCSA in terms of Section 2(a) of the Act and any reference to practitioner also includes any person registered as a **therapist**;

"recognition of other CPD programme activities" refers to the process of approval by the AHPCSA of other statutory health profession councils' programmes for CPD;

"registrar" means the registrar of practitioners and students appointed under section 11(1) of the Act;

"restoration after deregistration" means restoration to the register and takes place according to conditions that vary, depending upon the duration of the deregistration;

"service provider" means any person, institution, body, facility or organisation that meets the specified criteria and has been approved as a service provider in accordance with the provisions of section 16A of the Act by the AHPCSA to provide and to present approved learning activities for CPD;

"therapist" means any person registered with the AHPCSA in terms of Section 2(b) of the Act and for the purposes of these Guidelines is included in the term **practitioner**; and

"validity of CEUs" means the duration of validity of CEUs.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. Graduation as a healthcare professional and registration as a practitioner does not guarantee that an individual's professional proficiency will be maintained for the rest of his/her professional life. There are two primary reasons for this: Firstly, the acquisition of new knowledge and skills for any health-related field is expanding constantly and this new knowledge is not always easily accessible by practitioners; and secondly, certain education and training acquired by students in healthcare professions may subsequently become out-dated after graduation.
- 1.2. The purpose of the CPD programme is to ensure that any practitioner who is registered with the AHPCSA maintains current, but also acquires new and updated levels of knowledge, skills and ethical performance that will be of measurable benefit in professional practice and enhance and promote professional integrity. The beneficiary will ultimately be the patient. All such practitioners are required to complete a programme of approved continuing professional development activities in each calendar year.
- 1.3. The activities are clustered together comprising a hierarchy of learning approaches and strategies. Practitioners shall select activities from the hierarchy to meet their particular needs or the specific demands of their practice environments. It is anticipated that the system will also address the specific South African healthcare environment by providing a range of activities that will allow the practitioners to meet the challenges faced in the current healthcare system.
- 1.4. The hierarchy of activities detailed includes traditional learning experiences such as, but not limited to, attendance at conference presentations, workshops, structured courses and quality assurance audits of practices or groups of professionals in their work environments.

2. ADMINISTRATION

- 2.1. The CPD system will be administered by the Registrar on behalf of the AHPCSA and will be monitored by the CPD Committees.
- 2.2. Any individual practitioner that attends CPD activities in order to comply with the statutory requirements as determined by the AHPCSA shall ensure that he/she is in possession of a certificate of attendance and shall keep such certificates of attendance for a minimum of two years on record after the completion of the relevant cycle to comply with any random compliance check.
- 2.3. **The CPD Committees** shall ensure that the requisite standards are met and maintained by the CPD service providers and shall be responsible for conducting quality checks on the activities of the CPD service providers offering CPD activities from time to time.

2.4.1 The Act provides for the approval of education and training as follows:

Section 16A: Control over training

- (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any law contained, no person or educational institution shall offer or provide any education or training in any allied health profession to which the provisions of this Act apply, unless such education or training has been considered by the relevant professional board and approved by the council after considering a recommendation by the relevant board.
- (2) Any person or institution wishing to offer or to provide the education or training referred to in subsection (1) shall, before offering or providing such education or training, apply to the council in writing for its approval of such education or training and shall furnish such particulars regarding such education or training as the council may require.
- (3) The council may, after consultation with the relevant professional board, grant or refuse any application made in terms of subsection (2) and may, if it has granted such application, prescribe such conditions and requirements as it may deem fit subject to which the education and training in question may be provided.
- (4) The council may appoint a person to attend examinations in respect of any allied health profession regulated by or under this Act which are being conducted by a person or institution whose application has been approved by the council in terms of subsection (3).
- (5) Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of this section, or any condition or requirement prescribed there under, shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both a fine and such imprisonment.

3. INDIVIDUAL CPD ACTIVITY RECORD

3.1. Each practitioner shall be required to maintain an official AHPCSA Individual CPD Activity Record [See Annexure A] from the commencement of the CPD programme which shall include the following particulars:

The full names of the practitioner; the AHPCSA registration number; the registered profession(s); the name of the CPD Service Provider; the Service Provider's CPD Activity number; the topic of the activity; the level of the activity;

the number of CEUs for that activity; and the attendance/completion date.

3.2. This record must be regularly updated and kept current with every learning activity attended or completed so that it accurately reflects the CPD activities of the practitioner.

4. COMPLIANCE VERIFICATION

- 4.1. **Individual practitioners** shall ensure that they are in possession of the standard certificate of attendance for every activity that they have attended. They shall keep these for at least a further two years after completion of the cycle so that their certificates shall be available if required for random compliance verification.
- 4.2. The CPD Committee may conduct compliance verification of individual practitioners at least once a cycle on a randomly selected sample of practitioners.

- 4.3. When an individual practitioner is selected for compliance verification, he/she is obliged to forward the Individual Activity Record for each profession in which he / she is registered as per Annexure A that may have been obtained during the CPD cycle under review to the Registrar within 21 days on receipt of notification. For Level 3 qualifications a certified copy of the qualification is required. The required documents may be submitted in one of the following ways:
 - (a) Paper copies: Send by registered post to The Registrar, AHPCSA, Private Bag X28, Lynnwood Ridge, 0040;
 - (b) By hand delivery to the Registrar, AHPCSA, Castelli Suite, Il Villaggio, 5 De Havilland Crescent South, Persequor Technopark, Pretoria, or
 - (c) Electronic copies: Send to the AHPCSA CPD email address: cpd@ahpcsa.co.za;
- 4.4. **Non-compliance** with any CPD requirement is an act or omission in respect of which council or the relevant professional board may take disciplinary action in terms of Section 29 of the Act and these Guidelines.
- 5. CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS (CEUs)
- **5.1.** The system operates on a basis of trust. CEUs are linked to a hierarchy of learning activities based on whether the outcome is measurable or not, or is a structured learning programme.
- **5.2.** CPD will run over a two (2) year cycle with all practitioners required to accumulate forty (40) <u>CEUs per cycle</u>, fifty percent (50%) of which shall be profession-specific.
- 5.3. A practitioner, who registers for the first time shall commence with his / her CPD programme immediately. CEUs will be calculated on a pro-rata basis for persons registering after the cycle has commenced, for the remainder of the cycle.
- **5.4.** A practitioner who accumulates more than the required total of CEUs in a cycle will be permitted to carry over a maximum of ten (10) CEUs to the next cycle.
- 5.5. A practitioner shall be required to obtain a minimum of four (4) CEUs in AHPCSA-specific **Bioethics** and Jurisprudence per CPD alternatively, attendance at any two-hour CPD activity presented by the AHPCSA Registrar on bioethics and jurisprudence shall qualify under this category. An AHPCSA-approved bioethics and jurisprudence course is available at www.aromasa.org.za. A minimum of 70% pass rate is required for this MCQ course to qualify for four (4) CEUs. Ethics CEUS granted by any other statutory health council for mere attendance as part of any other CPD activity are not recognised by the AHPCSA for Level 2.B.1: **BIOETHICS AND JURISPRUDENCE WORKSHOPS.**

- 5.6. A practitioner is obliged, as a requirement for ongoing registration, to be in possession of a first-aid Level I, Emergency First Aid or Basic Life Support (BLS) certificate (the former two certificates to have been issued by a Department of Labour-accredited provider of first-aid; the latter to have been issued by an institution accredited by the American Heart Association (AHA)) for which only four (4) CEUs may be acquired, regardless of any higher number of CEUS granted by any provider of such education and training. Any diagnostic practitioner may choose to complete first-aid Level II or III, for which only six (6) or eight (8) CEUS may be acquired, regardless of any higher number of CEUs granted by any provider of such education and training.
- 5.7. Cross Recognition of CEUs. If a CPD activity has been approved for a specific profession by a specific CPD Committee or approved by another South African statutory health council, all AHPCSA practitioners may attend that activity for CPD purposes if it is relevant to their specific Scope of Practice. Practitioners will, therefore, not need to apply for the activity to be reaccredited by their own CPD Committee or by the Registrar in order to claim the CEUs accrued for attending that activity. Only in the event that a practitioner is uncertain as to whether such activity falls into the relevant scope of practice, he/she is required to present information regarding that activity, prior to it taking place, for confirmation that it falls within the scope of practice of that practitioner, which confirmation will be given by the Registrar. In addition to the relevant CPD certificate issued by the Service Provider, the practitioner is required to present the following information: name of the South African statutory health council approving the CPD activity; the South African statutory health council CPD registration reference; and nature and duration of the CPD activity. CEU allocation will be as per the AHPCSA Guidelines. Note: specific to any allied health profession may NOT be approved by any other South African statutory health council, or any other body delegated by another South African statutory health council. You are required to take care to ascertain that courses specific to allied health professions have been approved by the AHPCSA.
- 5.8. Practitioners who are registered in more than one Allied Health profession will be required to obtain thirty (30) CEU's per profession, fifty percent (50%) of which shall be profession-specific, with the minimum of four (4) CEUs for the AHPCSA-approved Bioethics and Jurisprudence course and be in possession of either a BLS, Level I, II or III first-aid certificate per CPD cycle.
- **5.9.** Splitting of CEUs will not be allowed for practitioners registered for more than one profession who attend a CPD activity which is relevant to more than one of the registered professions. When attending a CPD activity which is relevant to more than one of the registered modalities, a practitioner must make a choice as to which modality the CEUs should accrue.

6. HIERARCHY OF LEARNING ACTIVITIES

Learning activity/ies, **as per Annexure B** for all allied health professions, means activities by the AHPCSA for CPD purposes, comprising three levels:

6.1. Level 1 - those encompassing non-measurable outcomes.

These are activities that **do not have a clearly measurable outcome or no formal evaluation** process after the activity. These activities include, but are not limited to:

Small groups

- (a) Formally organised meetings by the professional societies;
- (b) Structured small group discussions, with a minimum of three (3) practitioners*;
- (c) Case study discussions, with a minimum of three (3) practitioners*;
- (d) Formally organised special purpose lectures that are not part of a business meeting; and
- (e) Interest groups meeting less than six times per year.*Such discussions may be conducted using the electronic Skype modus, but shall be limited to a maximum of six (6) practitioners.

Large groups

- (a) Conferences;
- (b) Congresses;
- (c) Symposia;
- (d) Web-based seminars; and
- (e) International conferences.

Other

- (a) Membership of an association / society;
- (b) Serving on professional bodies; and
- (c) Community Service.
- 6.1.1. For informal meetings, each service provider will be required to keep a record of attendance with the following information:
 - (a) The names of fellow attendees;
 - (b) A short summary of the subject matter of the activity;
 - (c) The number of CEUs for that activity; and
 - (d) The attendance date.

For formal events, the facilitator will be required to issue an attendance certificate to each attendee with the following information:

- (a) The name of the organisation;
- (b) The topic of the activity;
- (c) The number of CEUs for that activity;
- (d) The attendance date;
- (e) The full name and AHPCSA registration number of the attendee; and
- (f) Signature of the organisation's representative.

6.1.2. Should practitioners wish to attend a professional or academic meeting or activity abroad, such meeting or activity may be recognised for CPD purposes and application shall be made by the service provider in the designated manner for approval by the CPD Committee or approval must be sought by the practitioner from the CPD Committee thirty (30) days in advance of the activity; and in the event that such professional or academic meeting or activity abroad is approved for CPD purposes by any accreditation body abroad, documentary evidence of such accreditation shall form part of the practitioner application.

6.2. Level 2 - those encompassing measurable outcomes.

These are activities such as Courses, Workshops, Education and Training, Research and Publications.

- 6.2.1. These activities include those that have a **clearly measurable outcome** or formal evaluation process **after the activity**.
- 6.2.2. Presenters/Co-presenters may only claim once for CEUs if the same presentation is given more than once.
- 6.2.3. For practitioners involved in educational institutions, no more than 50% of the points may be related to employment-specific requirements.

6.3. Level 3 - those associated with formally structured learning programmes

This is structured learning, namely a formal programme presented by an ETQA accredited, National Department of Higher Education registered and AHPCSA approved training institution, with a measurable outcome. Any other formally structured learning programme, such as may be offered by any foreign institution of higher education and training, may be considered by the CPD Committee and application for consideration may be made in the designated manner; the AHPCSA reserves the right to request the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) to provide an evaluation as to whether the foreign institution of higher education and training is lawful in the country of origin and, if not, to decline such application.

6.4. Other

Any matter not covered by any of the above may be considered by the CPD Committee and application for consideration may be made in the designated manner.

7. ACTIVITIES THAT DO NOT QUALIFY FOR CEUS

- 7.1. The following activities shall not qualify for CEUs:
 - (a) Time spent in planning, organising or facilitating any activity;
 - (b) Non-referenced letters to the editor of accredited journals;
 - (c) Written assignments;
 - (d) Compilation of student training manuals for internal use;

- (e) Staff and/or administrative meetings;
- (f) Tours and/or viewing of exhibits and technological demonstrations; and
- (g) Meetings arranged by pharmaceutical companies and manufacturers or importers of products and technical devices (including assistive device technology) or their representatives purely for the purpose of marketing and/or promoting their products, shall not be eligible for CPD; and
- (h) Courses / activities for personal advancement.

8. NON-COMPLIANCE

- 8.1. The CPD Committee will on receipt of a non-compliant audit request the Registrar to send to the non-compliant practitioner a letter requesting reasons for the non-compliance.
- 8.1.1. The non-compliant practitioner shall be afforded ten (10) days from the date of the letter to submit reasons and/or an explanation why he/she is not compliant.
- 8.1.2. In the event the non-compliant practitioner fails and/or refuses to submit reasons and/or an explanation for his/her non-compliance, such conduct will be regarded as unprofessional.
- 8.2. The CPD Committee may (in its sole discretion) afford the non-compliant practitioner a six months' extension in which he/she may attempt to achieve compliance, subject to the non-compliant practitioner submitting a motivated and well-reasoned request, within the 10 (ten) days time limit to reply as set out above, for an extension / opportunity to comply.
- 8.3. After the lapse of the 10 (ten) days period as set out above or after the period of six months, and the practitioner is still non-compliant, the name of the non-compliant practitioner will be submitted to the Inquiry Body, which might take any of the following actions:
 - a) An examination as determined; and/or
 - b) Suspension from the register for period of time until submission of proof of compliance with the CPD requirements; and/or
 - c) Registration in a category that will provide for supervision as considered appropriate; and/or
 - d) A remedial programme of continuing education and training as specified; and/or
 - e) A fine; and/or
 - f) Any other action as recommended to the AHPCSA Council by any Inquiring Body after the procedure has been followed as stipulated.

9. DEFERMENT

9.1. A practitioner may apply for deferment of the requirements of the CPD programme and the CPD Committee will review such applications individually on an ad hoc basis. The application shall be accompanied by a substantive

motivation from the practitioner with appropriate documentary evidence <u>and</u> <u>application for deferment shall be made on an annual basis.</u>

- 9.2. Deferment may be granted to a practitioner under the following circumstances:
 - (a) a practitioner, who is outside South Africa for a period of time exceeding twelve (12) months and is not practising his/her profession;
 - (b) a practitioner, who is outside South Africa and practising in a country where formal continuing professional development does not take place, provided that the relevant professional board may resolve that such practitioner is required to complete CPD online courses approved by the AHPCSA; or
 - (c) a practitioner who is registered for an additional qualification, but is of the view that he/she will not meet the outcome within two years and thus will not be able to claim CEUs.
- 9.3. Deferment may be granted for a period of one (1) year, but may be extended on application on an annual basis.
- 9.4. Any practitioner mentioned in the above paragraphs wishing to re-enter the system after deferment will be subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) If deferment was granted for more than twelve (12) months but less than two years, proof of full employment in the profession during that time shall be submitted and the practitioner shall, on review by the CPD Committee, be allowed to recommence the CPD year immediately;
 - (b) If deferment was granted for more than two (2) years, but less than three (3) years, the practitioner shall submit proof of his/her employment during that time and the practitioner shall, on the recommendation of the CPD Committee, be required to complete a period of supervised practice/competence assessment as determined by the CPD Committee in his/her area of practice, and will recommence the CPD year immediately;
 - (c) If deferment was granted for longer than twelve (12) months and the practitioner did not practice his/her profession during the deferment period, he/she will be required to complete a period of supervised practice/competence assessment as determined by the CPD Committee in his/her area of practice; or
 - (d) If deferment was granted because the practitioner was engaged in formal education and training for an additional qualification, CEUs will not be allocated for obtaining the said additional qualification. Proof of the additional qualification shall be supplied to the CPD Committee and the practitioner will recommence the CPD year immediately.

10. PRACTITIONERS ABROAD

- 10.1. AHPCSA-registered practitioners who are practising abroad in countries where a CPD system is in place shall comply with the requirements in that country.
- 10.2. AHPCSA-registered practitioners who are practising abroad in countries where no CPD system is in place may be required to complete CPD online courses

- approved by the AHPCSA, as may be decided by the relevant professional board.
- 10.3. Such practitioners shall retain documentary proof of attendance of CPD activities for submission in the event of being drawn in the compliance verification.

11. REGISTRATION OF HOLDERS OF FOREIGN QUALIFICATIONS OR PERSONS APPLYING FOR RESTORATION TO ANY REGISTER AFTER PRACTISING ABROAD

In the event that any person who has been practising an allied health profession abroad applies for registration or restoration to any register and meets all requirements for registration or restoration to any register, shall, in addition, submit documentary proof of CPD compliance as may be required in that country. This may be in the form of a letter from the accrediting authority in the country concerned.

12. COMPLAINTS

Problems encountered, or complaints regarding the handling of CPD activities, quality of the lectures, attendance control, issuing of certificates, commercial aims, etc., should be submitted to the offices of the AHPCSA Registrar either electronically to cpd@ahpcsa.co.za or in hard copy **hand delivered to** Castelli, Suite, II Villaggio, 5 de Havilland Crescent South, Persequor Technopark, Pretoria, **or posted** to Private Bag X28, Lynnwood Ridge, 0040, for referral to the CPD Committee for consideration.

1.2 Definitions

Student

Means a person registered as such in terms of section 18(2) of the Act, namely any person registered either at the Durban University of Technology or the University of Johannesburg for the purpose of completing the Magister Technologiae (Homeopathy) qualification at one of these institutions.

Student Intern

Means any person registered as such in terms of section 19(3) of the Act, namely any individual who has completed all academic requirements (viz. 5th year or masters level examinations), excluding the dissertation in partial fulfilment of the qualification and who has yet to be awarded the M Tech (Homeopathy) degree by Durban University of Technology or University of Johannesburg, but who is still required to fulfil the requirements of the Internship Programme.

Intern

Means any person registered as such in terms of section 19(1) of the Act, namely an individual who has completed all requirements (viz. 5th year or masters level examinations), including the dissertation in partial fulfilment of the qualification and who has been awarded the M Tech (Homeopathy) degree by Durban University of Technology or University of Johannesburg, but who is still required to fulfil the requirements of the Internship Programme.

Student-Intern and Intern: Supervision

A Student-Intern and Intern require direct supervision at all times during Student-patient interaction, such direct supervision to be carried out by a

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qualified and registered Homeopathy practitioner, who is present at all times during any Student-Intern or Intern and patient interaction.

Interns: Malpractice Insurance

An Intern is required to carry own malpractice insurance, such as that which is available through the Homeopathy Association of South Africa (HSA), or any other malpractice insurance provider.

2. INTERNSHIP COMMITTEE AND FACILITATION OF INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

2.1 Internship Committee

The control of the Internship Programme resorts under the AHPCSA Professional Board for Homeopathy, Naturopathy and Phytotherapy (PBHNP) by way of an Internship Committee, which consists of at least eight members, who hold the following positions:

- The PBHNP Chairperson;
- One member from the PBHNP who is a Homeopath, who will act as the National Internship Co-Ordinator;
- One registered Homeopath from both the KwaZulu-Natal and Gauteng regions, who will act as Regional Co-Ordinators, appointed by the PBHNP to serve on the Internship Committee annually;
- Additional Regional Committee members as appointed by the PBHNP;
- The AHPCSA Registrar ex officio; and
- A senior Homeopathy Student representative from the DUT and the UJ, elected by the Student body of the DUT and the UJ, their details to be forwarded to the AHPCSA Registrar by February of each year by the respective Head of Department (Homeopathy).

2.2 Facilitation of Internship Programme

2.2.1 AHPCSA

The AHPCSA monitors the Internship Programme via the National Internship Co-Ordinator who liaises with the Regional Co-Ordinators.

2.2.2 The DUT and the UJ

The Programme itself is facilitated by the DUT and UJ. The PBHNP recognises the significant involvement of these institutions and the persons involved with establishing the current Internship Programme.

3. INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

3.1 Aim of the Internship Programme

To expose the Homeopathy Intern to the understanding of Homeopathy as a profession that functions not only as a primary health care entity, but also within a greater health care paradigm to ensure that the best interests of the patient are met and maintained and that the health of the public enjoys due and proper protection, as mandated by the legal requirements of the Allied Health Professions Act, Act 63 of 1982.

The Outcomes of the Internship Programme are to transition the Student through an Internship phase to becoming a competent practitioner with the aim of refining the skills of the Student-Intern / Intern in terms of the following outcomes:

- Practice direct contact (primary) health care as an entry portal provider for all patients (of all ages and gender).
- ❖ Promote the concept of wellness (in congruence with the primary health care principles) by assessing health risks in the community and attempting to reduce such by providing appropriate general and public health information and lifestyle counselling (as appropriate to the patient and the community).
- Refine the assessment of a patient's general health status, complaints and problems, by means of a detailed and pertinent case history, physical examination and special tests (diagnostic imaging, laboratory procedures, or further specialized testing) culminating in a diagnosis with treatment and / or referral as the case warrants.
- ❖ Further develop a goal-orientated patient management plan that addresses the treatment, rehabilitation and education of the patient.
- Continue to develop and maintain the appropriate health practitioner-patient relationship in terms of the code of conduct and ethical constraints as imposed by legislation governing the profession in South Africa.
- ❖ Deepen the ability to become self-directed learners so as to maintain an upto-date working knowledge in terms of current findings in the field of Homeopathy and utilising the available continuing education opportunities as they present.

3.2 Registration for Internship Programme

Any AHPCSA-registered student of Homeopathy may enter the Internship Programme, firstly as:

❖ <u>a student-Intern</u> when he or she has completed all academic requirements for the M Tech (Homeopathy) qualification, but has yet to complete the research dissertation; and subsequently as an Intern when he or she has met all academic requirements, including the research dissertation and qualifies for graduation, and is no longer a registered university Student.

<u>Transition from Student-Intern to Intern status</u> is required by way of application to the AHPCSA for the registration status in the Student-Internship register to be changed to that of registration in the Internship register. The necessary form is available on the AHPCSA website — <u>www.ahpcsa.co.za</u> for either category of registration. The fully completed form needs to be returned to the AHPCSA, along with proof of payment, to allow for registration. Student-Intern registration numbers, or Intern registration numbers, together with the relevant certificates, as the case may be, will be issued by AHPCSA.

When the Student Intern graduates from his or her respective institution and he or she registers as an Intern, he or she is required to obtain malpractice insurance, such as is available through the HSA or any other malpractice insurance provider.

3.3 Code of Conduct

Student-Interns and Interns shall at all times be adherent to the following:

- ❖ The Rules of the Durban University of Technology / University of Johannesburg – General Handbook (as applicable).
- ❖ The Rules of the Durban University of Technology / University of Johannesburg – Homeopathy Department Handbook (as applicable).
- ❖ The Rules of the Durban University of Technology / University of Johannesburg – Clinic Manual Handbook (as applicable).
- ❖ Applicable provisions of the Allied Health Professions Act ("the Act"), Act 63 of 1982, and Regulations thereto, including, but not limited to, Chapters 3 and 4 of the Act, and Chapter 8 of Regulations No R 2610 of 3 December 1982 available for viewing at www.ahpcsa.co.za > Legislation.
- ❖ The CODE OF ETHICS IN TERMS OF SECTION 54(9) OF REGULATIONS NO R 127 OF 12 FEBRUARY 2001 TO THE ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT, ACT 63 OF 1982, AS AMENDED, INCLUDING GUIDELINES FOR GOOD PRACTICE AND GUIDELINES FOR MAKING PROFESSIONAL SERVICES KNOWN, available for viewing at www.ahpcsa.co.za > Legislation.

Any Student-Intern or Intern in breach of any of these legislative precepts may result in disciplinary action by either the Durban University of Technology/University of Johannesburg or the AHPCSA, or both.

3.4 Examination / Assessment of Internship Portfolio

The final assessment will be by means of the submission of a portfolio in hard copy and email copy to the Regional Internship Committee. **The category of**

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AHPCSA registration at this stage will be that of Intern. This portfolio shall be based on involvement of the Student-Intern or Intern in the Internship Programme throughout the period of Internship, as set out below.

The assessment of the portfolio will be carried out by the relevant Internship Committee and will take a maximum of 2 weeks from date of submission.

Assessment criteria:

- ❖ The work experience hours accepted need to be within two (2) years preceding portfolio submission.
- All portfolios must break down attendance into HOURS.
- Conferences and lectures attended: state subjects covered, contact details of organizers or lecturers.
- Numbers of patients seen must be broken down into separate categories: M Tech: Homeopathy research patient requirements met (if applicable) and Internship Programme numbers.
- ❖ The balance of the various aspects of the portfolio there needs to be an entry in each block of the evaluation format.
- ❖ The reflections of the Intern on the work accomplished and how that accomplishment has brought them further in their development as practitioners letter of the pros and cons of the process.
- The authenticity of the portfolio, in terms of the work being that of the Intern, may be verified by Committee members making spot checks by calling any references mentioned in the portfolio.

In addition to the portfolio assessment, the Intern will be required to undergo an interview will the Regional Internship Committee member(s) which will be organised by the Intern at the availability of the Committee member(s).

3.5 Reciprocity

Interns are able to complete the Internship in either or both regions; however, they can only apply for the submission of the portfolio in ONE region.

3.6 Work Completed

Should any student-intern or intern wish to consider attending and/or completing a particular course, or a post-graduate Homeopathy course and is unsure as to whether this counts towards the portfolio or not, he/she will need to submit the relevant details (electronically) to the relevant Regional Committee in order for members to review the submission for approval purposes.

3.7 Rules Binding

- ❖ The following certified documentation is required to be submitted, after the completion of the Internship interviews, to either the KwaZulu-Natal or Gauteng Regional Internship Committee:
 - ✓ Portfolio
 - ✓ Supporting documents
 - ✓ Copy of both Student-Intern and Intern registration certificates

- ❖ The minimum number of hours required per category is:
 - Academic 75 hours (All courses can be done face to face, or by way of online or webinars, provided the online courses provide certificates to show participation has been completed to the relevant levels).

 - Professional stationery
 - Medical aid administration
 - Contract administration for general medical practice

RECOMMENDED CONSULTATION FEES

The South African Council for Natural Scientific Professions herewith retract Board Notice 15 of 2017 as published on 13 March 2017 in Government Gazette No. 40660.

The South African Council for Natural Scientific Professions has under article 35 (1) of the Natural Scientific Professions Act, 2003 (Act 27 of 2003), determined the amended tariff of recommended fees in this Schedule, which has been approved.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

- In this Schedule the definitions are as follows:
 - "Category A", in respect of a private consulting practice in natural sciences, shall mean a top practitioner whose expertise is nationally or internationally recognised and who provides advice at a level of specialisation where such advice is recognised as that of an expert;
 - "Category B", in respect of a private consulting practice in natural sciences, shall mean a partner, a sole proprietor, a director, or a member who, jointly or severally with his other partners, co-directors or co-members, bears the risk of the business, takes full responsibility for the liabilities of such practice, performs work of a conceptual nature in natural sciences and development, provides strategy guidance in planning and executing a project and/or carries responsibility for quality management pertaining to a project;
 - "Category C", in respect of a private practice in natural sciences, shall mean all salaried professional and technical staff performing work of a natural scientific nature and who carry the direct technical responsibility for one or more specific activities related to a project. A person referred to in Category B may also fall in this category if such person performs work of a natural scientific nature at this level;
 - "Category D", in respect of a private consulting practice in natural sciences, shall mean all other salaried technical staff with adequate expertise and relevant experience performing work of a natural scientific nature with direction and control provided by any person contemplated in Categories A or B or C.
