HIGH ALERT: SCAM WARNING!!!

TO ALL SUPPLIERS AND SERVICE PROVIDERS OF THE GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS

It has come to the attention of the *GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS* that there are certain unscrupulous companies and individuals who are defrauding unsuspecting businesses disguised as representatives of the *Government Printing Works (GPW)*.

The scam involves the fraudsters using the letterhead of *GPW* to send out fake tender bids to companies and requests to supply equipment and goods.

Although the contact person's name on the letter may be of an existing official, the contact details on the letter are not the same as the *Government Printing Works*. When searching on the Internet for the address of the company that has sent the fake tender document, the address does not exist.

The banking details are in a private name and not company name. Government will never ask you to deposit any funds for any business transaction. *GPW* has alerted the relevant law enforcement authorities to investigate this scam to protect legitimate businesses as well as the name of the organisation.

Example of e-mails these fraudsters are using:

PROCUREMENT@GPW-GOV.ORG

Should you suspect that you are a victim of a scam, you must urgently contact the police and inform the *GPW*.

GPW has an official email with the domain as @gpw.gov.za

Government e-mails DO NOT have org in their e-mail addresses. All of these fraudsters also use the same or very similar telephone numbers. Although such number with an area code 012 looks like a landline, it is not fixed to any property.

GPW will never send you an e-mail asking you to supply equipment and goods without a purchase/order number. *GPW* does not procure goods for another level of Government. The organisation will not be liable for actions that result in companies or individuals being resultant victims of such a scam.

Government Printing Works gives businesses the opportunity to supply goods and services through RFQ / Tendering process. In order to be eligible to bid to provide goods and services, suppliers must be registered on the National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD). To be registered, they must meet all current legislative requirements (e.g. have a valid tax clearance certificate and be in good standing with the South African Revenue Services - SARS).

The tender process is managed through the Supply Chain Management (SCM) system of the department. SCM is highly regulated to minimise the risk of fraud, and to meet objectives which include value for money, open and effective competition, equitability, accountability, fair dealing, transparency and an ethical approach. Relevant legislation, regulations, policies, guidelines and instructions can be found on the tender's website.

Fake Tenders

National Treasury's CSD has launched the Government Order Scam campaign to combat fraudulent requests for quotes (RFQs). Such fraudulent requests have resulted in innocent companies losing money. We work hard at preventing and fighting fraud, but criminal activity is always a risk.

How tender scams work

There are many types of tender scams. Here are some of the more frequent scenarios:

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to a company to invite it to urgently supply goods. Shortly after the company has submitted its quote, it receives notification that it has won the tender. The company delivers the goods to someone who poses as an official or at a fake site. The Department has no idea of this transaction made in its name. The company is then never paid and suffers a loss.

OR

Fraudsters use what appears to be government department stationery with fictitious logos and contact details to send a fake RFQ to Company A to invite it to urgently supply goods. Typically, the tender specification is so unique that only Company B (a fictitious company created by the fraudster) can supply the goods in question.

Shortly after Company A has submitted its quote it receives notification that it has won the tender. Company A orders the goods and pays a deposit to the fictitious Company B. Once Company B receives the money, it disappears. Company A's money is stolen in the process.

Protect yourself from being scammed

- If you are registered on the supplier databases and you receive a request to tender or quote that seems to be from a government department, contact the department to confirm that the request is legitimate. Do not use the contact details on the tender document as these might be fraudulent.
- Compare tender details with those that appear in the Tender Bulletin, available online at www.gpwonline.co.za
- Make sure you familiarise yourself with how government procures goods and services. Visit the tender website for more information on how to tender.
- If you are uncomfortable about the request received, consider visiting the government department and/or the place of delivery and/or the service provider from whom you will be sourcing the goods.
- In the unlikely event that you are asked for a deposit to make a bid, contact the SCM unit of the department in question to ask whether this is in fact correct.

The **Government Printing Works (GPW)** has established rules for submitting notices in line with its electronic notice processing system, which requires the use of electronic *Adobe Forms*. Please ensure that you adhere to these guidelines when completing and submitting your notice submission.

CLOSING TIMES FOR ACCEPTANCE OF NOTICES

1. The *Government Gazette* and *Government Tender Bulletin* are weekly publications that are published on Fridays and the closing time for the acceptance of notices is strictly applied according to the scheduled time for each gazette.

EXTRAORDINARY GAZETTES

3. *Extraordinary Gazettes* can have only one publication date. If multiple publications of an *Extraordinary Gazette* are required, a separate Z95/Z95Prov *Adobe* Forms for each publication date must be submitted.

NOTICE SUBMISSION PROCESS

4. Download the latest *Adobe* form, for the relevant notice to be placed, from the **Government Printing Works** website www.gpwonline.co.za.
5. The *Adobe* form needs to be completed electronically using *Adobe Acrobat / Acrobat Reader*. Only electronically completed *Adobe* forms will be accepted. No printed, handwritten and/or scanned *Adobe* forms will be accepted.
6. The completed electronic *Adobe* form has to be submitted via email to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za. The form needs to be submitted in its original electronic *Adobe* format to enable the system to extract the completed information from the form for placement in the publication.
7. Every notice submitted **must** be accompanied by an official **GPW** quotation. This must be obtained from the *eGazette* Contact Centre.
8. Each notice submission should be sent as a single email. The email **must** contain **all documentation relating to a particular notice submission**.
 - 8.1. Each of the following documents must be attached to the email as a separate attachment:
 - 8.1.1. An electronically completed *Adobe* form, specific to the type of notice that is to be placed.
 - 8.1.1.1. For National *Government Gazette* or *Provincial Gazette* notices, the notices must be accompanied by an electronic Z95 or Z95Prov *Adobe* form
 - 8.1.1.2. The notice content (body copy) **MUST** be a separate attachment.
 - 8.1.2. A copy of the official **Government Printing Works** quotation you received for your notice. (*Please see Quotation section below for further details*)
 - 8.1.3. A valid and legible Proof of Payment / Purchase Order: **Government Printing Works** account customer must include a copy of their Purchase Order. **Non-Government Printing Works** account customer needs to submit the proof of payment for the notice
 - 8.1.4. Where separate notice content is applicable (Z95, Z95 Prov and TForm 3, it should **also** be attached as a separate attachment. (*Please see the Copy Section below, for the specifications*).
 - 8.1.5. Any additional notice information if applicable.

GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS - BUSINESS RULES

9. The electronic *Adobe* form will be taken as the primary source for the notice information to be published. Instructions that are on the email body or covering letter that contradicts the notice form content will not be considered. The information submitted on the electronic *Adobe* form will be published as-is.
10. To avoid duplicated publication of the same notice and double billing, Please submit your notice **ONLY ONCE**.
11. Notices brought to **GPW** by “walk-in” customers on electronic media can only be submitted in *Adobe* electronic form format. All “walk-in” customers with notices that are not on electronic *Adobe* forms will be routed to the Contact Centre where they will be assisted to complete the forms in the required format.
12. Should a customer submit a bulk submission of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of any organisation e.g. newspaper publisher, the messenger will be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.

QUOTATIONS

13. Quotations are valid until the next tariff change.
 - 13.1. **Take note:** **GPW**'s annual tariff increase takes place on **1 April** therefore any quotations issued, accepted and submitted for publication up to **31 March** will keep the old tariff. For notices to be published from 1 April, a quotation must be obtained from **GPW** with the new tariffs. Where a tariff increase is implemented during the year, **GPW** endeavours to provide customers with 30 days' notice of such changes.
14. Each quotation has a unique number.
15. Form Content notices must be emailed to the *eGazette* Contact Centre for a quotation.
 - 15.1. The *Adobe* form supplied is uploaded by the Contact Centre Agent and the system automatically calculates the cost of your notice based on the layout/format of the content supplied.
 - 15.2. It is critical that these *Adobe* Forms are completed correctly and adhere to the guidelines as stipulated by **GPW**.
16. **APPLICABLE ONLY TO GPW ACCOUNT HOLDERS:**
 - 16.1. **GPW** Account Customers must provide a valid **GPW** account number to obtain a quotation.
 - 16.2. Accounts for **GPW** account customers **must** be active with sufficient credit to transact with **GPW** to submit notices.

20. Where the copy is part of a separate attachment document for Z95, Z95Prov and TForm03
- 20.1. Copy of notices must be supplied in a separate document and may not constitute part of any covering letter, purchase order, proof of payment or other attached documents.
- The content document should contain only one notice. (You may include the different translations of the same notice in the same document).
- 20.2. The notice should be set on an A4 page, with margins and fonts set as follows:
- Page size = A4 Portrait with page margins: Top = 40mm, LH/RH = 16mm, Bottom = 40mm;
Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;
- Page size = A4 Landscape with page margins: Top = 16mm, LH/RH = 40mm, Bottom = 16mm;
Use font size: Arial or Helvetica 10pt with 11pt line spacing;

CANCELLATIONS

21. Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by **GPW** according to the deadlines stated in the table above in point 2. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette. Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.
22. Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must be accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES

23. With effect from 01 October 2015, **GPW** will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed according to the deadline and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

REJECTIONS

24. All notices not meeting the submission rules will be rejected to the customer to be corrected and resubmitted. Assistance will be available through the Contact Centre should help be required when completing the forms. (012-748 6200 or email info.egazette@gpw.gov.za). Reasons for rejections include the following:
- 24.1. Incorrectly completed forms and notices submitted in the wrong format, will be rejected.
- 24.2. Any notice submissions not on the correct *Adobe* electronic form, will be rejected.
- 24.3. Any notice submissions not accompanied by the proof of payment / purchase order will be rejected and the notice will not be processed.
- 24.4. Any submissions or re-submissions that miss the submission cut-off times will be rejected to the customer. The Notice needs to be re-submitted with a new publication date.

GOVERNMENT PRINTING WORKS - BUSINESS RULES**APPROVAL OF NOTICES**

25. Any notices other than legal notices are subject to the approval of the Government Printer, who may refuse acceptance or further publication of any notice.
26. No amendments will be accepted in respect to separate notice content that was sent with a Z95 or Z95Prov notice submissions. The copy of notice in layout format (previously known as proof-out) is only provided where requested, for Advertiser to see the notice in final Gazette layout. Should they find that the information submitted was incorrect, they should request for a notice cancellation and resubmit the corrected notice, subject to standard submission deadlines. The cancellation is also subject to the stages in the publishing process, i.e. If cancellation is received when production (printing process) has commenced, then the notice cannot be cancelled.

27. The Government Printer will assume no liability in respect of—

28. Advertisers will be held liable for any compensation and costs arising from any action which may be instituted against the Government Printer in consequence of the publication of any notice.

34. 2. The definition of “**Deaf learner**” is hereby amended by the substitution for the definition of “**Deaf learner**” of the following definition:

“**Deaf learner**” – means a learner who is either in a special school in terms of section 5(6) of the *South African Schools Act, 1996 (Act No. 84 of 1996)*, or in an ordinary school where he or she has been assessed and verified by a registered health professional as Deaf. Such a Deaf learner may, in terms of section 6(4) of the *South African Schools Act, 1996*, offer South African Sign Language, which has the status of an official language for the purposes

of learning [**as a language of learning and teaching in lieu of the second required official language**].”.

Amendment of Regulation 5 of the Regulations

3. Regulation 5 of the Regulations, is hereby amended –

(a) by the substitution in sub-regulation (1) in paragraph (c) for sub-paragraph (iA) of the following sub-paragraph:

- (d) by the substitution in sub-regulation (4B) in paragraph (b) for sub-paragraph (iA) of the following sub-paragraph:

“(4B)(b)(iA) Deaf learners may, subject to regulation 18(5)(a), select South African Sign Language at Home Language level listed in Table B4A **[in lieu of the official language at First Additional Language level as contemplated in sub-regulation (4)(a)]**.”.

BAY WHITE SHARK CAGE DIVING OPERATING AREA – INSHORE AREA NEAR STRANDFONTEIN
BEACH, WESTERN CAPE**

I, Barbara Dallas Creecy, Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment, hereby invite the public to the various public meetings indicated below, and to provide comments on the proposal to temporarily extend the False Bay White Shark Cage Diving (**WSCD**) operating area from its current area around Seal Island to the inshore area adjacent to Strandfontein Beach.

The reason for the proposed extended area is to provide support to the White Shark Cage Diving business sector in False Bay which has seen a significant decline in their business operations resulting from the current disappearance of Great White Shark sightings at Seal Island and the increased presence of other shark species (such as the Bronze Whaler) in inshore areas near Strandfontein Beach. The decrease in WSCD business operations has also negatively affected the tourism sector in Cape Town as tourism businesses which are inherently linked to WSCD tourism activities have also been greatly impacted upon, such as B&Bs, hotels, restaurants and tourism businesses. The proposal is therefore to temporarily mitigate the negative impacts to the tourism sector in Cape Town, by extending the WSCD area of operation closer to the inshore area where other shark species are found, thus allowing the WSCD operators to continue operating by diving with other shark species.

The proposal is to allow WSCD operators to attract sharks in the new extended area using chum and other methods in order to attract other shark species still present in the bay, such as Bronze Whaler Sharks. If Great White Sharks return to the bay in numbers previously recorded during the 2010/2011 seasons, the new area will be closed and the WSCD operators would be required to return to their normal area of operation around Seal Island.



MZIMVUBU-TSITSIKAMMA WATER MANAGEMENT AREA (WMA 7) IN THE EASTERN CAPE PROVINCE: LIMITING THE USE OF WATER IN TERMS OF SECTION 6 OF SCHEDULE 3 OF THE NATIONAL WATER ACT OF 1998; FOR URBAN, AGRICULTURAL, AND INDUSTRIAL (INCLUDING MINING) PURPOSES

I, Dr Sean Philips, in my capacity as Director-General of the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS), on reasonable grounds believe that a water shortage exists in Western areas of the Mzimvubu-Tsitsikamma Water Management Area in the Eastern Cape Province; due to insufficient rains in the 2021/22 rainfall season and below average rainfall predictions for the oncoming months, as well as a high water demand, that it is necessary to limit the taking of water from the Algoa Water Supply System (WSS) and other water schemes and dams listed in this Gazette.

The Minister of Water and Sanitation may, in terms of section 6 (1) of Schedule 3 of the National Water Act of 1998 (Act 36 of 1998) (The Act) limit the use of water in the area concerned if the Minister, on reasonable grounds, believes that a water shortage exists within the area concerned. This power has been delegated to me in terms of Section 63 (1) (b) of the Act.

Therefore, in my capacity as the Director-General of the Department of Water and Sanitation I hereby under delegated authority in terms of section 6 (1) of Schedule 3 read with section 72(1) of the Act, limit the taking and storing of water in terms of section 21(a) and 21(b) by all users in the geographical areas and schemes listed and described below, as follows:

1. The Algoa Water Supply System, its associated primary catchments and its footprint area of supply, as indicated in Table 1:
 - a. Curtailment of overall 40% on all taking of water from surface water resources for domestic and industrial water use from the Algoa WSS and the relevant parts of the primary catchments within which the Algoa WSS occurs.
 - b. Curtailment of 80% on all taking of water from surface water resources for agricultural water use from the Algoa WSS and the relevant parts of the primary catchments within which the Algoa WSS occurs.
 - c. The taking of water from individual sub-systems and dams in the Algoa WSS be limited to the reduced allocations as specified in Table 1.

- e. The DWS Eastern Cape Provincial Head is delegated the power to review the water restrictions, should the Algoa WSS recover adequately, as informed by systems models and amend the water restrictions, before the next relevant decision date.
- f. The Eastern Cape Provincial Head is delegated the power to cease any further releases from any scheme or dam for any purpose other than the basic human needs, once indicated bulk water user have depleted their curtailed annual bulk volumes.

2. Other water schemes / dams and catchments affected by drought, listed in Table 3 below:
 - a. The taking of water from the water schemes/ dams/ catchments listed in Table 3 below for domestic, industrial and irrigation use be restricted by the percentages shown in the corresponding rows,
 - b. The taking of surface or ground water for domestic, industrial and irrigation water use within the catchments above the schemes/ dams listed in Table 3 be restricted at the same percentage level applicable to the scheme / dam in that catchment. (Table 3).

- c. The DWS Eastern Cape Provincial Head is delegated the power to individually review the water restrictions, should the dams/schemes in Table 3 recover adequately as informed by DWS operating rules, and lift or relax the water restrictions should it happen before the next relevant decision date.
3. The curtailments in points (1), and (2) above are measured against the water allocations / water registrations or water demand of the users as per projected annual water use.
 4. The limitation applies to the annual water year commencing 1st June 2022 or from the date of publication of this gazette.

5. All water use sector groups and individuals taking water from any water resource (surface or groundwater) regardless of their authorisation type, in the geographical areas listed and described above in the Mzimvubu to Tsitsikamma Water Management Area, shall install electronic water monitoring or measuring and recording devices to enable monitoring of abstractions, storage and use of water by existing lawful users.
6. All water use sectors groups and individuals taking water from any water resource (surface or groundwater) regardless of their authorisation type, in the geographical areas listed and described above in the Mzimvubu to Tsitsikamma Water Management Area must
 - a. take records of water abstracted on a daily basis;
 - b. establish links with any monitoring or management system designated by the responsible authority;
 - c. submit monthly totals of metered volumes abstracted with effect from 30 days following the date of publication of this notice, in a format specified by the Department and shall continue such recording and reporting data monthly to the Department by the 5th day of each month to *metering.mzitsi@dws.gov.za*

All the affected Water Service Authorities must ensure that all domestic water users, at least, have access to basic water service and that potable water supply to all domestic water users is not completely restricted.

In exercising these powers I have given preference to, the maintenance of the Reserve, treated all water users on a basis that is fair and reasonable, considered the actual extent of the water shortage, the likely effects of the shortage on the water users, the strategic importance of any water use and any water rationing or water use limitations by a Water Services Institution having jurisdiction in the area concerned, under the Water Services Act 108 of 1997.

Placing limitation on the taking of water use as set out in this notice is an administrative action, affecting the rights of the public as contemplated in section 4 of the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act 3 of 2000 (PAJA). After I have taken into consideration all relevant factors, including those referred to in section 4 (4) (b), I have decided that it is reasonable and justifiable in the circumstances to depart from the requirements referred to in section 4 (1)(a) to (e), (2) and (3) and instituted this limitation without allowing the water users affected and other role players to comment on the matter before I institute the limitation.



Ms Emma Powell, MP, acting in accordance with section 73(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, intends to introduce the Prevention of Illegal Eviction from and Unlawful Occupation of Land Amendment Bill, 2022 (“the draft Bill”), in the National Assembly of Parliament. An explanatory summary of the draft Bill is hereby published in accordance with Rule 276(1)(c) of the Rules of the National Assembly.

The issue of orchestrated and illegal land grabs has become a crisis across South Africa, placing immense financial and logistical burdens on all major Metropolitan Municipalities. The announcement of the National State of Disaster, and the concomitant moratorium placed on evictions, also led to a sharp spike in illegal land invasions across South Africa. Furthermore, due to the costs incurred by safeguarding land, municipalities frequently need to provide additional basic services to newly invaded land parcels that have not been provisioned for in statutory budget and planning processes.

The unlawful occupation of land leads to severe dysfunctionality in cities, including obstruction of sewerage infrastructure, safety hazards due to illegal electricity connections, violations to planning and environmental legislation. The shortage of amenities like clinics and schools close to invaded land parcels further places additional pressure on municipalities. Land invasions also deprive law abiding South Africans of their state-subsidised housing opportunities.

Currently, the Prevention of Illegal Eviction from and Unlawful Occupation of Land Act, 1998 (Act No. 19 of 1998) (“PIE Act”) creates a rigid set of definitions and requirements that need to be followed in order for a person to be lawfully evicted, despite their intentions or circumstances during such illegal occupation.

In order for South Africa to create inclusive and well managed cities, the endemic of illegal land invasions must be urgently addressed. Therefore, the application of the PIE Act needs to be restricted in certain instances to prevent those unlawful occupiers, who have entered upon a property in bad faith, from using the PIE Act as a defense or delay tactic at the cost of the owner of the property.

The intention of the draft Bill is thus, *inter alia*, as follows:

- Limit the application of the PIE Act;
- Insert and amend certain definitions to give effect to these limitations;
- Create punitive measures for those who incite or promote orchestrated and unlawful invasions;
- Provide explicit criteria that must be satisfied during court proceedings prior to a municipality being ordered to provide alternative accommodation;
- Allow the courts to determine the length of time alternative accommodation would need to be provided for an unlawful occupier;
- Compel the courts to explore the reasons for the invasion, as well as the maintenance obligations of the occupier's family when considering judgement.

The principles that give rise to this draft Bill have already been confirmed in notable court judgments where the courts specifically disapprove of any illegal land invasion.

This draft Bill does not intend to remove any rights of *bona fide* unlawful occupiers in terms of the PIE Act, nor does it intend to in any way negate a person's right to housing in terms of Section 26 of the Constitution. The purpose of the draft Bill is to prevent those who, in bad faith, occupy a property or land without any legal entitlement to do so and rely on the provisions of the PIE Act to either stay on a property for as long as possible or to try and get fast tracked in the queue for low-cost housing projects.

PARLIAMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA**NOTICE 1268 OF 2022****MR DEAN MACPHERSON, MP****NOTICE OF INTENTION TO INTRODUCE A PRIVATE MEMBER'S BILL AND INVITATION FOR COMMENT ON THE DRAFT BILL, NAMELY THE REMOTE GAMBLING BILL, 2022**

Mr Dean Macpherson, MP, acting in accordance with section 73(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, intends to introduce the Remote Gambling Bill, 2022 ("the draft Bill"), in the National Assembly of Parliament. An explanatory summary of the draft Bill is hereby published in accordance with Rule 276(1)(c) of the Rules of the National Assembly.

The National Gambling Act, 2004 (Act No. 7 of 2004) ("the Gambling Act"), was assented to on 6 August 2004 and came into operation on 1 November 2004. Item 5(5) of the Schedule to the Gambling Act, which sets out all the transitional provisions, provides that the Minister responsible for the administration of the Gambling Act must, within two years after the Gambling Act comes into operation, introduce legislation in Parliament to regulate interactive gambling within the Republic of South Africa.

On 10 July 2008, the National Gambling Amendment Act, 2008 (Act No. 10 of 2008) ("the Gambling Amendment Act"), was assented to. The purpose of the Gambling Amendment Act is to, *inter alia*, provide for the regulation of interactive gambling; provide for the registration of players and opening of player accounts; provide for the conditions applicable to interactive gambling licences; provide for the further protection of minors and other persons vulnerable to the negative effects of gambling; and to ensure that the gambling industry complies with the Financial Intelligence Centre Act, 2001 (Act No. 38 of 2001) ("FICA").

During 2009, the Department of Trade and Industry also published the Interactive Gambling Regulations for public comment.¹ These regulations were also tabled in Parliament and deliberated upon by the Portfolio Committee on Trade and Industry, during which various concerns were raised. However, to date, the Gambling Amendment Act regulating interactive gambling has not been brought into operation and nor have the regulations. Hence interactive gambling is currently not regulated in South Africa.

However, over the past 10 years the South African public has been exposed to and has participated in online and remote gambling. By not regulating this gambling activity, the erosion of the rule of law and criminal activity is being encouraged, while the public is not effectively protected. At the same time, a lack of regulation is resulting in revenue and jobs being lost to other gambling jurisdictions.

The purpose of the draft Bill is to, *inter alia*, provide a legal basis for the regulation, licensing and control of all remote gambling activities; to preserve the integrity of the Republic of South Africa as a responsible global citizen by ensuring an efficient and effective remote gambling regulatory regime; to provide for the relevant provincial gambling boards to control remote gambling activities in their respective provinces and for the National Gambling Board to provide oversight and monitoring functions; to promote the development of a responsible remote gambling industry in the Republic by providing uniform norms and standards; to provide for the application, renewal, suspension, cancellation and transfer processes for different categories of remote gambling licences; to provide for objection procedures relating to the issuing of licenses; to provide for the respective powers, responsibilities and functions of the provincial licensing authorities and the National Gambling Board in respect of remote gambling; to ensure that all remote gambling activities are conducted responsibly, fairly and honestly; to provide for licensing of key persons employed in the remote gambling industry; to provide for standards that remote gambling websites and equipment must comply with; to ensure that all players are treated fairly and that the privacy of a player is respected; to prevent minors and other vulnerable persons from being exposed to the negative effects of gambling; to ensure compliance with FICA and to prevent remote gambling from being a source of, or associated, with crime or disorder, or being used to support crime, disorder or money laundering.

In terms of the Standards Act, 2008 (Act No. 8 of 2008), the Board of the South African Bureau of Standards has acted in regard to standards in the manner set out in the Schedules to this notice.
