PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Whereas it is expedient further to amend in certain respects the provisions of Proclamation No. 1 of 1912 under which jurisdiction may be conferred on Inspectors and Sub-Inspectors of Police in Basutoland (hereinafter referred to as the said Proclamation);

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The Preamble of the said Proclamation shall be and is hereby amended by the addition after the word "Police" of the words "and Clerks of the Public Service".

2. Sections two three and four of the said Proclamation shall be and are hereby amended by the addition after the words "Sub-Inspector of Police" and "Sub-Inspector" wherever they occur of the words "or Clerk of the Public Service".

3. This Proclamation shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
